**Dr. Vinoo Mathew Cherian**, fondly known as Prof VMC, first joined the department of Hand Surgery and became a part of the CMC family, after having finished his diploma in Orthopaedics, in Govt. Medical College, Kottayam, Kerala. His days as a registrar in the department of Hand Surgery exemplifies his very personality as an extremely hard-working young surgeon, putting in his blood and sweat to learn and help his patients. This aspect of him stayed with him throughout his 31 years of service at CMC till he superannuated on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2023.

After a short stint in Hand Surgery, Dr. Vinoo worked in the department of Anatomy for a year, before continuing his education in Orthopaedics – as a Non PG registrar prior to starting his MS in Orthopaedics. He has been an invaluable part of the department since then. In his early days, he has worked with the stalwarts of Orthopaedics at CMC – and became the man to rely on for all of them – a Man Friday of sorts. He went on study Leave (2004 September – Decembers 2005) to Northampton in the UK, furthering his knowledge and experience in the subject.

He became Professor in 2009 and was head of Orthopaedics Unit-I from May 2015 till he went on sabbatical leave to Bangladesh (June 2017 to December 2018) and upon return continued as head of the unit, and additionally became Head of the department from May 2019 till he retired in September 2020. He was also the Convenor of the Grievance Redressal Committee from February 2016 to June 2017.

As a young surgeon, Dr. Vinoo was adept at all kinds of surgeries, and never said no to a challenge – a fact demonstrated by his plethora of contributions to the department and the field of orthopaedics. His numerous publications span a vast array of subjects, delving into what are all now considered sub-specialisations in orthopaedics proving that he is an exception to the “jack of all trades, master of none” philosophy. He had an in-depth knowledge of all the specialisations and was always ready to lend a helping hand. His meticulous pre-operative planning, attention to detail and unparalleled skill in the operating room was a joy to witness. Enormous amounts of stamina and patience were attributes that made long surgeries less tedious. He had an extremely calming presence in the operating room (or just operating block too) which was reassuring to all his juniors and students, and the anaesthesia team as well. Anyone who was stuck with a dilemma during surgery need only call upon Dr. Vinoo, and he would be there, with his calming and reassuring presence to help with the tricky situation.

Dr. Vinoo was a gentleman Orthopaedician – one who seldom showed his anger and somehow even had a smile on his face through the trials of a stressful working day. His exemplary persona as someone you can always approach, was visible at every OPD. The first person to start and the last person to leave, a typical VMC trademark was true even upto his last OPD day in July 2023, and he would be calm and collected till seeing his very last patient off. Even the patients knew they would always be welcome in his room. He went out of his way to help patients even with non-orthopaedic problems. Patients came to him to get better – with his surgical skill or even just reassuring words and a gentle smile. Patients would rather wait and see him after 4 hours, than leave without seeing him. Despite his long list of OPD patients, students and all the surgeons of his team leaned on him for support, and he would provide it with a smile and plenty of encouragement. His compassion was beyond measure through the rigmarole of every workday. No patient was turned away, no student was asked to come back later, and everyone left his presence feeling like all is well.

Dr. Vinoo coached and taught so many young surgeons and postgraduates along the way, held their hand and always had their back. He has also navigated many students through their dissertations and theses, always an encouraging mentor to all his students. A teacher par excellence, he would teach his students through every OPD and every ward round. Dr. Vinoo has also been instrumental in getting MBBS students interested in the subject of Orthopaedics, even with the little exposure they had to the subject – a fact that is mirrored by the fact that he has been a recipient of the best teacher award in 2013.

They say that a good leader knows how to lead, delegates tasks well and is always there for his team. Dr. Vinoo was beyond a good leader – he was a great leader. Along with all the aspects of a good leader, he helmed the unit and department in a way that he empowered his team to go on without him at the helm, unlocking their potential to be better and do better. He helped shape the next generation of Orthopaedic surgeons at CMC and instilled in them the qualities and the confidence that they needed, which was evident in the fact that the operation theatre lists ran unhindered even if he were away, as they would usually run with him being around.

Apart from his love for work and surgery, Dr. Vinoos’s love for his furry and feathered friends is well known. He loved his cats, and numerous videos of them playing with him and his family showed another side of him, that was not surprising at all. He is also an avid reader, with knowledge in subjects far outside the medical world.

Despite the busy work schedule at CMC, Dr. Vinoo has always given his family top priority, and the family has been an integral part of his journey – his wife, Dr. Suja, an accomplished Professor of Psychiatry at CMC has been a rock at his side. Dr. Vinoo M. Cherian and Dr. Suja Kurian have been blessed with two daughters Divya and Aleena, who have been the lights of his life. Dr. Vinoo has been a champion of the women students in both MBBS and in Orthopaedics with encouraging words and support.

As Dr. Vinoo starts a new journey, living close to his elderly parents – he leaves behind an unforgettable legacy. The department remembers with gratitude his innumerable and invaluable contributions to Orthopaedic Surgery, to CMC as an institute, his larger-than-life persona and his unwavering support to his department and hospital. As he takes his journey in a new direction, he will always be respectfully and lovingly remembered not just as Prof VMC, but as a mentor, teacher, guide, surgeon par excellence and a man beyond measure. We extend our love, deep gratitude to Sir, and wish him well for his future.



## Risk Management in Laboratories

Quality Management Cell conducted a training programme on “Risk Management in Laboratories” in Co-ordination with CAHO (Consortium of Accredited Health Organization) on the 7<sup>th</sup> of September 2023 at Ranipet Campus, A Block, 7<sup>th</sup> floor, 60-Seater Hall. The programme was organised in view of the current version of ISO 15189:2022 for labs that stress on risk management and mitigation for medical testing labs. 35 participants from all laboratories in CMC Vellore attended in the programme.

**1. Village Health Survey:** A health survey was done by the volunteers to know the health problems, the nutritional status of the children, the number of antenatal and postnatal and the productive group in the village.

**2. Health Education:** Throughout the week, sessions were conducted on Dengue prevention, Environmental Sanitation, Management of Snake bite, Self-breast Examination and Prevention of Cervical Cancer, Personal hygiene and Worm Infestation, Hand washing technique, Prevention and Management of Hypertension and Diabetes Mellitus through mime, action song, folk songs and role play.

**3. Shramadan and Tree plantation:** The NSS Volunteers cleaned the premises of Zilla Parishad High School, Thummindapalayam village and planted tree saplings in the premises. Dr. Vibisha, Consultant, Community Medicine, Dr. Rachel, Junior Medical Officer, Dr. Anu Jose, Associate Surgeon, Dental Unit and Dr. Annie Prashanthi, Associate Professor, OBG Unit from CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus offered Consultation and Referral services to the village residents. Free medicines for diabetes and hypertension and vitamin supplements were distributed to the patients of CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus.

**7. School Health Programme:** There were 129 school children screened and common health problems like malnutrition, anaemia, impaired vision, dental caries, headache and common cold were identified. Healthy lifestyle practices were discussed and suggested to take the Iron supplementation provided by the Village Health Nurses.

## Basic Workshop on Artificial Intelligence

The **Clinical Epidemiology Unit and Cochrane India CMC Vellore** affiliate conducted a half a day workshop on **“Artificial intelligence for the Health Care worker”** on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 at CEU, ASHA building. The workshop was attended by 25 CMC staff from various departments. The workshop covered a very basic introduction to artificial intelligence, simple teaching examples in medicine, machine learning algorithms, potentials and pitfalls, opportunities and challenges. The resource faculty consisted of Dr. Mahesh Iyer, Scientist and Clinical trial expert, Pfizer, Hyderabad, Dr. Deepak Yeole, Associate Director, Statistical programming, Novartis, Hyderabad and Prof. L. Jeyaseelan, Adjunct professor of CEU and Professor of Biostatistics in Mohammed Bin Rashid University, Dubai. Prof. Thambu David, Director of Cochrane India CMC Vellore affiliate and CEU was the course coordinator. The workshop was well received and appreciated by the participants.



## CME on Acute Kidney Injury

The **Departments of Nephrology and Continuing Medical Education** organized a **CME on Acute Kidney Injury** on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2023.

In the first talk, Dr. Nisha Jose discussed the challenges in defining acute kidney injury and the role of biomarkers. Dr. Chilakha Rajesh stressed the importance of appropriate nutrition, drug dosage, fluid-electrolyte management, and correction of reversible factors, which may reduce the need for dialysis. Dr. Selvin Sundarraj presented evidence to show that in most cases there is no benefit in very early initiation of dialysis. Dr. Vinoi David discussed the advantages, disadvantages, intermittent, continuous and hybrid methods of hemodialysis and concluded that SLED has many advantages especially in the low-resource setting. Dr. Edwin Fernando from Stanley Medical College Hospital presented data to show the scope for peritoneal dialysis as a simple cost-effective option in India. Dr. Jeethu Jose spoke on special considerations in patients with cardiac failure and hepatorenal syndrome. Dr. Utkarash Mishra concluded the CME with an overview of the mortality and prognosis after Acute Kidney Injury.

## Distance Education Unit conducts Virtual Valedictory Ceremony for State Mentors

The Valedictory ceremony for the first two batches of **State Mentors in the Community Health Officers (CHO) Mentorship programme**, which is a nation-wide mentorship programme run by the Distance Education Unit with the Government to support Health & Wellness centres across the country, was held on the 9<sup>th</sup> September 2023. The programme was held virtually to felicitate the 191 State Mentors who had fulfilled the certification criteria. Dr Vinitha Ravindran, Dean, College of Nursing graced the occasion as the Chief Guest.

The Community Health Officers Mentoring Programme aims at equipping 36,000 Community Health Officers (CHOs) to be able to run the Health and Wellness Centres in a comprehensive manner with adequate clinical, public health and managerial skills. This massive virtual mentoring program, the first of its kind in the country, harnesses multiple technology enabled systems and is designed through a cascade of academic teams of medical and nursing faculty, who serve as Master Trainers, National Mentors and State Mentors from all States and they train Community Health Officers across the country. This programme is a tripartite partnership between the Distance Education Unit and Christian Medical College Vellore (DEDU, CMC) the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), and the National Health Systems Resource Centre (NHSRC, MoHFW). The certified State Mentors are linked to 36 CHOs each and are currently mentoring more than 4000 CHOs.

Chief Guest Dr. Vinitha Ravindran lauded the State Mentors on their achievement and motivated them to continue to make a difference. Dr. Joy Mammen, Associate Director and Dr. Solomon Sathishkumar, Principal also felicitated the State Mentors. The State Mentors pledged solemnly to live by the college motto 'not to be served but to serve' as they continue to mentor their CHO mentees.
