SHILOH 2023



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SHILOH 2023, the 16th annual students' mission conference was hosted by CMC Vellore from 28th September to 1st October 2023 at the Scudder Auditorium. This year's theme "Overcomers... More than Conquerors" was based on Romans 8:37. The theme was chosen to help young students and those working in the mission hospitals to face their daily challenges and emerge victoriously with the strength only the Lord can provide.

Shiloh is a student movement across various healthcare specialties which aims to look at Christian healthcare in India and nearby countries. The participants were inspired to envision and motivated to develop leaders in mission fields. This year, there were 1150 registrations, out of which 114 attended virtually. Additionally there were seven students from Sri Lanka and one from Nepal. This year saw good participation from CMC students as well.

The plenary sessions in the mornings and evenings were led by Dr. Muralidar K. (Director, Bethany Medical Centre, Anaikatty) and Mr. Philip Cherian (Director, Formations, Vellore) respectively. They expounded powerfully on the theme, brought into light the Biblical and practical aspects of being overcomers, and addressed some of the specific challenges commonly encountered. These sessions concluded with a quiet time in the morning and a hymn in the evening which helped the participants to reflect on what was spoken.

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The mission presentations brought in snippets from various Christian Medical Missions ranging from government set-ups (Dr. Justin Paul, Professor of Cardiology, MMC, Chennai) to academic centers (Dr. Joseph John, Professor and Head of haematology, CMC, Ludhiana) to remote corners (Dr. Manotosh Elkana, General Surgeon & Medical Superintendent, TLM, Chandkuri & Ms. Bendangmengla Ao, (Vice Principal, School of Nursing from CIHSR Dimapur); and neighbouring countries (Dr. Tul Bahadur Pun, Orthopedician & Medical Superintendent, Nepal). It brought in unique dimensions from varied healthcare personnel (including Mr. Paul C. Dass, physiotherapist and founder, of Provision India) who have lived out their faith and transformed lives and societies. Dr. Lionel Gnanaraj, former Medical Superintendent of CMC spoke on “CMC from a Missional Lens” providing insight into CMC’s role and calling in this regard. The students had the opportunity to personally interact with the faculty during the conference and were challenged to discover God’s calling for themselves.

Shiloh 2023 was organised in **close partnership** with CMAI (Christian Medical Association of India), EMFI (Evangelical Medical Fellowship of India), TLM (The Leprosy Mission), and the EHA (Emmanuel Hospital Association). During the conference, these missionary organisations shared their perspectives and roles and brought forth opportunities in missions across India.

One of the highlights of Shiloh was the **Rev. Dr. John Scudder Oration**, instituted in memory of Rev. Dr. John Scudder I, the grandfather of Dr. Ida Sophia Scudder and the first medical missionary to India. This year, the oration was delivered by Drs. Philip and Anna Alexander from Lady Willingdon Hospital, Manali in Himachal Pradesh. They shared their moving story of how they obeyed the Lord’s calling and moved from CMC, Ludhiana to this remote area to serve the people and the Lord. The provision and the hand of the Lord is upon them and the satisfaction and peace that He provided was a testimony of God’s faithfulness to those who respond to the calling of The Master.

This was followed by the **Director’s address** where Dr. Vikram Mathews highlighted the immense need in mission hospitals across the entire country and challenged the young ones to take on the torch to be future leaders in these places making a difference in the lives of many.

The **breakout sessions** were conducted by experienced faculty who specifically addressed the ways to overcome six challenging areas; temptations and addiction, fear, and anxiety, doubt, and unbelief, failures and setbacks, isolation and loneliness, and shame and guilt. These were dealt with by Brother John Kurian, Dr. Shanthi Davidar, Mr. Charles Premkumar, Mr. Moses David Raja, Mrs. Kalavathy Moses and Mrs. Sharmini Samuel respectively. This gave practical insights and stressed the solutions that the word of God offers.

The **group discussions** enabled the delegates to interact with their peers and the faculty in smaller groups. The young participants were stimulated to introspect on the theme and understand its implications as they move forward in their lives.

There was an exciting **Bible quiz** during the conference from the book of Acts to the book of Philemon focusing on the life and writings of Paul, the apostle. There was active participation from both the online as well as the on-site participants.

The **music evening** was collectively presented by Dr. Benny and Zanbeni Prasad, who challenged the audience to understand God’s call through their music, songs, and particularly through their travel experiences across the world.

There was a **special testimony** on overcoming challenges life by brother Naveen Richard, a standup comedian who has given his life for Christ, which captured the hearts of the youngsters.

There were exclusive **Q & A** sessions scheduled on each day and the panel of speakers answered the burning questions of life and missions from the delegates with the help of God’s word and His Spirit.

In all, Shiloh 2023 was a meaningful time of interaction and learning for students about mission work across the country and beyond. Each one was inspired to go forth not just as overcomers, but as conquerors and “more than conquerors”. Romans 8:37 says this is possible through Christ and Christ alone. “He who has called you is faithful, and He will do it” from 1 Thessalonians 5:2 is the assurance that was well received.

We praise the Lord for making Shiloh 2023 a success and while all the glory belongs to Him, we are thankful for all the numerous volunteers both student and faculty for their enthusiastic participation and working in various groups with such fervor, creativity, and willingness, the partners for standing by us in everything and the various CMC staff, alumni and well-wishers for their support in numerous possible ways, offering their time and resources.

It is our prayer that Shiloh continues to grow as an important institutional activity involving the entire community to impact the students for the Lord and missions. We look forward to Shiloh not just being a yearly activity but a movement that continues to impact, create pathways to interact, and facilitate the connection between students and missions throughout the year. Our sincere prayer is that we will be able to create a sustainable committed workforce in numerous mission hospitals and even beyond shortly.

Beyond Breast Cancer...

As October is Breast Cancer Awareness month, the Department of Radiation Oncology, Unit-III on behalf of Breast Disease Management Group organised stalls to create public awareness about Breast Cancer on 19th October, 2023. It started as a weeklong event to bring widespread attention to breast cancer in the United States in October 1985, founded by the American Cancer Society and Imperial Chemical Industries Pharmaceuticals. Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in the world, as well as in India. Hence, awareness must be raised among people about prevention, early detection, and treatment, as well as to raise money in support of research.

The programme began with a welcome address by Dr. Rajesh B, Head of Radiation Oncology Unit-III. Following this, Dr. Selvamani spoke about the importance of awareness of breast cancer, followed by felicitation by the Chief Guest, Dr. Rajesh I, Medical Superintendent, and Mrs. Alice Sony, Nursing Superintendent. This was followed by prize distribution for the poster and slogan competition. Dr. Subhashini John, former Head of the Department of Radiation Oncology, presented the awards for slogan and poster winners. A vote of thanks was given by Dr. Patricia S, followed by prayer and dedication of the stalls.

The awareness stalls included:

- nutrition and diet
- breast self-examination
- radiation and chemotherapy
- social services & • hair donation

Every stall had various posters and pamphlets in various languages packed with information. The breast self-examination stall had models for practical demonstration, and in addition, there were short videos regarding the same which everyone could watch. The radiation oncology stall had handmade models of state-of-the-art treatment machines, which generated a lot of interest.

The social services stall aimed to educate people regarding the various funding available for the treatment of breast cancer patients. They also had information for people who wished to donate hair to cancer patients. Over 50 posters and slogans submitted for the competition were displayed in the last stall.

Overall, the programme was a resounding success in which many people benefitted from the information and education imparted via active interaction in the stalls.



State Level Workshop on 'Healthy Living: Older Adults with Diabetes Mellitus'

The Departments of Medical Nursing, Geriatrics, and CNE & Research, College of Nursing conducted a state-level workshop on 'Healthy Living: Older Adults with Diabetes Mellitus' on 18th October, 2023. The workshop began with a word of prayer. A total of 46 delegates from within and outside the institution attended the workshop. The objectives of the workshop were to create awareness of the concept of Diabetes Mellitus in older adults, illustrate the principles of medical management, monitor and prevent micro and macrovascular complications in older adults, equip older adults to manage digital device use in Diabetes Mellitus and educate them on lifestyle modifications, especially on a nutrition-food plate.

The sessions were covered by the faculty from the Departments of Geriatrics CMC Vellore; Medical Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore; Shanmuga College of Nursing for Women, Shankari and Apollo Hospitals, Chennai. The topics covered were an overview of Diabetes Mellitus, drug therapy, the role of nurses, healthy lifestyle modifications in older adults, and, walking after a meal by the older adult with diabetes mellitus. There was also interesting group work on case scenarios and hands-on sessions on insulin therapy, self-monitoring devices, podiatric care, and food plates. The Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council awarded 7 credit points for the workshop.



World Hospice and Palliative Care Day

Every year, the second Saturday of October is observed as World Hospice and Palliative Care Day, a unified day of action to celebrate and support hospice and palliative care around the world. The theme for 2023 is "Compassionate Communities: Together for Palliative Care."

Towards this, the Department of Palliative Medicine conducted awareness programmes for high school students of four schools in Vellore. Palliative care was a new concept to the school children and they were greatly interested in learning more about it. During the discussion time, there was active participation and engagement by the school students. Many students even volunteered to identify and help the people with palliative care needs in their neighbourhood. It was heartening to see such compassion and motivation from the younger generation and we believe these are seeds sown to promote compassionate community participation.

Palliative care, in its true sense, should transcend the boundaries of the hospital and address various aspects of the lives of our patients and their families. Often, the disease or death of the breadwinner leaves a family struggling. The Department of Palliative Medicine tries to identify and help such families by providing monthly ration, supporting children's education, and empowering the bereaved family to be self-sufficient. This month the support group had a programme reinforcing the different components of palliative care provision and how each one could advocate palliative care for those in need and become compassionate communities.

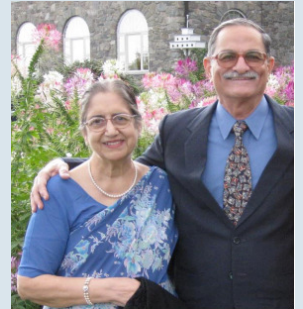
