Dr. Samuel N.J. David has served in Christian Medical College for over the past 35 years in a multi-faceted career; he superannuated on 31st May 2023. He joined CMC as Publicity and Information Officer, Public Relations Department in December 1987. Subsequently, he was posted as Asst. General Superintendent in The 2nd Paediatric Renal Transplant Stores in November 1991. He was then relocated to the Outpatient Department in March 1994. Thereafter, he was elevated to Personnel Department in April 1996 and was given charge of the Personnel Department as Senior Personnel Manager in November 2005. During this period, he was involved in significant system improvements in each area towards optimization of work processes and deliverables. Some of these include the initiation of the ARISE (Alcoholics Rehabilitation Initiative and Support for Employees) clinic for alcoholism de-addiction management and GRievances Elimination ATtempts (GREAT) programme for redressal of workplace issues.

> He was subsequently appointed as Head of the Department of Hospital Management Studies, Staff Training and Development, which was created towards organizational development and NABH requirements. He oversaw the development of various pan institutional training programmes such as the Mandatory Staff Training Programme (MSTP), Institutional Induction Training Programme

(IITP), Front Office Staff Training Programme (FROST), In Service Training Programme (ISTP), one year orientation programmes, Managerial Advancement Programme (MAP), Training of Outsourced Personnel (TOP) programme, Drivers Training Programme (DTP) and others.

He was a member of various institutional committees such as Fund Raising, Purchase, Quality, Safety and others. He worked with other departments, including Missions Office and Chaplaincy in organizing many international conferences for the institution.

He oversaw various management programmes such as the long running PGDHA Programme and, initiated the FHA Programme and the MHA programme in our institution. As an academician, he covered various management subjects including ethics for the allied health sciences students and Post Graduate Nursing students. He has authored/ co-authored books for training and academic purposes in the areas of hospital management, healthcare quality, healthcare finance and food safety and quality, which are in the publication pipeline. He has attended numerous conferences and workshops and published papers to his credit.

In addition to the above, he worked tirelessly to develop and sustain academic collaborations with other premier institutes of management and mission network such as-the BBA (HA) and MBA (HA) programme with Auxilium College (Autonomous), Vellore; the MBA HHSM programme with BITS Pilani; the PGD Christian Bioethics Programme with TCB, New Delhi; the DHA programme with CMAI, New Delhi; the upcoming International Diploma in Healthcare Management with ICMDA and upcoming short term and long term academic programme collaboration with XLRI, New Delhi amongst others. In addition to this, he also worked towards collaborations for management programmes affiliated to TISS, Mumbai and LIBA, Chennai.

He showed keen interest in sustainment of mission based healthcare delivery across the country towards ensuring the systems were robust to survive challenges of healthcare delivery within constrained economies. In this regard, he worked with many organizations on various projects and involved management students who had an excellent opportunity to work on live projects in mission hospitals through the 5 month Mission Hospital Internship Training & Education (MITE) programme. He also took the students for onsite learning visits to many mission and corporate hospitals.

Towards the end of his career, in 2021, being a senior administrator, he was appointed as Associate General Superintendent, in addition to his existing responsibilities. He played a vital role in identifying skilled vendors to carry out various activities like facility management, material porters, and others at the Ranipet campus. Along with admin, he created the Food and Beverages section in August 2022, driving many essential system changes towards ensuring compliance to FSSAI guidelines and instituting strict compliance standards of all food outlets, including in-house and outsourced units; during this time, he also oversaw the opening of 26 new outlets across the institution. He also oversaw the development of the Food Samaritan manual as a comprehensive resource for food safety and quality compliances. He also ensured standardization of volumes/quantity against prices and contract agreements for all vendors. He strove to overhaul the dietary billing system towards effectiveness and accountability.

His passion for upliftment of the poor and downtrodden led him to participate actively in various charitable organizations such as Mudhiyor Balar Kudumba Grama Pannai (MGKGP) Kasam where he served as Correspondent of Kings Higher Secondary School and serves currently as the Secretary and Hope House, Kasam where he serves as a board member, among others. He is a long standing board member of Christian Education Board of CMAI and was also the Secretary of the Administration Section of CMAI. He held the Vice Chairmanship position of the Haggai Vellore Alumni Association. He currently serves as the Vice Chairperson of the Christian Institute of Management, Chennai, and Board member and Finance Committee Member of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana, Punjab.

His wife, Mrs. Diana David, currently serves as Professor of Nursing (Maternity) at College of Nursing, CMC Vellore. His daughters, Dr. Daniella Karen David is currently working as Sr. House Surgeon in the Department of Emergency Medicine, CMC Vellore and Ms. Gabriella Sharon David is pursuing her 3rd year MBBS programme in CMC Vellore.

The 2nd Paediatric Renal Transplant and Bladder workshop



The **2nd Pediatric Renal Transplant and Bladder workshop** held from 6th to 8th July 2023 was supported by the International Society of Paediatric Nephrology (IPNA) and the International Society of Nephrology – The Transplantation Society (ISN-TTS), Sister Transplant Centre program and endorsed by the Indian Societies of Paediatric Nephrology (ISPN) and Nephrology (ISN). The delegates included paediatric and adult trainees in nephrology, urology and pediatric surgery, social workers, transplant coordinators, renal nurses and general practitioners interested in increasing their knowledge and awareness of kidney transplant. The meeting commenced with a workshop entitled "Preserving the Bladder for Transplant" held in the Ranipet campus. The talks included a wide range of topics from basic management of different bladder types to discussion of practical problems encountered in clinical practice and a video presentation. This was followed by practical demonstration of procedures in uro flow, video dynamics, renal scans and use of voiding diaries. We are grateful to Dr Chandra Singh, Head, Department of Urology and his team who played a major role in making this workshop a huge success. The meeting was highly informative and appreciated by the 80 delegates who attended the workshop.

The conference was a 2-day scientific feast which covered a wide range of topics. However, a major part of the first day was spent discussing various challenges in managing childhood difficult bladders. These topics were delivered by some of the best specialists in the field both from India and abroad with many useful inputs from our distinguished alumni, Dr Ganesh Gopalakrishnan and Dr Sudipta Sen, both doyens in their respective fields. The discussions were stimulating and educative and gave a wide perspective to the audience on how to approach these complex issues. The other topics included various pre and post-transplant issues, case discussions on rejection with input from our pathologists. There was a poster walk which showcased reports and studies on various transplant related issues. The highlight was a session on 'how to manage a failing graft' when several experts shared their experience in an area which is an emerging issue for pediatric graft recipients. The meeting ended with a talk by Dr. Vinoi David, Head, Department of Nephrology, who took us through the very interesting and successful journey of deceased donor transplant programme in this institution.

The Inaugural function was held at the end of the first day's session. Georgie Mathew, Organising Secretary gave the welcome address. The dignitaries on the dais were welcomed by renal transplant recipients aged between 7 and 13 years. The Conference was inaugurated by Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, Dr. Vinod Abraham, Principal, Dr. Anitha Shirley, Deputy Medical Superintendent, Dr. Indira Agarwal, Chair Scientific Committee and Dr. Kala Ebenezer, Head, Department of Paediatrics. Dr. Deepthi RV, Organizing Chairman gave the vote of thanks.



The course had a very enthusiastic response with about 100 delegates from remote parts of India and neighbouring country of Bangladesh. Oman. Distinguished alumni included Dr. Ganesh Gopalakrishnan, former Head, Department of Urology and Dr. Sudipta Sen, former Head, Department of Paediatric Surgery. Other faculty included some of the best practicing surgeons and nephrologists – adult and paediatric from our institute and other parts of the country.

This meeting, the first of its kind on a focused topic of managing bladder issues in paediatric renal transplant recipients, was greatly appreciated by all the delegates and faculty for the high quality of scientific content. The paediatric nephrology division would like to thank all the intramural faculty from Nephrology, Urology, Paediatric Surgery and Transfusion Medicine who came together to help make this programme a huge success. The meeting also showcased the superb team spirit amongst our teams who all work together with the single-minded intent to support children with kidney failure, providing them with great hope for a better life ahead.

The 18th Annual Post Graduate CME in Haematology (Hybrid)

The 18th Annual Post Graduate CME in Haematology, held from 11th to 13th July 2023, was a collaborative effort between the Departments of Haematology and Transfusion Medicine & Immunohaematology. This year's programme was conducted in a hybrid mode, combining both in-person and virtual elements. The primary objective of the CME was to provide post-graduate students from Medicine, Pathology, and Paediatrics with a comprehensive understanding of the field of Haematology.

The CME programme received a tremendous response, drawing the participation of 395 attendees from 221 colleges along with 42 students from our institution and included 45 international participants from the following countries: Canada, Kenya, Nigeria, Muscat, Iraq, Qatar, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Ethiopia, Azerbaijan, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan and Myanmar.

The attendance was a mix of both in-person and online participants, with 101 students who joined physically and 294 students virtually. The organisers anticipated that by the end of the programme, participants would have acquired a better understanding of both the laboratory and clinical aspects of Haematology.

Furthermore, the CME aimed to create awareness among physicians-in-training about the numerous career opportunities available in Haematology, spanning both laboratory and clinical settings. The programme spanned two and a half days and featured a variety of educational activities. These included didactic lectures covering essential topics in Haematology, interactive clinical case discussions, and laboratory tours and demonstrations. *Continued on Page 5*

Obituary

Dr. Abdul Kadir (MBBS Batch of 1969) born in Cochin on 11th November 1952 and passed away on 22nd June 2023 in Cochin after a prolonged illness.

Below is a write up from the Batch of 1969:

"We recently lost Abdul Kadir, a beloved and brilliant classmate and a gregarious man of great affection who exuded an enormous amount of genuine warmth. As a young father,

he endured an enormous personal tragedy and lost his wife Jasmine in an accident; he later had to personally overcome a serious illness of his own. Nevertheless, Abdul was rarely encountered without a smile on his

face for his friends, colleagues or students. He was incisive in his brilliance, thoughtful, immensely kind, had a tremendous sense of humor and was deeply knowledgeable on a range of subjects. He was quite unforgettable whether you knew him as long as we did, since the summer of 1969, or if you had perhaps just encountered him for a few hours of your life. He was, in the nicest sense of the word a "character".

There are many wonderful memories we have of Abdul, affectionately referred to by many as "Kadir Kutty"; memories going back to his days in Men's Hostel and beyond; more often than not actively engaged in interesting debates on a range of topics; or perhaps telling us about growing up on beautiful Vypeen Island off the coast of Cochin; or on occasion, regaling us, tongue-in-cheek, with stories of how a dowry in the Mopla community could double if the groom shaved every day. Abdul could discuss anything, drawing on a deep reserve of knowledge, with cutting observations supported by reason, but always with a smile and never, ever any trace of rancor or criticism. Conversations with Abdul at the hostel dinner table, in the hospital, or leaning across a parapet savoring the occasional breeze that wafted into the corridors at Vellore, were occasions of pleasure for all.

After his MBBS, Abdul earned a postgraduate qualification at CMC in psychiatry, and practiced for a while in Kerala. He then worked for some years in Muscat as a psychiatrist and it was while he was in Muscat that his wife tragically passed away in October 1987.

Abdul subsequently returned to Vellore and joined the Department of Physiology in CMC to teach as well as conduct research in neurophysiology under Dr. Marcus S. Devanandan. He completed his Ph.D while he was in the Department of Physiology and remained as a teacher in Physiology from 1993 to 2001. He was a much-loved teacher of physiology to medical students in their preclinical years at CMC for many years.

After his father passed away, Abdul returned to Kerala to look after his mother. By then his son, Zoheb, had settled in the United States. Abdul taught physiology in medical colleges in and around Cochin, and, as his son recounts, his students in Cochin like those in CMC, had tremendous affection for him. Abdul was truly a lovable friend who was loved when he was with us in person, and he continues to be loved even after he has left us."
