## **Professor Gagandeep Kang retires**



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**Professor Gagandeep Kang -** Cherry to her friends and colleagues - retired on August 16, 2023 after having spent 43 remarkable years at CMC Vellore. A member of the MBBS Batch of 1981, Professor Kang spent her early years travelling and living in various places accross India, as her father worked for the Indian Railways.

After completing her distinguished undergraduate medical career in 1986, she completed her MD in Microbiology in 1991. While in training and on the faculty developing and using her laboratory and teaching skills, Professor Kang developed, in parallel, a strong research career. She was awarded a Ph.D in 1997 for her work on Escherichia coli. She went on to complete her post-doctoral training in the Health Protection Agency, UK and the Baylor College of Medicine, USA.

Gagandeep Kang's key and comprehensive contributions to rotavirus research have significantly informed our understanding of disease and vaccine performance in children who live in challenging environmental conditions. She conducted the largest single birth cohort study on rotaviral infections in the world demonstrating that protection after natural infection is lower in

India than in developed countries, which has important implications for control of disease by vaccination. Prior to this seminal paper in rotavirus epidemiology, it was believed that two prior infections with rotavirus provided complete protection against subsequent disease, forming the basis of rotavirus vaccine development. The data showed that, in India, rotavirus infections occur early, reinfection is more common than previously believed, and the rate of protection against severe diarrhoea and diarrhoea of any severity was low, predicting that the rotavirus vaccines would not work as well as here as in industrialised countries. A modelling study using this data estimated 50% vaccine efficacy in poor environmental conditions. This level of efficacy has subsequently been reported in studies from Asia and Africa.

Professor Kang's key studies contributed not just to the development and introduction of two Indian rotavirus vaccines into the national immunisation programme, but also to further assessment of their safety and impact. These vaccines are now World Health Organisation (WHO) pre-qualified and have begun to be introduced in countries beyond India, with her laboratory continuing to support their evaluation and licensure.

Her group's community-based birth cohort studies have addressed infection, growth and development over 20 years, and haveresulted in multiple insights into the complexity of the interactions between the environment and infections in children, and the influence of prior infections on subsequent response to vaccination. A series of observational studies and clinical trials seeking to explain the response to oral poliovirus and rotavirus vaccines used microbiota analysis, the exploration of environmental enteric dysfunction and immunophenotyping. The results from these have supported not only the use of the best scientific approaches to field and laboratory studies, but also built a cadre of Indian researchers that are expanding into related areas of research.

Although enteric infections is a historically neglected area of global health, Dr. Kang has built an internationally recognised, globally competitive research programme, which develops its own priorities aligned with Indian needs. Dr. Kang's expertise in setting the research agenda, in conception, proposal development, resource mobilisation, in implementation and data analysis of research initiatives and in translating them into health policy in India, have built a model for research developed and led in a low-resource country, and has implications for the world.

Dr. Kang led the Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI) from 2016-2020 to establish translational science and augment the Indian medical research ecosystem. The programmes initiated there have been critical to supporting the multiple vaccine development efforts of Indian vaccine manufacturers and have received global recognition with the inclusion of the THSTI laboratory in the network co-ordinated by the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI).

Dr. Kang's work has resulted in multiple awards and recognitions, including, in 2019, election to the Fellowship of Royal Society, the first Indian woman to be so honoured in 360 years for her work based in India. The Royal Society is a Fellowship of many of the world's most eminent scientists and is the oldest scientific academy in continuous existence. The society has included many leading scientists over the past four centuries including Albert Einstein and Stephen Hawking. A profile of Dr. Kang was published in the Lancet on September 11, 2021. She has always been frugal with respect to her own needs, while being generous to people in need. Apart from sheer hardwork, her outstanding time management skills along with steadfastness in her convictions have been key contributing factors to her success. All her endeavours as a member of the CMC community have been supported by her husband Professor Mathew Joseph in Neurological Sciences and her sons, Arjun Kang Joseph, lawyer and Tej Kang Joseph, a medical alumnus of CMC. Professor Kang has been an incredible contributor to the mission of CMC and we wish her God's manifold blessings and continued future success.




workshop was also conducted to explain the nuances of a complex pelvic osteotomy to the delegates.
