### Mrs. Annie Valsan (Anniamma Jacob) Retires

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**Mrs. Annie Valsan (Anniamma Jacob)**, Senior Manager, Medical Superintendent's Office superannuated on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2023 after more than three decades of service to the institution.

Annie joined CMC in 1981 for the B.Sc. Nursing course which she completed in 1986. After two years as a Charge Nurse in the surgical wards, she did her Masters in Nursing from 1988 to 1990 and worked as a Junior Lecturer in the College of Nursing till 1992, followed by three years as a Nurse Clinician outside the institution. After completing her M.Phil in Health & Hospital Systems Management, she rejoined the institution in 2001 as Officer (Administration) in the Medical Superintendent's (M.S.) Office. She has done a Fellowship in Health Management from the Deaconess Foundation, USA and has completed the NABH Assessors Course and a PG Diploma in Medical Law and Ethics from the National Law School of India University. She is retiring in her 23<sup>rd</sup> year of hospital administration as Senior Manager, Hospital Operations.

## **Mrs. Annie Valsan Retires**

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The leadership positions Annie has held at CMC include President, Student Nurses Association; Vice President, Student Christian Movement; Secretary, Trained Nurses Association of India, Vellore; Secretary, Balavihar Nursery School; Warden, Allied Health Sciences Hostel for Women; Founding Secretary, Good Samaritan Cafeteria; and Deputy General Superintendent.

From 2001, she has been involved with every innovation in both inpatient and outpatient hospital services from the M.S. Office including implementation of CMC's in-house EMR - the Clinical Workstation, computerized registration of OPD and Pharmacy services, Centralized Bed Management, the Patient Advocacy Cell, After Life Services, CMC's Alpha Clinic and outreach clinics including Shalom Family Medicine Clinic, the Silver Gate new patient facility and the International Relations Office. With the MS Office team, she has organized CMC Hospital Day celebrations from 2002 to 2006, as well as a National Conference on Leadership in Health Care. She has been a thesis guide for Diploma, Fellowship and Master's programs in Health Administration. From 2004 she has formulated the curriculum and trained 14 batches of Medical Assistants, and started the Multi-Functional Technicians (MFT) programme just before her retirement.

From 2020, with M.S. Office and the Hospital Infection Control Committee (HICC), she has organized CMC's COVID-19 pandemic-related activities including implementation of Treatment and Infection Prevention and Control protocols, Fever Clinics and swabbing kiosks, contact tracing and isolation, the COVID desk, the COVID Command Centre and the COVID vaccination programme. Her last project has been implementing operations at CMC's new quaternary care center at Ranipet, where she was responsible for setting protocols for patient flow and triaging, as well as transition of departments from CMC Main Hospital campus.

Annie Valsan is admired for her inspiring leadership and ability to bring out the best in people. She has been a constant supporter to clinicians coming into administration and is a role model to many for her compassion for the poor and disadvantaged and her concern for her colleagues, underpinned by her deep Christian faith. The CMC community thanks Mrs. Annie Valsan for her many years of faithful and sincere services to the institution and wishes her God's abundant blessings as she enters a new phase of her life.

## **CME Update in Geriatrics**

The Departments of Geriatrics and Continuing Medical Education organized a CME Update in Geriatrics on 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. The programme was moderated by Dr. Gopinath, Head of the Department of Geriatrics. Dr. Anju Anna John highlighted the approach to the differential diagnosis and supportive care for dementia. Dr. Benny Paul Wilson discussed delirium and its predisposing and precipitating factors while emphasizing the need to manage 'acute brain injury' as a medical emergency. Dr. Gopinath stressed the need to address osteoporosis, a silent cause of disability and fractures. Dr. Rakesh Mishra explained the patterns of urinary incontinence and the approach to evaluation and management through illustrative case studies. Dr. Joanne Lydia Rajkumar illustrated the problems that can arise from polypharmacy through a series of case studies. Mr. Earnest explained measures to improve home safety through environmental modification, and Mrs. Linda gave clear step-wise guidelines on the use of mobility aids. ## World Kidney Day 2023

The Department of Nephrology celebrated “World Kidney Day” on 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. All over the world this day is celebrated to remind people of kidney health and the importance of working together toward better awareness for kidney health. This year’s theme was “Preparing for the unexpected, supporting the vulnerable”.

The theme this year was chosen in light of the recent pandemic. During COVID-19 pandemic, resources were limited in multiple regions, and health care workers, patients and governments struggled to keep abreast with the rising demand for renal services such as dialysis and care for transplant patients. The idea of this year theme was to get us all thinking about ways in which we as a community could prepare for emergency services if such a situation were to arise again. It needs people to be aware of their own kidney health and take initiative to take care of keeping medication stocks, drinking enough water and leading a healthy lifestyle. From the perspective of hospitals and health care workers we need to be prepared to suddenly increase services should the need arise. Governments also need to be aware for the requirement of health care programs for emergencies and resources such as emergency dialysis machines and peritoneal dialysis supplies for emergencies.

Toward this theme, the Nephrology Department at Ranipet Campus, conducted a slogan and poster competition. The participation was profuse with more than 98 entries for the poster competition and 65 entries for the slogan competition. The winning slogan was “A healthy kidney is wealth”. This was submitted by Ms. Sherin Ann Lal, staff nurse from Emergency Department. Judges for the poster competition were Dr. Athul Thomas, Associate professor Nephrology and Mrs. Ruby Jacob, Professor of Nursing and Head of Super specialty Nursing Unit -III. The winning posters were displayed during the inaugural ceremony conducted at the Ranipet Campus. All posters were beautifully done and conveyed meaningful messages. They were displayed on the notice boards in the Nephrology OPD on 8<sup>th</sup> March to generate awareness toward better kidney health Mrs. Reena Santosh, Head of Department of Nursing for Nephrology was the interface between staff, students and faculty to make this programme a success.

Stalls were opened to promote awareness of kidney health and screen patients for free on 9<sup>th</sup> march . The stalls were opened by the Dr. Aby Abraham from the MS office and Mrs. Jayalinda Christopher from the nursing office, the chaplain Mr. Mynga and Dr. Vinoi George, the Head of Nephrology Department. Patients had their height and weight and BMI calculated and they had their sugars and blood pressure checked free of cost. Urine dipstick to screen for proteinuria and sediments were also done free of cost as part of this activity. Free consultations were also conducted to facilitate kidney health. The Dietary Department taught people about intricacies of the renal diet. Transplant awareness, cognizance of the common public toward peritoneal dialysis, hemodialysis and transplant was also done using mannequins and dialysis machines and an effective renal education staff. More than 140 patients attended this facility and enjoyed its benefits. We also had a home-grown video about kidney awareness put together by the staff, students and consultants of nephrology in multiple languages conveying the message of kidney health to all who participated in this function.

All in all, the nursing staff, students, doctors, patients, support staff, office staff all came together to make this day a memorable one. Thanks to God for his abundant grace.



## MBA (HHSM) Hospital Immersion Programme

The MBA in Hospital and Health Systems Management (HHSM) is a four-semester Work Integrated Learning Programme, conducted in collaboration with Birla Institute of Technology and Science (BITS), Pilani & Christian Medical College (CMC), Vellore. In fulfilment of the MBA (HHSM) course curriculum, a one week of hospital immersion programme component is held in Vellore during the third semester. The Department of Hospital Management Studies and Staff Training and Development (HMSSTD) conducted the hospital immersion programme for the 2021-2023 Batch of MBA (HHSM) participants from 20<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> February 2023 in the Town Campus. The hospital immersion programme was attended by 27 students, who are also medical doctors, from various parts of our country.

The hospital immersion programme was inaugurated prayer by Rev. Dr. Arul Dhas, Head, Chaplaincy. Dr. Samuel N.J. David, Associate General Superintendent and Sr. Manager and Head, HMSSTD welcomed the batch of MBA (HHSM) participants and encouraged the participants to learn as much as possible during the programme so that they could be strategic leaders in the field of healthcare. Dr. Joy Michael, Vice Principal, also welcomed the participants and spoke briefly about the importance of management for clinicians to manage their institutions appropriately. Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, addressed the students on the importance of challenges of leadership and the importance of appropriate management of the hospital for sustainment of functions. Over the course of the programme, classroom sessions were conducted by various CMC staff and extramural faculty on the practical aspects of healthcare management.

Dr. Samuel N.J. David was the speaker for the Leadership component of the programme; during his sessions, various aspects of leadership including styles of leadership were covered along with various interactive exercises and case studies. Dr. Lallu Joseph, Associate General Superintendent and Quality Manager gave a detailed and lively session on the importance of quality in the hospital and the aspects of NABH. Dr. Immanuel Ranjit James, Assoc. Professor, Department Forensic Medicine & Toxicology, gave a detailed exposition on the importance of medico legal aspects of healthcare with due reference to various legal cases. Dr. Vijay Anand Samuel, Mission Network Consultant, CMC gave a detailed exposition on his experience on transforming remote rural communities. Department visits were arranged to selected departments over the course of the programmes for the students to learn the practical aspects of hospital operations; the Ranipet campus was also included among the visits.

In addition, the programme for the first time, featured six guest speakers, three of whom were former professors and heads in CMC. Dr. Mammen Chandy, Former Head, Department Haematology, CMC and Former Director, Tata Memorial Cancer Centre spoke candidly about the challenges of leadership in management of clinical services and programmes. Dr. Jacob T. John, Professor and Former Head, Departments of Clinical Virology and Microbiology, CMC spoke about his personal experiences from the perspective of a clinician and healthcare manager towards fulfilling the expectation of public and community, with emphasis on the challenges in managing and implementing various community programmes. Dr. Vinod Shah, Professor of Paediatric Surgery and Former Head, Distance Education Department and Former CEO, EHA spoke about the importance of strategic healthcare leadership for addressing community needs from national/international perspective. Prof. T.S. Ravikumar, Retd. Professor (Nursing), Department Emergency Medicine, took a very detailed and interactive session on disaster management. Dr. Anbu Suresh, Medical Superintendent, Scudder Memorial Hospital spoke about leadership and management of Scudder Memorial Hospital, Ranipet. Dr. Abel Asirvatham, Senior Healthcare Quality, Operations and Risk Management Professional gave a detailed lecture on implementation of JCI standards in healthcare organizations.

The programme was well appreciated by all the participants through their lively participation and positive feedback.



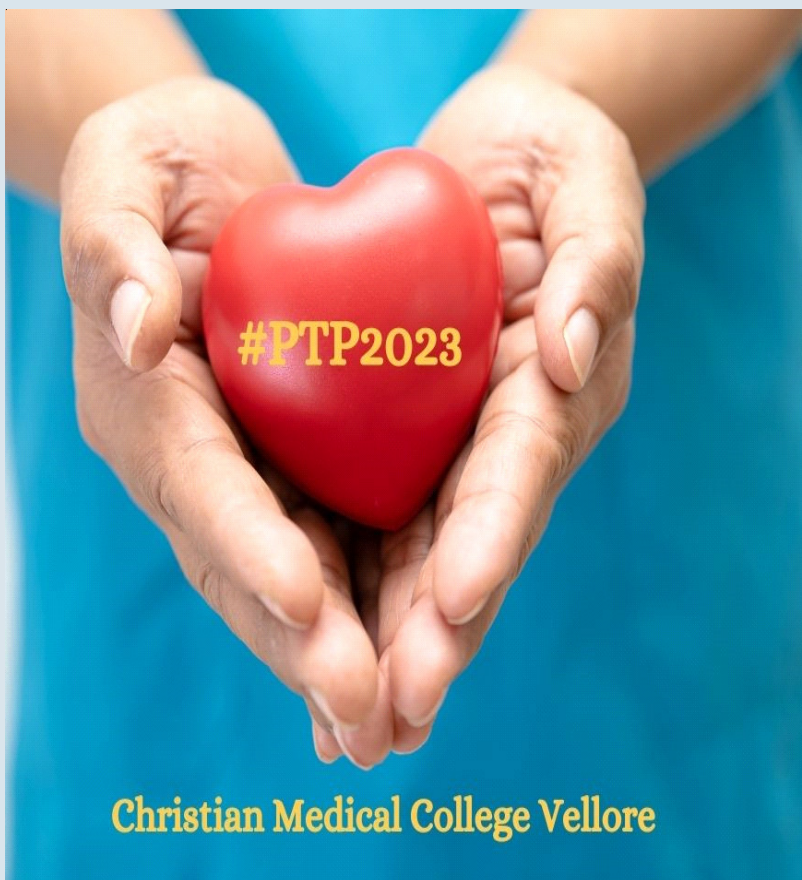

## Obituaries

• **Dr. Elsie Philip (nee Alexander)** (MBBS batch of 1951), a legend in the field of Medicine, passed away on 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2023, at the age of 88. She was born on 1<sup>st</sup> April, 1934. She hailed from the Koipuram family in Chathanoor, Kollam District, Kerala. She spent her childhood in Tamil Nadu, completed her pre-medical education at Queen Mary's College in Madras. She joined the MBBS batch at CMC Vellore in 1951, did Senior House Surgeoncy and also obtained a Diploma in Child Health from CMC, Vellore. She later pursued her MD at King's College in Lucknow.



Dr. Elsie Philip was an astute clinician and revered physician and leader who was known for her unwavering commitment to ethical medical practice. She had a 60-year career in medicine, spending 30 years in government service and 30 years in private hospitals. She held several important positions throughout her long and distinguished career. She served as the Medical Superintendent of the Kottayam District hospital during the establishment of the Kottayam Medical College. She spent 12 years as the Head of Paediatrics at the Kottayam Medical College and was also the founding Director of the Institute of Child Health at Kottayam.

Dr. Philip was instrumental in establishing a Child Development Centre at the Thiruvananthapuram Medical College and was the Head of Paediatrics at SAT Hospital in Thiruvananthapuram. The focus of her research was on the effect of early intervention programmes for high-risk babies. She served as the Principal of the Medical College in Trivandrum from 1986 to 1989, as an able and efficient administrator, ever mindful of the needs of her students. She was the State President of the Indian Academy of Paediatrics and served as the National Organizing Secretary for Paedicon 1985. After her retirement in 1989, she spent several years working as the Chief Paediatrician at the Pattom SUT Hospital and KIMS Hospital in Trivandrum.

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She was also the first state coordinator for the WHO- UNICEF initiative for baby-friendly hospitals (BFHI), which led to Kerala being declared the first baby-friendly state in the world in 1993. Dr. Philip was also a member of the Executive Committee of the World Council of Churches, a committed Christian, who dedicated her life to missions and the church. In addition, she volunteered her services in the palliative care of cancer patients in Regional Cancer Center, Thiruvananthapuram. She also helped develop the Marian Play Home, an Orthodox Church initiative that provides care for mentally challenged children.

Dr. Elsie Philip was remembered as a compassionate teacher, guide, and a charismatic role model who always put the needs of her patients first. Her willingness to serve tirelessly with patience and humility was an inspiration to all who knew her. Her legacy will live on through the many lives she touched throughout her career, and her contributions to the field of paediatrics will continue to inspire future generations of doctors.

Dr. Ramankutty, Emeritus Professor at the SCT Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, who was her student, wrote, “She once told us at the beginning of our training, two things that have stuck with me. ‘If you can tell a sick child from a well child, she told us ‘you have taken the first step towards being a Paediatrician. And if you can tell a very sick child from a sick child, you are well on your way’. And I soon found out that this was not as easy as it sounds. ‘A child is not a small adult; and an infant is not a small child’ was another gem from her. Anybody who has dealt with children should know this, but this knowledge is of special importance to child health professionals. Prof. Philip was perhaps most impressive as an ethical professional. Her integrity was absolutely incorruptible which she tried to pass on to her students and colleagues. And her empathy was abundant: she clearly understood the social situation of the poor patients who approached government hospitals, and went out of her way to help them. She was also very clear that this streak in her personality was the result of her training in CMC, built as it was on a strong belief in God. She never tried to keep this under wraps.”

Dr. Elsie Philip's husband, was the late Philip Koshi, retired Chief Engineer of PWD, Kerala. He hailed from Pandakasalayil family in Kaipattoor, Kerala. Dr. Philip is survived by her four children: Dr. Koshy Philip, Head of Government Dental College, Alappuzha and his wife Dr. Elizabeth, Principal, Mookambika Dental College, Kulasekharam; Dr. Susan Philip, Associate Professor of Ophthalmology, Thiruvananthapuram Medical College and her husband, Mr. George Alexander, Additional Director of Agriculture, Kerala State; Mr. Alex Ajith Philip, Director of Mamre Technologies and his wife, Mrs. Susan Koshy, Kerala State IT Mission; and Mrs. Anne Elizabeth Abraham, Management Consultant and her husband Dr. Aby Abraham, Research Engineer, based in the UK. She was a beloved grandmother to Namitha, Philip, Mercy, Mikha & Isaac. Her sisters are Mrs. Susy Kurien, Chennai, and Dr. Mary Kuriakose, nee Alexander, who is from the MBBS batch of 1959-60.

The loss of Dr. Elsie Philip is not only felt by her family but also by the wider medical community in Kerala and beyond, and the countless patients she served. She truly exemplified her alma mater's motto, “Not to be ministered unto, but to minister.”
