Pride of India

Common name: Pride of India, Queen of Flowers, Queen's crepe myrtle

Botanical name: Lagerstroemia speciosa; Family: Lythraceae; Name in Tamil: Kadali, Kadalimugai,

Kadalippuva, Pumarudu



Field identification: A moderate sized, deciduous tree but can reach heights of 60 feet. Trunk straight. Bark pale brown, flakes off in irregular patches. Branches spread widely. Green leaves, paler on underside, on stout stalks, oblong-lance shaped, nearly opposite, 5-8 inches x 1.3-3 inches, with bluntly pointed tips, with prominent main veins. Flowers, in erect panicles 8-15.7 inches; each flower with six mauve, pink, or lilac crinkly petals.
