South Indian Soapnut

Common name: South Indian Soapnut, South Indian Ritha; **Botanical name:** Sapindus emarginatus;

Family: Sapindaceae; Name in Tamil: Ponam-Kottai, Manipungan maram, Poovandikotta









Field identification: Tree with a spreading crown. Bark rough, grey, peels off. Leaves compound, alternate, leaflets 2-3 pairs, sub-opposite, terminal pair longer, elliptic and sometimes notched at apex. Fruit fleshy drupes (stone fruit), 2-3, 1-3 cm diameter

Location on campus: Few. E.g. Behind Women's Hostel Chapel Wing, Mango Road, Brook Road
