

The events of Jerusalem during the last week of Jesus' earthly life brought pain and disappointment to his followers. # First Vellore Child Development Meeting

The First Vellore Child Development Meeting (Research) was jointly organised by the Developmental Paediatrics Unit under the India Alliance Fellowship and the Wellcome Trust Research Laboratory under the PRERNA (Platform for Research Excellence Related to National Aims) platform on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2023. The meeting was conducted in the New Examination Hall, Bagayam campus and included international and Indian child development community research teams.

The meeting started with prayer and welcome by Dr. Beena Koshy, Professor, Developmental Paediatrics. Dr. Gagandeep Kang, Sr. Professor and Head, Wellcome Trust Research Laboratory addressed the gathering to set the tone for the next two days. Concurrent research was evaluated, and research gaps identified in the domains of Childhood development, Developmental interventions, Childhood growth, Child community-based behaviour studies and Child community-based neuroimaging. Once research priorities were identified per domain, a Delphi process was utilised to prioritise potential future research for the country by all experts. The teams discussed the way forward including utilising existing cohort dataset to address research gaps and future collaborative research.

International faculty from The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, USA, The University of Virginia, USA, University of Bergen, Norway and The University of Melbourne, Australia participated in this meeting. National teams included faculty and researchers from BIRAC (Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council), New Delhi; Society of Applied Studies (SAS) New Delhi; KEM Hospital, Pune; National Brain Research Centre, Delhi; St. John's Research Institute, Bangalore, Sangath, Goa; and Indian Council of Medical Research, Bangalore. Participation from departments of CHAD (Community Health and Development), RUHSA (Rural Unit for Health and Social Affairs), LCECU (Low Cost Effective Care Unit), CAP (Child and Adolescent Psychiatry), PMR (Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation), and Radiology in addition to organising units enriched this research meeting.



# Diploma in Allergy and Asthma - Graduation Ceremony



Allergic disorders, including asthma, affect nearly 15% of India's population. This translates to an approximate figure of nearly 100 to 150 million patients. The prevalence of allergic diseases is increasing at an alarming rate, and there are not enough specialists who can offer standard care for the numerous patients who suffer from allergic disorders. Furthermore, there is a dearth of structured training programmes and few opportunities for the training and certification of allergists. To address this need, the Department of Pulmonary Medicine joined hands with the USA based International Asthma Services. This partnership has resulted in India's only structured training programme, namely the Diploma in Allergy and Asthma (DAA), with the help of trained allergy faculty from the American Centres of Excellence, USA.

DAA is a year-long distance learning course which has been offering services since 2006 to physicians specialized in Medicine, Paediatrics, ENT and Pulmonary Medicine. To date, more than four hundred doctors have received training through this programme. This course attracted doctors from all over India and other countries like Sri Lanka, Nepal, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Indonesia, USA, Canada, UAE, Saudi Arabia and the Caribbean. DAA is endorsed by the 'American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology' (AAAAI), which is the World's largest and the most respected professional association of allergy and asthma specialists and the 'Center for Global Health', University of Colorado, USA.

The 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> DAA graduation ceremony for the 2020 & 2022 graduates was held on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2023 at the New Examination Hall. Dr. Sundeep Salvi, Director Pulmocare Research and Education (PURE) Foundation, Pune. Distinguished Professor of Research, Faculty of Health Sciences, Symbiosis International University was the Chief Guest and awarded the degrees, and the proficiency prizes. He encouraged the graduates to venture beyond their comfort zones if they hope to make any difference to the problem of allergy in India. The Course Directors, Dr. P.K. Vedanthan and Dr. D.J. Christopher exhorted them to adopt CMC's culture of service. A total of Sixty Six specialists have met minimum standards to qualify for the award of DAA this year. **Dr. Jefferson Daniel** was awarded the Dr. Henry Claman gold medal award for overall proficiency for the batch 2020. **Dr. Mahantesh Matti** was placed second and was awarded the Dr. Henry Claman gold medal award for overall proficiency for the batch 2022. **Dr. Rohit K.O.** was placed second and was awarded the Dr. Harold Nelson silver medal for the batch 2022.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> National Congress on Asthma, Allergy and Immunology - Allergocon 2023

The Department of Pulmonary Medicine, conducted the 3<sup>rd</sup> National Congress on Asthma, Allergy and Immunology (Allergocon 2023) between 12<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2023. The workshop had participants who were general physicians, respiratory physicians, paediatricians, ENT surgeons and GPs with interest in the field of allergy. Distinguished faculty from India and overseas (UK, USA) delivered lectures covering the spectrum of allergy disorders. Lectures covered updates in the past year and there was a session on difficult clinical problems. The SHELDON SPECTOR oration was awarded to Prof. Dr. Thirumala Krishna. Around one hundred and fifty specialists participated in the conference. They were allowed to present their original research as free papers and posters and received valuable feedback from experts in the field. The first, second and third prize for oral presentation was won by Dr. Arin Natania, Dr. Neeraj Gupta, Dr. Rajasekar respectively. Dr. Priya N. and Dr. Neeraj Gupta won the prizes for difficult case presentations.





• **Dr. Nupur Opal (***nee* **Tandon)** (MBBS Batch of 1975), left for her heavenly abode on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2023, after bravely battling malignancy for nearly two years. Born on 5<sup>th</sup> August 1957, Dr. Nupur was based in Delhi at the time of her selection for medical training in CMC Vellore. After graduating, she returned to Delhi, where she worked in the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department of St. Stephen's Hospital, as well as in PHCs in Bageshwar and surrounding villages near Almora. Subsequently, as an employee of the Delhi Municipal Corporation, she served the deprived colonies in East Delhi. After her marriage to Major Ajay Opal in 1987, Dr. Nupur moved to different places with him, mostly working in army hospitals as a medical officer. She also found time for a stint in

Nasirabad Mission Hospital. Between 2000-2003 in Devlali, and subsequently, for another four years in Delhi, she worked as the Principal of ASHA Schools for the differently abled under AWWA. After Mr. Ajay's retirement from the army, Dr. Nupur refused the chance to settle in Delhi, Chandigarh or Gurdaspur. Instead, she chose to live in his village (Kahnuwan), travelling every day to Gurdaspur to work in an ECHS clinic for veterans and running a charitable clinic for the villagers in the evening. Throughout her life Dr. Nupur served the poor and disadvantaged, fulfilling the motto of her alma mater. Despite having to change jobs often, she never took time away from medical work. An avid gardener and book lover, Dr. Nupur was also very fond of dogs. She always had dogs to care for, and looked after many, including her favourites Chikki, Gikky, Gypsy, Buddy and Pinky. She also looked after one of her classmates' dog for a whole year while she was away abroad. Adventurous by nature, she did parachute jumping and parasailing.

Dr. Nupur was a kind, noble and gentle soul with great depth and a lovely sense of humour. Diligent and focussed in whatever she did, she was also skilled at gently coaxing her colleagues to finish their tasks. In the last few years her posts in the class group were very much admired for their firm opinions on social justice, without being judgmental. Dr. Nupur did what she wanted, and did everything with a purpose. She was strong and courageous, always believing the best of people. Cheerful and positive, she was a great role model as a wife, mother and friend.

• **Dr. Karna Dev Bardhan** (MBBS Batch of 1958), Dr. Karna Dev (Chandu) Bardhan known as Chandu was born in 1940 in Jhansi. He sadly passed away peacefully at home on the 5<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 after the stroke he had in June 2022.

His father, a pathologist, was in the Army, and he later became the first Dean of the Armed Forces Medical College. To ensure a stable and secure education in view of the frequent transfers to different towns that his father's army postings entailed, he was sent as a boarder to Doon School in Dehradun. After he completed his schooling, he joined the batch of 1958 of students when he started his medical training at the Christian Medical College Vellore. A keen scholar, he won several awards at College including the medal for the Best Outgoing Student. In the year that he graduated he came first in the Madras University.

In 1964, he was awarded a Rhodes Scholarship and left for Oxford, UK where he completed his DPhil, 'Studies on Intrinsic Factor in Man'. After training posts at the Hammersmith Hospital in London and then the Royal Hospital in Sheffield, he took up his substantive consultant post as General Physician / Gastroenterologist in 1973 at the age of 32 years at Rotherham District General Hospital (RDGH), a non-academic centre.

He single-handedly built up the Gastroenterology Department and a research unit which became a centre of excellence both nationally and internationally. He collaborated with the pharmaceutical industry, using the funds to build up his team of lab staff, nurses and secretaries to support the research projects. His personal remuneration from the research projects was ploughed back to fund research Fellows undertaking PhDs, MDs and MScs. As management of the hospital changed, the funds were put into a regulated charity, The Bardhan Research and Education Trust (BRET), and this work was continued. A total of 54 grants was awarded until he retired in 2014. The work of BRET is now continued at Sheffield Teaching Hospitals.

He loved his work, and his infectious enthusiasm motivated and inspired his staff and students. His enquiring mind and breadth of vision, together with his willingness to help, drew people to work with his team in Rotherham. His junior staff were well trained and supported to go forward. He often said that the accomplishments of the BRET-supported people and other young trainees, had given him far greater joy than anything he himself had achieved and that he was immensely proud of them.

His rigour in clinical practice and research, and his compassion and care in the wellbeing of his patients, were paramount. He was much loved and respected by his patients and staff. The training at CMC, with its motto 'Not to be ministered unto, but to Minister', was part of his life.

He was beset by serious cardiovascular problems, including myocardial infarct, stents and bypasses, from the age of 43, but this did not prevent him from wholeheartedly undertaking clinical and research work.

He is the first ever recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award from the British Society of Gastroenterology. He was honoured by the town of Rotherham as Citizen of the Year and was made a Freeman of the Borough. He was awarded the honour of an OBE by The Queen.

He is survived by his wife, Dr. Gouri Bardhan (nee Kumar) (MBBS batch of 1959-60), retired consultant haematologist, his son, Satyajeet, a philanthropy strategist, his daughter, Suchitra, a paediatric gastroenterologist, and his three grandchildren.

Dr. Karna Dev Bardhan has written a book entitled "An Improbable Journey in Medicine: A Story of Courage and Enterprise" which is available in Amazon (available in India, UK, US, Australia and Europe). The family plan to donate all profits to food charities.
