Dr.Geethanjali joined the Department of Clinical Biochemistry in 1982 as an Associate Biochemist after completing her post-graduation in Medical Biochemistry from CMC. She was involved in teaching both undergraduate and postgraduate students of various courses.

Her research work on 'Lp(a) in various clinical conditions' led to the award of Ph.D in 1999. As part of her PhD research, she went on a study leave where she was trained in Basic Research Techniques and Molecular Biology at the Institute of Medical Biology and Human Genetics, Innsbruck, Austria in 1997. She was involved with routine laboratory work including handling

of auto analysers, manual assays, RIA and ELIZA.

She was the coordinator for the ACBI/CMCEQAS program. In this connection, she visited Glasgow, UK for three months in 2002, to learn more about freeze drying techniques and to Cardiff, UK to learn spiking techniques for the hormone EQA programme. She has been an invited speaker for various scientific programmes in India. Recently she has been awarded the 'Dr. T. Vijayakumar Memorial Scientist Award' for the year 2017. She was the co guide for six Ph.D students, and was involved in projects in collaboration with other departments.

r. Noel Walter, Professor and Head of the Department of Forensic Medicine retired on 27th December 2018 after twenty years of continuous service in CMC Vellore.An alumnus of the MBBS Batch of 1975, he spent most of his life in CMC (his parents, Dr. Adolf and Dr. Sylvia, his brother Dr.David Walter, and his wife Dr. Vrisha Madhuri are also alumni). His son Ajit is an engineer. In 1988 he obtained his postgraduate qualification in Pathology from CMC and was employed as Junior Lecturer in the Department of Pathology for three years. From 1991 to 1998, he worked in the UK and also completed his MRCPath exam. Upon his return to India he rejoined the Pathology Department, where he served for four more years. In 2002, he moved to Forensic Medicine, fulfilling an institutional need for permanent Senior Faculty sand remained there until his retirement.

Dr. Walter was instrumental in developing Forensic Medicine from a small teaching service into the fully independent and substantially larger department that it is today. Workshop organised by the ReAct Asia Pacific in association with the Department of Infectious Diseases

ReAct Asia Pacific, in association with the Department of Infectious Diseases hosted a workshop titled 'Sensitization and Training on Antibiotic Use and Stewardship' from 17th to 19th December 2018. After the formal launch of the Kerala Antimicrobial Resistance Strategic Action Plan (KARSAP) on 25th October 2018, ReAct Asia Pacific was requested to sensitize and train pharmacologists on optimizing antibiotic use and antibiotic stewardship in human sector. In relation to this, this workshop was organised which was attended by thirteen pharmacologists representing eight government medical colleges in Kerala.

The workshop began with an introductory session on AMR by Dr. Sujith Chandy, Head ReAct Asia Pacific and Professor Department of Clinical Pharmacology . During the session he discussed about the Global, National and Kerala action plans for AMR. Dr. Priscilla Rupali, Head of the Infectious Disease Department, presented sessions on the concept of Antibiotic Stewardship Programme (ASP) and the various strategies under ASP with different case scenarios.

Following this were discussions on various topics such as drivers of AMR, Antibiotic use studies from India, Antimicrobial resistance-Global and Indian Scenario, creating antibiograms, framing institutional antibiotic policy, Hospital-Acquired Infections (HAI) and Infection Control, Hand hygiene and surgical prophylaxis, metrics in antibiotic use, Drug Utilization Research (DUR), Drug and Therapeutics Committee and antibiotic prescription audit.

In addition to this faculty from the department of Clinical Pharmacology explained the role of TDM (Theraputic Drug Monitoring) and pharmaco-metrics in optimizing antibiotic use, PK-PD of antibiotics and quality control in laboratory. The workshop concluded with a brainstorming session on the type of projects that could be initiated for implementing KARSAP. The participants will be reporting to the Kerala government for further follow-up.

Making a Difference - Duncan Hospital (Emmanuel Hospital Association)

JANUARY 21, 2019

A day in Duncan

It was yet another regular Monday morning in Duncan. I, walking about with the young and excellent consultants in Medicine, Anesthesia / Critical care and Paediatrics... me, not doing much but just being around.

As we walked into casualty, there was this 50-year, obese male, in encephalopathy and taking very shallow breaths. A classic and clear patient with Obstructive airways disease and possibly an additional Obesity hypoventilation syndrome in respiratory failure. Some surgeon in a nearby nursing home had taken the risk of doing a surgery on such a high-risk patient and now he had come in with respiratory failure. His complex blood gases started of a series of conversations. Should we intubate and ventilate, if we ventilate, would he ever come out, or should we wait on NIV alone? If he does not come out of ventilation what would the next step be? Finally, after much consideration, the Anesthetist turned critical care specialist, decided for NIV (Noninvasive Ventilation) only.

We walked into the ICU and my colleague the anesthetist, showed me another patient. An 80-year- old lady with obstructive airways disease, with type 2 respiratory failure on NIV with blood gases not showing much change despite NIV. Question of what to do next? With no home oxygen support, no other systems affordable, what would you do to this patient who is from a nearby leprosy colony? Send her off for palliative care or give more time?

The next bed was a young lady who had presented in severe pulmonary edema and full-term pregnancy 2 weeks prior. Our team had managed to immediately ventilate her and do a LSCS and save the mother and child. An echo had showed a Peripartum Cardiomyopathy. **She had gone home well,** and some where in the local hospital they had pushed in fluids and she was back in cardiogenic shock and severe pulmonary edema, recovering on ventilation.

Before I moved out of ICU, I joined the Pediatrician. She was struggling to sort out the complex endocrinological challenge of managing a 12-year-old child who had undergone a cranio-pharyngioma surgery at CMC Ludhiana 40 days prior to this. The Child has been presenting with hypokalemic paralysis, acidosis, a Central Diabetes Insipidus, (CDI) has a TSH of 34 and very low Cortisol. She was struggling with the question - what were we dealing with? A single diagnosis of Pan hypopituitarism or multiple diagnoses of Pan hypopituitarism with Primary hypothyroidism, RTA, and CDI?

As I moved to the medical ward, we started talking about another lady, whom we were struggling with. Severe deforming Rheumatoid arthritis, Thyrotoxicosis and an intractable vomiting that was not getting controlled with any anti emetics and preventing her from taking any tablets for the underlying diseases. She was refusing an endoscopy, husband was not willing to accept the diagnosis of Thyrotoxicosis, because **the thyroid swelling was from birth as per him, and not significant, did not have money nor the willingness to take her for further evaluation.**

We continued to talk about a patient whom we had just referred off, one unusual presentation amid the many hyponatremias we see, due to steroid abuse. This elderly man with severe hyponatremia, thought to be due to steroid abuse, like the many others but having a **carcinoma head of pancreas**, and hyponatremia being a para neoplastic syndrome.

Before I moved out into OPD, there were couple of more patients that caught my attention. A young girl being treated for the last 2 years as TB with multiple courses of ATT, admitted for evaluation. Quick clinical evaluation by the consultant has clinched the diagnosis – a Progressive systemic sclerosis, with Bronchiectasis, Cardiac and Esophageal involvement, missed in the multiple centers she had visited. At the same time the family unwilling to continue treatment, the moment they knew she had a chronic illness, unwilling to spend any more money on a girl!

Then there was this 40-year-old man who had presented with seizures, now recovering in the ward, with no family around – left alone. Turning out to be Stage IV HIV infection with pulmonary TB and possibly Toxoplasmosis (no CT possible because of lack of support systems) with a CD4 less than 15 with the Medical team trying to sort the medical, the social and other complexities of managing such a patient with no support systems.

As I was walking to the OPD my WhatsApp bleeped... an X-ray for opinion. A girl child who had a **chest wall injury one month back** brought in with an effusion on one side and encysted pneumothorax on the other side, question of how many ICDs to put and where. The fluid turned out to be "old blood" one side! **Neglected for more than a month because being a girl child?**

Reaching OPD, a young man was waiting with a recent onset "hyperpigmentation of face and sclera" and a family history of a brother having same problem. Was it just a congenital problem or something like Alkaptonuria? By then a staff was waiting – with history of recurrent parotitis and dry mouth, asking what tests she should do to rule out a Sjogren's…

All these in a single day....

Why am I writing this? I hope some where some Internal Medicine or Paediatrics resident or consultant would read this and decide to take a detour from their planned career directions. To come over and experience the thrill of clinical medicine and paediatrics management in a resource limited setting like this. And may be through that exposure, decide to spend some time learning, teaching and caring in a context that needs clinicians to care for a community that cannot go elsewhere, for such complex problems!

4th International Conference on Birth Defects-ICBD 2018



The Department of Medical Genetics organised the 4th International conference on Birth defects (ICBD) from 13th to 15th December, 2018. The conference was organised in association with the 5th Annual Conference of the Society for Indian Academy of Medical Genetics (SIAMG) and supported by Genomic Medicine Foundation (UK).

inaugural programme commenced with an opening prayer followed by a welcome address by Dr.Sumita Danda, Professor and Head, Department of Medical Genetics. The Chief Guest for the event was Professor Dian Establishment Donnai, Manchester, UK. The other dignitaries present were Dr. J.V. Peter, Director, Dr. Vinay

Know your Department-Library Services

The Genesis and Development of the Department of Library Services



Genesis: The services of the Department of Library started its humble beginning in the Department of Nuclear Medicine at the Hospital campus with very limited books and journals in the year 1940. Madam Gertrude Dodd was attracted by the mission work of Dr. Ida Scudder and left the comforts of her home to join Dr.Ida and served here for three decades. Therefore the Library has been aptly named as Dodd Memorial Library in honor of her dedicated service.



The Library witnessed a swift and significant development each year ever since its nascent stage since 1940.

1942: The collection of faculty publications began at the library which was followed by the introduction of the Monthly Index Medicus and Cumulative Comprehensive Index Bibliographic Tools to locate the articles.

1947: Establishment of the Microfilm Service Unit

1965: Relocation of the hospital library building to the second floor of the OPD building.

1987: Introduction of the Reprographic Facility with a new Panaprint Copycat Xerox Machine ECX303 Mark II which was later replaced with Zoom Modi Xerox Machine.

1981: Members were allowed to carry their personal books to the library; CMC being the first of its kind to introduce such a measure.

1989: Relocation of the College Hill Library to its present location. The library was renamed as the "Gault Library" in memory of the Pathologist **Dr. Edward Gault**.

1989-1991: Installation of 'Medline', the National Library of Medicine (NLM) bibliographic database on CD / ROM and later a Video Unit.

1992: Relocation of The Dodd Memorial Library which was housed in the 2nd Floor of OPD Block to the 1st and 2nd Floor of the ASHA Educational Building.

1998: Extension of the Internet and Email Facility at Dodd Memorial Library.

2002: Introduction of the Electronic Journal Access and Wifi.

2005-2008: Introduction of Computer laboratories in both the Dodd and Gault libraries and usage of Barcoded Identity cards for the whole CMC Students Community.

2008: Introduction of E-resources through EZ-proxy by the off-campus online access for assisting the faculty travelling out of station and to the Mission Hospitals to acces the network .

2010: Installation of surveillance cameras.

2016: This year saw a significant milestone in the developments of the libraries. The Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system was introduced.

The application of Information Communication Technology (ICT) has brought dramatic changes in the library services. The library website was integrated with LinkOut, a unique service that allows direct links from PubMed. This gives a count of full text articles available in CMC portal apart from PubMed central which is a free full text database of NLM, USA.

P.T.O

There has been a voluminous growth of published documents in the recent past. By using Dspace software the library has taken the effort to collect all the published articles with the full text and the Inter Library Loan system was introduced and MoUs signed with DELNET, New Delhi, Q-Med Knowledge Foundation, Mumbai, to avail the unavailable articles. The Online Public Catalogue Access (OPAC) is an additional feature of the library service.

Electronic resources like e-books, e-journals and databases were introduced eventually. Besides the main libraries, resources are procured from more than 50 departmental libraries, with proper inventories. The library provides statistical data to all the Inspection agencies like MCI, Tamil Nadu Dr.MGR Medical University, and other National, Regional and State level agencies. Data is also provided to the media of the country which involves in National Ranking of the Institutes.

The department has also been quite busy with organising various academic events. Three remarkable workshops and conferences at regional and international level were organised. A workshop on Greenstone Digital Library in 2007, a regional conference on "Scientific Writing" in 2015 and an international conference on Libraries Beyond Borders" in 2017. A pre-conference proceeding with ISBN was published during the International conference.

Library services are open till midnight with access to all services. There is no doubt that the CMC Libraries provide a conducive environment for education and research. The staff in the library is well equipped to serve the readers and thus joining hands in fulfilling the great vision of the founder Dr.Ida Sophia Scudder in building the kingdom of God by supporting education, research and patient care.

Course in Postgraduate Diploma in Medical Law and Ethics.



CMC has been engaging with the Faculty of the National Law School of India University (NLSIU), Bengaluru over past several months to conduct a Post Graduate Diploma in Medical Law and Ethics (PGDMLE) course for its Faculty and Staff. On 14th January, 2019, a facilitated PGDMLE course conducted by NLSIU was inaugurated at the Jacob Chandy Hall, Paul Brand Building.

This PGDMLE is conducted by the Distance Education Department of NLSIU whereby enrolled scholars attend three rounds of contact classes here in CMC along with a dissertation and an examination

(comprising 4 papers) at the end of the course.

At the inaugural programme, the Vice Chancellor of NLSIU, Professor R Venkata Rao offered felicitations and remembered with immense gratitude how CMC successfully treated his father in the seventies for a malignancy. Dr. Arpitha HC, Assistant Professor, NLSIU gave an outline of the course. Dr. Alexander Thomas, PG alumnus of CMC and present Executive Director of Accredited Healthcare Providers of India, himself a PGDMLE scholar, addressed the gathering highlighting the need for awareness of legal issues among the medical fraternity. Mr. Nitin Kadam the Business Head of Edchemy Solutions initiated the scholars into the use of the NLSIU distance learning website. Dr. Priya Abraham Associate Director (Medical) welcomed the gathering and Dr. Vikram Mathews Associate Director (Admin) and Acting Director emphasized the need for CMC to have trained faculty in this field.

The coming together of CMC and this premier Law School for this facilitated course is the first of its kind in India. It is hoped that more Faculty and Staff will enrol for the PGDMLE in the next couple of years.

A milestone from the Department of Gastroenterology

A landmark was achieved on 19th November 2018 when the Department of Gastroenterology successfully performed an endoscopic ultrasound guided gastro-enterostomy for the first time in South India. The procedure was carried out on a patient who had an inoperable pancreatic cancer with duodenal obstruction. A special lumen apposing metal stent (Hot-AXIOSTM) was used to create the anastomosis between stomach and jejunum bypassing the area of narrowing. This was done under general anesthesia and the patient could be initiated on oral feeds within 48 hours of the procedure. As of date, the patient has been doing well. The procedure was performed by the team led by Dr. Sudipta Dhar Chowdhury (Professor, Gastroenterology) with anaesthesia support provided by Dr. Anand Babu M (Senior Resident, Anaesthesia). The team is grateful to the Departments of Radiology, Medical Oncologyand Haematology for their valuable input towards the management of this case. This procedure is expected to benefit similar patients for whom surgery may not be an option.

• Miss Mary George, fondly known as Kochamma was born on 13th February, 1931 in Punnavely, Kerala to devout Christian parents. At a very young age of nine, she began to feel her connection with God and has ever since bee faithful in her calling. After her schooling she joined CMS College, Kottayam for her higher studies and later the Union Biblical Seminary, Yavatmal. After completing her Bachelor of Divinity, she joined as a chaplain in CMC on 1st July, 1961 and since then till her retirement in 1991 and even after that she has been a source of inspiration for all. She was the first theologically trained lady chaplain in CMC. Her ministry had a deep personal touch which made a

lasting impact in the hearts of many. In all her interactions and sermons, she brought forth the values and ethos of CMC. Her presence was felt everywhere within the portals of the institution, she would pray and counsel students, patients and anyone who is in need. On 21st December 2018, the Lord took her away to be in her everlasting home. In her passing, she has left the institution devoid of a unique person, who was a true exemplification of the life of Christ. CMC remains grateful to God for the life and ministry of Ms.George.

• Dr. Mammen Chandy, alumnus of the MBBS batch of 1967 and former Professor and Head of the Department of Haematology will be awarded the prestigious Padma Shri Award, one of the highest civilian awards of the country. Dr. Mammen Chandy joined CMC in 1967, graduating as the 'Best Outgoing Student' of his batch. He then joined the Department of Medicine for his postgraduate studies, during which an interest in the field of Haematology, kindled during his undergraduate days, was further ignited. Making a Difference Hospital of the Month-Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack

FEBRUARY 25, 2019



Bissamcuttack, a village with a population of about 9000, located in Rayagada, district of Odisha is a mountainous region rich in natural resources but also plagued by underdevelopment. It was in this region that the 63-year-old Christian Hospital, Bissamcuttack (CHB) was formed in the year 1953 by Dr. Elisabeth

Madsen. After reading about the pathetic and grim health situation of southern Orissa, she decided to move to the region and develop a better health care for its residents.



The 200-bedded multi-disciplinary mission hospital began in the veranda of a church in Bissamcuttack, where Madsen was seeing patients. Later as the demands grew, she was joined by Dr. Virendra Kumar Henry, a surgeon from Chhattisgarh and his wife Nancy, a nurse from Ohio in the year 1975. Together they put in several systems which eventually made the hospital self

sufficient. Over the years they started a nursing school, a community health project covering more than 50 Adivasi Villages and night classes using bilingual educational methods. In 1980, a second community health project was started in Dakulguda village, by the nursing department, under Nancy's supervision. In the year 1986, the New Life English Medium School was introduced thus providing education to the people of the village.

Dr. Johnny Oommen came to CHB in the year 1987 and later in 1993 joined the Community Health Department. During that year, there were two small ongoing projects; one run by the nurses which focussed on mother and child care in nine villages. The second was a community health project, revamped and re-focussed in 1994 under the operational name MITRA – an acronym for Madsen's Institute for Tribal and Rural Advancement. In MITRA, there was a team of ten, mostly from the local people. The work included running village clinics, adult literacy programmes and tree plantation drives.

Under Dr. Johnny's supervision, the health conditions were getting better and there were visible developments in the village. The focus on education became a central factor to the betterment of the society. The MITRA team arranged for an educated tribal youth to reside in the village for a year, to run a school for children during the day and for adults at night.

What once was a poverty stricken neglected region has now flourished to be a happy and self sufficient society. CHB is now a 200-bed hospital, employing 300 staff with a School of Nursing that offers two courses has 120 students from different parts of Odisha. An average

CMC is the first teaching hospital to receive this status. With CMC as a Centre for Quality Promotion (CQP) other hospitals and laboratories in the region especially mission hospitals and rural hospitals situated in difficult terrains can be guided towards accreditation through technology.

Several lectures and panel discussions focused on topics ranging from accreditation and its impact inpatient care, process improvement, cost reduction, benchmarking, managing disasters, legal entanglements and healthcare professional safety. The programme was presided by Dr. Vikram Mathews, Associate Director (Admin). The Administrative Officers Dr. Prasad Mathews, Dr. Premila Lee, Dr. Chandra Singh, Dr. Priya Abraham, Dr. M.J. Paul, Ms. Ilavarasi Jesudoss chaired and spoke at the sessions. Dr. Reginald Alex set the pace for the discussions by emphasizing the importance of occupational health stating that the phrase is not "physician heal thyself" anymore, but "physician protect thyself".

The panel discussion on safety of healthcare professionals chaired by Dr. Vijay Agarwal, President CAHO and Dr. Bimal Charles, General Secretary, CMAI, was interactive and addressed the reasons for attack on healthcare professionals and how to prevent incidents. Dr. Alexander Thomas, President, AHPI chaired a session on lessons learnt from managing disasters. The experience of handling fire incidents in general, Nipah virus epidemic in Kerala, and the extent of emergency preparedness were addressed by speakers.

The session on experiences gained from legal entanglements was chaired by Dr. OV Nandimath, Professor, National Law School of India, and the speakers from National Law School dissected and discussed many prominant consumer cases. The day ended with a colourful music-dance delight by the Medical, Nursing and Allied Health students.

The second day commenced with the session on work place monitoring for risk reduction followed by sessions on process improvement, benchmarking and challenges in implementation where speakers shared their experiences. This conference also hosted five parallel pre-conference workshops on 31st January 2019 which covered the core essence of the various aspects to achieve the benchmarks of safety and quality in health care services. The workshop on "Implementation of NABH Pre-Accreditation Entry Level Standards" was organised by Quality Management Cell for hospitals seeking accreditation with topics ranging from the policies, procedures required for implementing quality and safety standards towards patient welfare and organizational effectiveness. More than 140 participants especially from mission hospitals and other hospital actively participated.

The "International Patient Safety Goals (IPSG) workshop" for students organized by Dr. Samuel N.J. David, Head, Staff Training Department addressed patient safety related matters such as correct patient, correct procedure, good communication, risk management infection control and was attended by over 130 students.

The "Nursing Excellence Standards for Quality Nursing Care" was organized by the Nursing Service team focused on quality health care in the nurse-patient interphase, which involves stringent adherence to established protocols and effective communication.

The workshop on "Food safety" was organized by Ms. Manimegalai, Head, Department of Dietetics which aimed to bring about better understanding of food safety and the relevant guidelines governing safe practice in this area, where more than 120 students and faculty participated.



Workshop organised by the Department of Clinical Pharmacology

The Department of Pharmacology and Clinical Pharmacology organized a Workshop in Therapeutic Drug Management, from February 12th-15th, 2019. The participants who attended this workshop included both faculty and post graduates from the Department of Pharmacology, from various states of India. The workshop was started with a word of prayer by Rev. Joji Philip and then inaugurated by the Associate Medical Superintendent, Dr. Joy Mammen. The workshop was initiated with talks where the faculty shared



their experience over the past few years in the field of Therapeutic Drug Monitoring (TDM) and highlighted the cases where the patients benefited from this TDM service. The lectures on the laboratory aspects gave an insight into the principle behind the drug assays. The following day, the participants were given hands on experience in doing a drug assay which included the blood sampling principles to be followed in TDM, different drug extraction techniques from the biological matrix, interpretation of quality controls, and the interpreting of the results that come for the laboratory. Hands on training in the handling of the pharmacokinetic data and the derivation of the pharmacokinetic parameters was also given. During the final day the clinical application of TDM in various diseases were discussed and the workshop ended with a quiz that was appreciated by all the participants. This workshop was awarded 30 credit points. It was heart warming to hear that some participants had attended the workshop to initiate TDM services in their respective hospitals. The department is extremely thankful to all those who made this workshop a success.

Dedication of Services at the CMC Vellore Chittoor Campus



On the 18th of February, 2019, the CMC Vellore Chittoor campus had its labour room inaugurated along with the newly refurbished nursery. • Dr. G. Sridharan, Professor and former Head of the Department of Clinical Virology, CMC, passed away peacefully on 24th of February 2019 at Chennai. Dr. Sridharan, fondly known as Bobby to his contemporaries, was born to the late Mr. Gopalan and Mrs. Vijaylakshmi in Chennai on 28th of October, 1954. He spent his childhood in Chennai and Pondicherry and graduated from Loyola College, Chennai in 1974 and in 1977 completed the MSc. Medical Microbiology course and subsequesntly his Ph.D in 1984.

He was an excellent teacher well known for his teaching ability, particularly in the difficult subject of Immunology. His photographic memory was legendary among MSc and MD students. He underwent special training at Channing Laboratories, Harvard Medical School, Boston, USA, and at the Centers for Disease Control, Atlanta, Georgia, USA, on diagnosis of genital mycoplasma and chlamydial infections respectively. Followiong which he underwent two years of post-doctoral training at the Department of Molecular Microbiology & Immunology, Bloomberg School of Public Health, Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland, USA between 1993 and 1995. On his return to Vellore, he joined the Clinical Virology Department and, following the retirement of Prof. T. Jacob John, took over the reins of the Clinical Virology Department on 4th of December 1995, a position he held until 2007.

During his tenure as head of the department, he had a clear vision for how the department was to function. His initial task was to establish the fledgling department by strengthening clinical diagnostic services for the hospital and ensuring that it became self-sufficient. Subsequently, he concentrated on research activities by registering several students towards Ph.D under the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University.

He was awarded Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists (London) and Fellow of the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine & Hygiene (London) in 2005. He initiated several intramural projects and was principal and co-investigator on many extramural projects funded by the ICMR, DST and DBT. He published extensively, having more than 180 publications in national and international peer reviewed journals. He was a member of the Technical Resource Group on "Research and Development on HIV/AIDS" of the National AIDS Control Organization; the Projects Advisory Committee of the Department of Science and Technology; member and secretary of the Institutional Animal Ethics Committee; Board of Studies of Vellore Institute of Technology in Biosciences and Biotechnology; member of the Institutional Animal Ethics Committee; Institutional Research Committee and member of the Senate of the TN Dr. MGR Medical University. From the year 2002-2006, he took up the role of vice principal for research. Even after his voluntary retirement in 2009, he continued to be active as a scientific consultant for the Indian Council of Medical Research; advisor and emeritus scientist at the Department of Health Research, Sri Narayani Hospital & Research Centre, Thirumalaikodi, Vellore; Visiting Professor at Sri Ramachandra University, Porur, Chennai and the University of Vellore Institute of Technology.

Even more than his significant professional accomplishments, Dr. Sridharan was a warm, considerate friend to his colleagues, a mentor to junior faculty and students, unstintingly going out of his way to help all who were in need. He impacted the department to such a degree that all categories of staff were benefitted in some way professionally and personally by their interaction with him. A. Eligibility: (Cl.Min.No.5188-11-79; 7449:6:93 & 9282:1-2003)

- 1. Only children of confirmed C.M.C staff members who:
- (a) have put in 10 years of continuous service including period of probation and are currently in service in any capacity in the Institution as on 30th June of the year under consideration; (OR)
- (b) have retired after at least 15 years of continuous service in the Institution, or have taken voluntary retirement after 25 years of continuous service; (OR)
- (c) have been discharged from service on medical grounds after at least 15 years of continuous service; (OR)
- (d) have died during service after at least 10 years of continuous service in this Institution are eligible to apply for sponsorship.
- 2. Legally adopted children of staff members whose adoption was finalized at least five years before the date of application are also eligible for sponsorship, subject to the above criteria.
- 3. Regarding a confirmed staff member who died during service to the institution and whosespouse has been given a job in CMC in place of the deceased staff member, dependent children of the deceased staff member will be eligible for CMC sponsorship if the cumulative years of service of the deceased staff member and his/her spouse (including probation and confirmed periods) exceeds 10 years; in case the child applying for sponsorship was legally adopted by the deceased staff member, the adoption of the child should have been finalised:
- (a) prior to the death of the deceased staff member, and
- (b) at least five years before the date of application for sponsorship

B. Conditions for sponsorship of staff children (Cl. Min.5759:3-84)

- (a) Only one child from a family can be admitted in a year to any single course.
- (b) Children from the same family can, however, be admitted to different course in the same year.

- (c) Sponsorship is allowed from only one sponsoring body, so children applying for C.M.C. sponsorship cannot also be sponsored by one of the supporting Churches of the Council.
- (d) Where there is more than one sponsorship obtained, the one received first which satisfies the criteria will be accepted.
- (e) No withdrawal of first received valid sponsorship is allowed.

Dedication of the CMC, Vellore Chittoor Campus, College of Nursing Building



International Women's Day Celebrations at CMC

CMC celebrated International Women's Day for the very first time this year, with an evening to remember the outstanding women pioneers of the institution. The event, organized on the 11th of March, three days after the official day, saw the active participation of the students from the Medical, Nursing and Allied Health streams, as well as the faculty from various departments. Rev.Dr. Arul Dhas, Chaplain offered the opening prayer and Mr. Richard Samuel organizer of the event welcomed the gathering

The Chief Guest for the occasion was Dr. Annamma Abraham, retired faculty and psychologist and the other eminent speakers invited were Dr. Anna B. Pulimood, Principal and Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean of the College of Nursing.



Dr. Anna Pulimood pointed out CMC's distinction as an institution where women have always been awarded equal pay and equal opportunities for growth. She also spoke with obvious pride of the yesteryear women leaders - almost all of them from a mission background - who gave their all to the institution. She recounted, among others, the moving story of Dr. Gwenda Lewis, who contracted polio by giving mouth-to-mouth resuscitation to a polio patient who had arrested in theatre. Despite this experience that would have proved to be a death sentence for the career of many a medical practitioner, Dr. Lewis went abroad for rehabilitation and came back to serve the poor here.

Dr. Vathsala Sadan spoke about this year's theme for Women's Day and the significance of the colour purple for the day. She recalled the outstanding leaders in nursing like Vera Pitman, Florence Taylor, Delia Houghton, Pauline King and Aleyamma Kuruvilla and their invaluable contributions to the institution, which for many years, had focused its training efforts solely on nursing.


The programme started with a talk on the theme, 'Balance for better empowerment'.

The first stem cell transplant in CMC was done in 1986 by Padmashri Dr. Mammen Chandy. Paul.

The round table discussion which followed was a major feature of the symposium. The topic was "*Photon vs.*" **Proton vs. Carbon-ion: Which is Best for India?"** featuring six eminent panelists from Radiation Oncology and Medical Physics, who comprehensively brought out the pros and cons of each technology in the Indian context.

The symposium concluded with a poster competition and a quiz competition conducted by Dr. Paul Ravindran, Professor of Radiation Physics.

he Department of Nephrology celebrated World Kidney Day on 14th March, 2019 creating a public awareness and screening programme at the hospital campus. The theme for this year's celebration was "Kidney Health for Everyone, Everywhere". The Chief Guest for the event Dr.V. Tamilarasi, Professor and former Head of the Department of Nephrology, who in her address spoke of the significance of such an event in preventing kidney disease and promoting kidney health. Following which felicitations were offered by Rev. Lalbiak Sanga, Chaplain, Dr. Prasad Mathews, Medical Superintendent, Dr. Premila Lee, Nursing Superintendent, Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean, College of Nursing, Dr. Priya Abraham, Associate Director, Dr. Santosh Varughese, Head, Nephrology Department and Dr. Indira Agarwal, Head of Paediatric Nephrology.

State Level Workshop on 'Recent Trends and Advancements in Genito-Urological Nursing'

The Department of Medical Surgical Nursing Specialty-I and CNE & Research, College of Nursing organized a state level workshop on 'Recent Trends and Advancements in Genito-Urological Nursing' on March 27th, 2019. There were fifty participants from nine different institutions. The workshop was awarded six credit hours by the Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council.

The major objective of the workshop was to enhance the competencies of nurses in caring for patients with genito-urological disorders and diseases with respect to the recent trends and advancements.



The participants gained hands on training in Ileal conduit care, care of urinary drainages, bladder wash / irrigation, self-testicular examination, urethral dilation and intermittent catheterization through the skill stations.

Events from the Department of Clinical Virology



The Department of Clinical Virology has accomplished yet another achievement by obtaining the accreditation from National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) as a **Proficiency Testing (PT) provider** in accordance with **ISO/IEC 17043:2010.**

Participation in a PT (EQAS) program has become an integral part of the diagnostic laboratory activities as it improves the technical competency and confidence in providing quality report to the patients. The Department of Clinical Virology started the Virology PT(CMCVIROEQAS) programmes for the first time in India in the year 2017 with the aim of enhancing the quality of the virology assays in laboratories across the country under the aegis of Indian Association of

Medical Microbiologists (IAMM) and the Department of Clinical Microbiology.

What is the CMCVIROEQAS PT programme?

This programme has two different parameters namely serological and molecular. There are 3 surveys for all serological panels and 2 surveys for molecular panels with 12 and 4 annual challenges respectively. The serology parameters include markers for BBVS, Dengue, Acute Hepatitis and HBV serology. The molecular parameters include quantitative estimation of HIV-1 RNA, HBV DNA, HCV RNA and CMV DNA. Currently there are about 580 laboratories participating in the serology panels and 40 laboratories in the molecular panels from across India.

The department obtained the accreditation for the routine diagnostic services with NABL in 2011 in accordance with ISO 15189:2012, and has one of the few state-of-the-art Virology laboratories associated with a medical college having the largest repertoires of assays offered.

This achievement was obtained by the whole hearted co-operation of all the staff from the department and support of the administration.

The First Master Class in Paediatric Neurology

The Department of Neurological Sciences organised the 'First Master Class in Paediatric Neurology' under the aegis of the Indian Academy of Neurology (IAN), Paediatric Neurology subsection on April 5th and 6th in the New Examination Hall, Bagayam. This was special as it was the first academic event conducted by this body for the post graduates in Neurology. Currently, most childhood neurological disorders, in the country are attended to by

paediatricians and adult neurologists. The response was overwhelming with nearly two hundred delegates, 2

comprising paediatricians, neurologists and post graduates in these fields. The academic sessions were robust and interactive with two international and twenty one national faculty. The faculty included Paediatric Neurologists from all major institutes and from related specialties. The two day event ended with a well conducted quiz. The inaugural function was attended by Dr. J.V. Peter, Director, Dr. Anna Pulimood, Principal and Dr. Paul M.J., Associate Medical Superintendent along with Dr. Sanjeev Thomas, past president of the IAN, Dr. Vrajesh Udani (Mumbai) and Dr. K.P. The subsection sincerely hopes this will set the trend for more to get interested in the field of Paediatric Neurology and offer the best available services.

Dr. Gagandeep Kang becomes the first Indian woman to be elected Royal Society Fellow



agandeep Kang, Professor and The Laboratory Director of the Wellcome Trust Research Laboratory, Division of Gastrointestinal Sciences, on sabbatical as Executive Director, Translational Health Science and Technology Institute, An Autonomous Institute of the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India, New Delhi, has become the first Indian woman scientist to be elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society (FRS) in 360 years.

Professor Kang has built a strong inter-disciplinary research programme that uses careful and detailed field epidemiology with molecular tools for characterization of infectious agents and host response to infection to understand and change factors that affect transmission, development and prevention of enteric infections and their sequelae. Observational, interventional and mechanistic studies on enteric infection and nutrition have demonstrated the complex relationships between gut function and physical and cognitive development. She has established a strong training program for students and young faculty in clinical translational medicine aiming to build a cadre of clinical researchers studying relevant problems in India.

The Royal Society is a Fellowship of many of the world's most eminent scientists and is the oldest scientific academy in continuous existence. The society has included many leading scientists over the past four centuries including Albert Einstein and Stephen Hawking.

Nobel laureate Venki Ramakrishnan. who is the president of the Royal Society, responded to the appointment of its new members in a Tweet "Over the course of the Royal Society's vast history, it is our Fellowship that has remained a constant thread and the substance from which our purpose has been realized: to use science for the benefit of humanity,"

Obituaries



• **Dr. Ernest Lall** (batch of 1949) on March 13, 2019. Dr. Lall was in the last batch of Pakistani students whom CMC admitted in the first three years after Independence. He came from a third generation Christian family in Sialkot. **In the citation to the Paul Harrison Award of 1984,** CMC described their work thus: "[Drs. Ernest and Pramila Lall] took over the Christian Hospital in Taxila in Pakistan, on the verge of closing down. They have built it up into a stable, large general hospital which,

at peak season, serves as many as 1000 inpatients. Employing no more than 100 staff members and utilizing a judicious combination of high technology and common sense barefoot approach, they have evolved a unique hospital where the standard charge is only Rs.120 for eye operations or Rs.200 for general surgery. Every employee is well paid, helped to acquire their own houses and is given free education for their children up to the university level." The work of the hospital had been honoured by their country with the Presidential Award in 2002 and the Nazriya Pakistan Council Award in 2010, the only Christians to be so honoured in Pakistan. But their precariousness of their situation was brought home when, in 2012, Islamic militants attacked the hospital chapel on a Sunday, killing three staff members and injuring 23. The following excerpts from his obituary in the National News Pakistan provide a window into what Dr. Lall meant to the beleaguered Christians in Pakistan: "Dr. Lall was the first Executive Secretary of the autonomous Presbyterian Church of Pakistan. He was instrumental in the creation of the Christian Hospital Association of Pakistan, the first cooperative body of Protestant and Catholic churches. He was a founder member of the Presbyterian Medical Board, founder member of Dar-ul-Hikmat, founder member of the Society for Cooperative Development and a Board Member of Gordon College Rawalpindi, Christian Hospital Quetta and Christian Hospital, Tank." Dr. Pramila Lall is "back at work in the Eye Department, seeing over 60 patients a day, six days a week." Proficiency testing by the Department of Clinical Microbiology

The Department of Clinical Microbiology began as a national EQAS provider in 1993 till 2006. Owing to the increase in the number of the participating laboratories, the service split into a North and South EQAS Zone. Since October 2016, the department has been the EQAS providers. From 2014 with the NABL accreditation, and now as the newly accredited **Proficiency Testing (PT) provider** in accordance with ISO / IEC 17043:2010, the department has been tremendous in its growth. This accreditation was awarded on 27th December 2018. Over the last two years the service has expanded into a multi-tiered programme with 801 participating laboratories.

The objective is to validate and strengthen the competency of the participating centres in India and in the neighbouring countries, to ensure standardized microbiology diagnostic capability.

(IAMM EQAS programme)

The Tier 1 EQAS program for the diagnostic laboratory assesses the diagnostic competency in bacteriology smear reporting, identification of organisms from culture and susceptibility testing along with infectious disease serology testing. It consists of 27 challenges per year.

The advanced Tier 2 EQAS programme for the diagnostic cum research laboratories validates the competency in molecular identification of bacterial pathogens causing meningitis and respiratory infections and the molecular detection of antimicrobial resistance genes of diagnostic importance: namely, Extended spectrum beta-lactamases (ESBL): (SHV, TEM, VEB, PER), Amp –C (MOX, CIT, DHA, ACC, EBC, FOX), CTX-M (ESBL): (CTX-M1, CTX-M2, CTX-M8, CTX-M9, CTX-M25) and Carbapenemases: (VIM, NDM, KPC, OXA-48, GES, SPM.This advanced program consists of 3 challenges twice yearly.

(ICMR-AMR EQAS)

In addition, the department is also the PT provider for the EQAS program for Antimicrobial Resistance Mechanisms detection by phenotypic and molecular methods, which is supported by Global Health Security Agenda (GHSA) and Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR). At present, this highly advanced EQAS programme is being conducted for 12 large tertiary care centers across India, with additional sites to be included this year. To ensure quality and validated competency of our department, we participate and excel in the north zone IAMM-Bacterial EQAS, UKN-EQAS for vaccine preventable invasive bacterial agents. WHO-GFN-EQAS-Denmark for Enteric pathogens, GASP EQAS-Australia for Sexually transmitted infections, Mycobacteria RNTCP EQAS and INSTAND-QA for Mycobacteria detection, identification and susceptibility testing, UKN-EQAS and EUROIMMUNE EQAS- UK for auto-immune serology and the Medical Mycology EQAS-Chandigarh for fungal pathogen identification and susceptibility test.

Dr. Anu Bose joined the Community Health Department as an academic general paediatrician in 1997, and has been there ever since. During her period in the department, she developed the low cost nursery, initiated the high risk paediatric clinic and trained numerous postgraduate students and interns. She retires as a Professor of Paediatrics.

Beyond the clinical work, Dr. Anu has been actively involved in academic and research work of the Department of Community Health. Her work focused on the four leading causes of infant and childhood mortality, namely - neonatal, vaccines and vaccine preventable diseases,

malnutrition and injury. Dr. Anu Bose was introduced early to the field of injury prevention and has since worked on drowning and suicide in India and on the burden of road traffic injury. Her most cited work is on adolescent suicides, where she and her co-authors reported the highest rate of teen suicides in the world. She is the Course Director of the Advanced Vaccinology Course in India (INDVAC), which has been conducted annually since 2010, at Christian Medical College, Vellore.

Dr. Anu is known for her personality which instilled admiration and at the same time demanded the best care for our patients. She was a true community paediatrician who moulded treatment and care required for a child into one that was most cost effective and as hassle free for the parents as possible. Her witty comments throughout her teaching sessions made them extremely enjoyable and memorable. Outside the walls of the hospital,

Making a Difference - Chinchpada Christian Hospital

JUNE 10, 2019

A day at Chinchpada Christian Hospital



A young man who said he was 19 years of age but looking much younger -and at once much older-staggered into the hospital few weeks ago. He was emaciated, wearing ragged, dirty clothes that were too big for him. His face was pale and gaunt, and he was so frail that he could barely stand. Strangely, there was no one with him and he had no bag of belongings that he had brought along. Just a piece of paper. As we helped him to a bed looking over his shoulder for whoever might have come with him, he clarified that he was alone. He had travelled five hours on a bus from his far away village with not a rupee on him, pleading with the bus conductors of the two buses he took, not to throw him out even though he didn't have money for a ticket because he desperately needed to get to Chinchpada Hospital. Someone in his village who had seen his plight had written down the name of the hospital and said, "Go to this hospital. They helped me get well for very little money. Poor people are treated well there. They will take care of you."

He had been quite ill for a few months. He lived with his father, who had taken a second wife after his own mother left them for another man years ago. She had never again made contact with him. He has two younger sisters, one of whom was recently married and had left home. The other was working as a labourer in the fields, earning her keep and studying in class 9, living with her maternal grandmother in another village. He had mostly had to fend for himself over the years as a child. His father, quite a poor man himself, would reluctantly pay the school fees and buy his books, but lately had stopped doing even that. Living with his step mother became increasingly difficult. He tried to seek help from his uncle who agreed to let him stay, but not provide any other support. But he longed to study and learn. So he began to work in a hotel in the village centre, washing dishes and cleaning, so that he could earn enough to buy his books and continue to study. He struggled to cope with work with his progressively failing health although he came very close to taking his class 10 exam but didn't manage as he could no longer work from exhaustion, and he had no money for the fee. He was bitterly disappointed. His uncle, seeing that he was ill, took him back to his father's house, saying he could not support him any longer. His father refused to take him to a doctor, so he went on his own. He was found to have insulin requiring Diabetes, and was started on insulin. He had to beg his father for money to buy the insulin each time, as the government hospital did not have it in stock. His father would intermittently give him money, but never accompanied him to the doctor. Eventually, his father stopped supporting his treatment altogether. He went back to his uncle and his grandmother asking for help, but they refused. This is when he met the kind man in his village who gave him the address of Chinchpada Christian hospital. Without a word to anyone, he clutched that piece of paper and got on the long bus journey.



He was severely dehydrated on first assessment, with a thready pulse and a barely recordable blood pressure. His blood sugar levels were over 600mg/dl as he had been off insulin for many days. His limbs were pitifully thin; weak from Diabetic neuropathy; and swollen from malnutrition, and possibly from renal involvement from the poorly controlled Diabetes. You could count every rib, and it took all of his energy to

give us a brief initial history. He had a borderline oxygen saturation, and needed some oxygen. We marvelled at how he had managed that bus journey on his own in such a state. He was shifted to the ICU and started on an insulin infusion, rehydration, and supportive management.

As he related the rest of his story in a relatively flat, emotion-less tone once he began to improve, we listened in growing horror at the extent of apathy that we human beings are capable of. The only time there seemed to be a hint of emotion was when he said repeatedly after every few sentences with pleading eyes: "when you get me well, I will stay here with you.



I will work very hard...please don't send me away." When we asked for a way to contact any of his family, he said again in that flat voice, "It won't make any difference. No one cares whether I live or die."

We all stood speechless by his bedside, trying to look busy with examining him and studying his chart as we exchanged glances, each one fighting back tears as we tried to make sense of this unbelievably broken world that Ajay (name changed) inhabited...that we all co-inhabit with Ajay. Is it really the same world? How come the rest of us are so unfairly blessed?

We had sung at devotion that morning: "jaisey maataa sambhaalti hai, waisey Yeshu sambhalegaa... kabhi bhi na chodeygaa, kabhi bhi na tyageygaa..." (As a mother cares for her child, so Jesus will care for you. He will never leave you nor forsake you..)

I thought wryly to myself, what an insult actually, for Jesus to compare his perfect, unconditional, self giving love with the fallen love of Ajay's mother and father who had completely forsaken him! Yet he allows that comparison for us to be able to understand his heart just a little...what a gracious God!

Over the ensuing day Ajay regained some strength and we marvelled at his voracious appetite for the simple but nutritious Diabetic food that was cooked in our canteen for him. He began to smile just a little. He even picked up the courage to ask if he could have some tender coconut water (which was rapidly procured from the market.) He was given a scrub bath with warm water, soap and shampoo, after which he looked quite a different colour from when he had arrived. His long nails were cut and his even longer hair oiled after the shampoo, despite which they refused to settle down on his scalp. He was dressed in the first set of new clothes he ever had from since he could remember...

We told him of Jesus, the Son of God who loves him...this God who came down from the splendour of heaven to earth, and suffered every bit of the pain, rejection and loneliness that Ajay himself had been through. He suffered all this on the cross so that Ajay might have Life...and he rose from death, conquering it so that death itself was swallowed up by Life!

Unbelievably for us again, he said, "I believe..." He had had Christian teachers in his school who had told him of Jesus! His family, he said, worshipped "shaitaan" (we didn't ask for further clarifications!), but he knew that followers of this Jesus would care for him, and this was the confidence with which he had come all the way to Chinchpada. We marvelled yet again...

how was it possible for this child after the utter depravity and rejection that he had experienced most of his life, to comprehend and grasp so easily the love of the Heavenly Father? Why is it so much harder for those of us who live in comfort?

We are unsure of what the future holds for Ajay...all the odds for a long and care-free life here on earth are against him..but we have more than a sneaking feeling that Resurrection Power is at work in him..and his heavenly Father has all of eternity to make it up to him. Hallelujah!

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).

World Asthma Day is observed on the first Tuesday of the month of May, every year. The focus of this observation is to increase awareness of this condition among the people and to reiterate the fact that it can be kept under control with regular inhaled corticosteroids.

Asthma cannot be cured but can be kept under control if it is diagnosed correctly and treated appropriately. It is a chronic inflammatory disease of the airways which occurs when the inflamed airways encounter allergens and irritants such as house dust, pollens, fungi, smoke, cold air and so on. These will lead to

bonchoconstriction which causes symptoms like cough, breathing difficulty and chest tightness.

Asthma has affected about 30 crore people all over the world. In India, approximately 10% of the population has asthma, which is about 13 crore people. Most often the neglect and misconceptions regarding asthma comes from the social stigma it carries regarding the usage of inhaled medications.


If not diagnosed early and treated appropriately, asthma can lead to various complications:

- » Exacerbations of asthma: This occurs due to respiratory infections or exposure to a heavy load of substances to which the patient is allergic. This might need an emergency visit to the hospital and a subsequent admission. In rare circumstances, a delay in medical attention can even lead to death.
- » Poor response to treatment: Formation of scar tissue in the airways can lead to a disease which is very similar to COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease a disease that is seen most commonly in smokers). This leads to poor quality of life and ultimately results in respiratory failure.

One of the major steps in avoiding these complications and improving the patient's quality of life is the use of inhaled corticosteroid. It is important for asthma to be taken seriously and to create awareness the Department of Pulmonary Medicine, conducted an asthma awareness camp on 7th May, 2019. A total of 202 patients with respiratory symptoms attended the camp and Spirometry test were conducted for 131 patients. Around 97 patients were newly diagnosed to have asthma.



This initiative was coordinated by Dr. Jebin Roger S, Assistant professor in the Department of Pulmonary Medicine under the supervision of the head of the Department, Pulmonary Medicine, Dr. D.J. Christopher. The event began with a prayer by the chaplain followed by a welcome speech by Dr.D.J.Christopher. The significance of the event was put into perspective by Dr. Jebin Roger S. and the camp was declared open by Dr. Prasad Mathews, Medical Superintendent.

Dr. D. Joyson Soundrarajan, Selection Grade Senior Librarian and Head of Library Services, retired on 2nd June, 2019 after 36 years of exemplary service to the institution. When he joined CMC in the year 1983, he was already well versed in Index Medicus, a Bio-medical database which proceeded the days when computers and internet were present at the library. Later on, he became an expert in Medline search, especially in the biomedical literature databases of the National Library of Medicine to retrieve bibliographical information of journal articles with abstracts.

Dr. Mathew Alexander Retires



Dr. Mathew Alexander. Professor and former Head of the Department of Neurology and Neurological Sciences, retired on 3rd June 2019 after nearly 27 years of dedicated service to the institution.

Professor Alexander (MA) is widely regarded as one of the most dynamic, astute clinical neurologists and inspirational teachers both nationally and internationally. This is attributable to his immense passion for Neurology, genuine concern for patient wellbeing and student growth with an ability to give constructive feedback. Professor MA always strived for clinical excellence in terms of exemplary assessment, diagnostic and treatment skills, all this uniquely combined with compassion and empathy. His 'never say die' attitude has often translated into 'medical miracles' with respect to patient outcomes. His commitment to clinical excellence has helped enhance the reputation of the department and institution as a center for providing care especially for the most challenging cases.

Professor MA completed his undergraduate training from Trivandrum Medical College in 1982. He subsequently did his postgraduate training in General Medicine from Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore in 1987. He is a renowned alumnus of Sri Chitra Thirunal Institute of Medical Sciences and Technology, Thiruvananthapuram, an Institute of National Importance, where he completed his three-year DM (Neurology) in 1992. He had a brilliant academic career and subsequently joined the Department of Neurological Sciences at CMC Vellore in 1992. He did his subspeciality fellowship training in "Neuromuscular Disorders and Clinical Electromyography" at the prestigious Montreal Neurological Institute, Canada in 1999 to 2001. He also did fellowships with the Electromyography division at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, Baltimore and Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston. His main areas of interest include Neuromuscular Disorders, Clinical Electromyography, Neuroimmunology and Tropical Neurology.

Professor MA has always emphasized the need for providing technical expertise at affordable cost while building a state of the art Neurology division. During his tenure, the faculty strength went from 2 in November 2006, to 13 in November 2018 when he went for his terminal sabbatical leave. This includes three faculty members in Paediatric Neurology. Under his leadership, various subspecialities including Epilepsy, Paediatric Stroke, Neurology, Cognitive Neurology, Neurometabolic and Neuromuscular disorders have developed with support from PMR, Medical Genetics, Medicine, Child Health and Bioengineering Departments.

When the department has a period of crisis in 2007-2008 and the seats were reduced from two seats to one, Professor MA was instrumental in preventing this disaster. He has been an exceptional teacher and mentor for several generations of residents from the length and breadth of the country. All of them now are currently well reputed and settled in various parts of the country and abroad. He set the standards for work ethic for his students and colleagues. The 'MA grand-rounds', and the rounds on a motorized wheelchair during his brief period of disability will remain engraved in everyone's memory.

The Clinical Neurophysiology Lab has become one of the most comprehensive of its kind with Single Fiber EMG, multichannel surface EMG, Quantitative Autonomic Function Testing and Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation. Professor MA started a new degree program under The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, the B.Sc. in Neuro Electrophysiology in 2012. He subsequently initiated the Faculty Improvement programme for the existing Neurotechnologists from Diploma to Degree ultimately leading to the vision of Allied Health Teaching faculty.

At the Institutional level, Professor MA has been part of the Executive Committee and Council and has helped the administration on important issues including salary increase, planning of new campus development at Kannigapuram, facilitating extension of retirement age, MCI approval for various courses and engaging with the private sector for CSR funds.

At the National and International level, Professor MA has been Convenor of the Clinical Neurophysiology subsection of the Indian Academy of Neurology (IAN) since 2016 and is the National Delegate to the International Federation of Clinical Neurophysiology. He has been the convener for Clinical Neurophysiology Symposia in International Conferences. He organized a landmark meeting, the first national IAN – EMG Workshop at Vellore in 2014. He was the co-organizer for the prestigious "Asia-Oceanian Congress of Clinical Neurophysiology" in Bengaluru in 2017. He is a renowned and much sought after speaker at international and national conferences and a reviewer for several medical journals. He was the co-chair on the national committee of the IAN for drafting treatment guidelines. He has been a visiting faculty at international centers of repute including Mayo Clinic (Rochester), Wayne School of Medicine (Detroit), Case Western Medical University (Cleveland) and McGill University (Montreal). He has several DBT, ICMR funded projects and research articles in internationally acclaimed journals. He is currently in National Neurosciences Center at Brunei, and part of an international group which will help build Neurology services in lesser privileged countries.



A total 113 of patients with smoking and related respiratory disease were assessed and Spirometry (lung function test) was done on 70 smokers. They were shown how smoking affects the lungs, blood vessels and nervous system leading to various problems from myocardial



infarction (heart attack) to sexual dysfunction. The current Indian statistics do not truly reflect the extent to which smoking has destroyed the society. Misinformation of not identifying smoking as a disease has led to various misconceptions which state that quitting can be harmful. With proper medical assistance and scientifically proven non pharmacological and pharmacological methods, quitting smoking has become a reality. The withdrawal symptoms can be controlled with proper medical advice. CMC provides good nicotine dependence and counseling with medical aid in the Smoking Cessation Clinic.



An overview of the health care scenario in India

The health care scenario in India has not seen a positive growth in the recent years. The deplorable and alarming decline in the quality of health care is indeed a fact which required serious probing. Amidst this bleak situation, there are certain hospitals-AIIMS-Delhi and Christian **Medical College Vellore** (CMC-Vellore), which



have taken on this burden even though they are insufficiently staffed and tight for resources.



Vellore (CMC-Vellore), with Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, Los Angeles and St. Thomas's Hospital, UK shows that the Indian hospitals tend to a lot more patients at a fraction of the cost than the ones abroad. Both AIIMS-Delhi and CMC-Vellore treated more than two million outpatients in 2017-18. A lot of the patients who come to hospitals such as AIIMS-Delhi and CMC-Vellore are from far-off places. Forty-six per cent of all inpatient admissions at CMC-Vellore were from outside Tamil Nadu in 2017-18.

Hospitals such as AIIMS-Delhi and CMC-Vellore also handle a lot more students at subsidised rates than their western counterparts and they tend to a lot more patients and students than their western peers at a fraction of the money spent by the latter. A comparison

of purchasing power parity (PPP) adjusted expenses per patient and per bed proves this point. These numbers suggest that even top-notch medical institutions in India might be working under a much bigger squeeze than their international counterparts.

Know your Department-Gynaecologic Oncology

JULY 22, 2019



The Beginings:

Before the Gynaecologic Oncology unit came into being, gynaecological cancers were treated by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology for several decades.

- In 1996 the Reproductive Medicine Unit separated and began to function on its own. He remaining three units retained their status quo.
- Dr. Paranjothy was interested in trophoblastic tumours and many of the stalwarts of yesteryears were well versed in radical hysterectomy for cervical cancer.
- Dr. Lakshmi Seshadri had training in colposcopy in Sydney and Dr. Alice George worked with Prof Margret Davies in Adelaide.
- The department decided on sub-specialisation and Dr. Abraham Peedicayil went to the Mayo Clinic to do a fellowship in gynaecologic oncology from 2008 to 2011.
- In 2010, the three general units were re-organised in to five functional units. Thus OG Unit-I was designated as the gynaecologic oncology unit and all women's cancers were referred to this unit headed by Prof Alice George. Prof Lakshmi Seshadri moved in to this unit along with Drs Rachel Chandy and Anitha Thomas. Dr. Abraham Peedicayil joined this unit on his return and took over the headship. After Drs Alice and Lakshmi retired, Drs Vinotha Thomas and Ajit Sebastian also joined as junior faculty.
- In 2013, the department started a 2-year institutional gynaecologic oncology fellowship with Dr. Rachel and Dr. Anitha as the first batch of fellows. This programme was upgraded to a University Fellowship in January 2015 with Dr. Ajit Sebastian and Dr. Dhanya Thomas as the fellows.
- In 2015, in order to start the M.Ch course the unit separated off to become a full-fledged department.
- In 2016, The 3-year M.Ch course was started with Dr. Anitha Thomas and Dr. PriyaBhati as the first batch of MCh trainees.

How does the Department function?

The department works in close collaboration with the Departments of Medical Oncology, Radiation Oncology, Radiology, Pathology and Palliative Care. A weekly multidisciplinary meeting is held to discuss difficult cases, plan treatments and review the biopsy reports. Quite often intra-operative consultations are sought from colorectal

surgery, urology, vascular surgery and plastic surgery so that complex operations can be undertaken to remove all gross tumour. The department has kept up with the advancements of technology with endoscopy, sentinel node mapping and hyperthermic intraperitoneal chemotherapy.

The department organises regular home visits, which keeps a check on the patients who default treatment. The designated social worker assists in mobilising finances, psychosexual counselling and scheduling hospital visits and the oncology nurse takes care of wound care, stoma care and patient follow up. Both the social worker and the nurse, assists in after life care too.



Cancer Screening Clinic:

This clinic emphasises the importance of early detection as well as primary prevention. The clinic aims to work in close collaboration with community health departments (CHAD, RUHSA), Family Medicine and Community Nursing.

Survivor Meet:

Every year, the department organises a survivor meet where cancer patients with their spouses are invited for a time of sharing, education and celebration. This meet provides holistic care and upholds the integrity and personhood of the patient.



Academic Activities:

Scientific publications, CME's, workshops and national conferences are frequent activities which are organised by the department. The faculty and trainees are encouraged to attend workshops and conferences for their career growth as well as dissemination of the work done at Vellore. Cancer care is expensive and research in to cost-effective approaches, less morbid treatments and personalised medicine need to be kept in mind.

Advancements for the future:

Robotic surgery has been an unfulfilled dream. In the future, the department hopes to expand and consolidate its clinical services, improve patient follow up, be involved in cancer research and be a part of a larger cancer centre in one of the new campuses of CMC.

Workshop on HIV update

The Department of Infectious Diseases and Transfusion Medicine conducted a work shop on 'HIV Infection - An Update' from 20th to 22nd June 2019. There were twenty five participants from private and government sectors all over India. The workshop was inaugurated with a word of prayer and introduction to the workshop by Dr. Joy Mammen, Professor and Head, Department of Transfusion Medicine followed by welcome speech by Dr. Priscilla Rupali, Professor, Department of Infectious Diseases.



The focus of the workshop was to develop and improve competency in managing HIV patients. The initial session was on "Changing HIV Epidemiology in India" by Dr.O.C. Abraham followed by sessions on case based approach to various opportunistic Infections, HIV prevention and management dealt by various faculties from CMC. Dr. Joy Mammen led a session on "Strategies for Safe Blood Transfusion", highlighting the need for promoting voluntary blood donation in minimising the risk for transfusion related infections.

Apart from the lectures the participants had the opportunity to visit the virology lab and learn about various diagnostics in making quick diagnosis and monitoring HIV therapy. The concluding session was an impressive talk given by Dr. Anand Zachariah about the "History of AIDS in India, and Development of HIV Care in Vellore; Lessons for Future" where he outlined the proactive role of CMC in treating HIV patients during the initial epidemic and assisting government in evolving various HIV care policies. In the last day, the participants also visited the CMC NACO antiretroviral therapy centre and learnt about the working pattern and programmatic management of HIV care. CMC Provides: Expanding the Footprint

Receiving the gift of hearing: The story of two brothers

Born two years apart, Hasan and Ayan aged 5 and 3 years respectively belong to a poverty stricken family in Bihar. Their parents Mrs. and Mr. Babudin Ansar, began to notice that both the little brothers were not responding to noise and were showing signs of delayed speech at the age of 8 to 9 months.

Difficult financial conditions and an opportunity to work as a daily wage labourer relocated the family to Bangalore. The father, now, manages to earn Rs 15000, per month, which is a meagre sum, for a family of five staying in a rented house.

The condition of the children did not show improvement, they still failed to respond to any auditory stimuli. The parents took them for an evaluation in Bangalore and the boys were diagnosed with bilateral profound hearing loss. Their only resort to gain hearing will be Cochlear implants.

Cochlear implants can amount up to 7.8 to 15 lakhs. They were able to raise one or two lakhs through the Bihar Chief Minister Scheme. With no source for money and the boys getting older slowly, the family rushed to CMC, as their last resort. Little did they know, that all their problems were going to be solved, here within the humble walls of CMC.



It was 2017, the time when CMC, got charted under the TN's CM Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme for Cochlear implant. This liaison enabled the Department of ENT to help 40 children thus far; full charges covered. Around the same timeline, the Graeme Clark **Foundation** from Melbourne, Australia, announced to provide 12000 AUD (nearly six lakhs), for implanting one deserving child with profound hearing loss. Graeme Clark Foundation is a charity organisation named to honour Professor Graeme Clark who was the Chair of Otolaryngology at the University of Melbourne. He had led the group that worked for nearly thirty years in developing the first multi channel Cochlear implant in the world. They were able to raise enough money for two Cochlear implants, which came to around Rs.16.5 lakhs. The Foundation specially acknowledges the Simone Jeha family for their contribution.

He had been grappling with Multiple Myeloma for over ten years and passed away peacefully in the Owen Sound Hospital, Ontario, Canada at the age of 83. As a student, he was noted for a mischievous but innocuous sense of humour, his casual mastery of examinations and assignments and a robust sense of independence. As preparation for a career in surgery, he worked as a demonstrator in Anatomy at CMC for one year. He then proceeded to the UK and won

Report on the 4th Certificate Course in Hospital **Infection Control and Antimicrobial Stewardship**



rganised by the Hospital Infection Control Committee of CMC, the 4th Certificate course on Hospital Infection Control and Antimicrobial Stewardship took place from 29th July to 2nd August 2019. The aim of this course was to train microbiologists, clinicians and administrators, involved in infection control programmes in their respective institutions.

The Tamil Nadu MGR University awarded 30 credit points for this course. There were twenty nine candidates from Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, Kerala, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Assam, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh, Chattisgarh, Rajasthan and United Arab Emirates. CME on Paediatric Dermatology organised




The Department of Dermatology, Venerology and Leprosy Unit - I conducted a CME on Paediatric Dermatology on 19th and 20th July, 2019 with a special focus on genodermatoses. Paediatric Dermatology, a relatively new subspecialty is designed to improve the approach and management of the ever growing cutaneous disorders in children which need multispecialty intervention. The CME attracted two hundred and sixty delegates representing more than forty five

medical colleges from various parts of the country including all states of south India, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand and even from the neighbouring country of Nepal. The CME was live telecasted to ten mission hospitals and fifteen alumni. It was accredited with twenty CME points by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The speakers included, eminent faculty from CMC, PGIMER Chandigarh and St John's hospital, Bangalore along with international faculty Professor Celia Moss OBE, Consultant Dermatologist, Birmingham Children's Hospital and Dr. Ravi Gutta, an American Board certified Consultant in Allergy and Immunology with fellowship from Cleveland clinic USA; currently working in Mediclinic City Hospital, Dubai, UAE. Dr. Helen Samuel (1994)was honored with the College Motto Award (in absentia) for her life of \(\frac{a}{2}\) faith and commitment, effectively translated to one of service in the $\stackrel{\circ}{\simeq}$ spirit of our alma mater. Dr. Mammen Chandy (1969) who

was awarded the Padma Shri earlier this year was felicitated. This was followed by the informal entertainment, which had the packed Scudder auditorium in splits of laughter. The alumni left with loads of photographs and memories of happy times spent in Vellore.

College Motto award citation:

Dr. Helen Samuel joined CMC Vellore for her MBBS training in 1994 as the Government of India candidate from Andaman & Nicobar Islands. While classes typically began in July of each year, Helen joined the rest of her batch mates in September and found herself having to play "catch-up". She was very quiet, maybe even shy but always had a smile on her face.

After she completed her MBBS, Helen went back to the islands and joined the Directorate of Health Services in October 2001. Her first posting in the Government service was at the



Primary Health Centre in Hutbay, Little Andaman. This PHC is in the capital of Little Andaman, and it takes 6-8 hours by ship to reach Port Blair from this location. The PHC is a 35-bedded facility with a daily OPD attendance of 180-200 patients, provides basic laboratory and imaging facilities and caters to a population of 15,000 people. As a young doctor called to serve in a remote area, Helen knew that she had her work cut out for her and soon realised that her training in CMC was coming in handy all the time! After the Tsunami hit in December 2004, the islands were devastated, and the losses were enormous. Helen was involved in rebuilding and restoring the PHC that was razed to the ground. It took several months to get the medical centre up and running.

"We all lost so many loved ones.... None of our houses survived the Tsunami, so I could relate to the peoples' state of mind", said Helen as she chatted with a friend. Helen served at the Hutbay PHC for 14 years and was the only doctor in the PHC for 8 of those 14 years. This meant having to be available for 24 hours a day, seven days a week and missing out on several family events, sacrificing sleep, food and even church time. As part of her medical care, Helen took care of an indigenous tribe called the 'Onge' people, having to cross a creek full of crocodiles and then out in the open seas for 20-30 minutes to reach their homes. This seemed doable when the weather was fair but during the rains and thunderstorms - "I still have nightmares", says Helen. She is so thankful to God Almighty for keeping her team and herself safe during those stormy days. Helen received the Lieutenant General Commendation in 2010 for her work in this medical centre. Her work with Hansens' disease patients in the area led to another award for 'Best Doctor - National Programmes for Elimination of Leprosy' as she detected and treated the most number of patients in the area. These awards were the least of her priorities.

In 2015, Helen was transferred to Campbell Bay, Great Nicobar, where she was able to change clinical practice in several areas, particularly in Obstetrics care. She was able to change the norm of all antenatal care being referred to Port Blair and trained her team to provide the same care in their PHC. She organised Family Planning camps every year, the beneficiaries ranging from 50-200 people each year. Through the years, she has been unable to leave her PHC even for short periods. She says "the internship in CMC helped me to be ready for this". Apart from her rigorous clinical work, Helen is an administrator and leader; these roles come with their additional responsibilities. She has been responsible for all the clinical services, administrative work, drawing and disbursing for 2 PHCs and ten sub-centres. The local aviation services provide helicopters to get across islands and depending on the distance between the islands and refuelling services; these choppers can take 3-9 passengers on a flight. The tickets for these helicopter rides are issued on the previous day, and it is not easy to get a ticket, especially for a patient in dire need of higher medical care. Helen fought the system and was responsible for ensuring that two air tickets were ear-marked for patients when the helicopter services started in 2007/08. This was an uphill task, but in the end, it all worked out in the best interest of the patients who were in need.

For the past 20 years, Helen has been working tirelessly to serve the people of the islands; her work has dramatically blessed the local people and the government. Helen has numerous challenging and inspiring stories, many of which blessed the local people and the government. Helen has numerous challenging and inspiring stories, many of which seem impossible for a single person to have managed, but she attributes it to God above and her Alma Mater. She says after the training she received in CMC; she cannot think of any other way to practice! Helen Samuel has demonstrated the true meaning of our motto, "Not to be ministered unto, but to minister", by her selfless work in a needy part of India. Her life is an inspiration to all the young graduates of the Christian Medical College who want to fulfill the vision of Aunt Ida. The CMC Alumni Association is proud to present the College Motto

Alumni Award citation:

Mrs. Anu Mammen came to Vellore after her marriage to Dr. Mammen Chandy in 1974, having studied in Coonoor, Madras and Trichur. In Vellore, their first abode was in MIQ and her first innings as a teacher was as a volunteer in Ida Scudder School. They moved out of MIQ to a small house in Katpadi when their first son was born. With Dr. Mammen's busy schedule, duties and long hours, the times were not easy. Mrs Mammen had to collect water from the street taps carrying the child in her arms. In 1978 after their second son was born, they moved back to the hospital campus living in Harley street where there was constant battle with rats.



The next move was to Men's Hostel where Dr Mammen was the Deputy Warden. At a time when phones were considered a luxury, she remembers almost being ducked by the students of the hostel as she had to go to the hostel to take phone calls. Despite these initial episodes, she enjoyed the time she stayed in the Men's hostel wardens' quarters when the students would come in freely with their needs. The family moved to Australia in 1981. In 1984 on their return, she joined Vidyalayam teaching English and Social Studies to the senior classes and Hindi to the younger ones. Her students remember the Hindi word "ANAR" to this day as she brought a box full of pomegranate seeds to class.

While working in Vidyalayam, she not only was an excellent teacher, but younger students who had not yet adjusted to the school would seek her and cling to her for comfort and motherly affection. Slow learners would approach her for encouragement and support. In addition to her active involvement in the school plays in which tall or short, shy or not, she made sure that every one of the students participated, the project in social studies was particularly enjoyed by the students and many of them talk about the class on the history of Vellore where she took them to the Fort and "everything came alive". Her students talk about her ability to command love, admiration and respect and her overreaching capacity to love and to nurture. In the words of one of some of her students, "She is the reason why many of us speak English the way we do as she was very insistent that we speak slowly and clearly", above all her interest in each of her students, her willingness to encourage us and the ability to draw out the potential in us has made an impact and a difference in our impressionable minds".

Mrs. Susan Abraham, a former principal of Vidyalayam, who was Mrs. Mammen's role model and inspiration, talks about Mrs Mammen being an excellent teacher, a good disciplinarian who endeared herself to both students and colleagues with never an ill word about any one. Mrs. Mammen firmly believed in the all around development of children as well as creating in them a passion to help those who were not as fortunate. She continued in Vidyalayam till 2002, with a break in between for 2 years when Dr. Mammen was away. After a three-month course in Counselling, she visited patients in the Rehabilitation Centre. Recognising the need for a library for the patients, she collected books and transported the books bed to bed on a trolley creating a mobile library. She functioned as a Trustee in the Mary Varghese Trust and later took on the role as the Secretary of the Trust.

All the while she listened to the stories that Dr. Mammen narrated about the patients in the Haematology ward and especially of the children. Recognising the need to make a difference in the ward which was in a dilapidated state, she then put her heart and soul in to changing the atmosphere. She designed an attractive place, carefully selecting the furniture, curtains and books, where patients and particularly the children had to stay for an extended period while undergoing long drawn out treatment. When the A-ward was later built, she created the play room work area for the children making it a haven where the little ones could spend their time in fun and recreation and where they could function as normally as possible. When Dr. Mammen took over as Director of the Tata Memorial Centre, Kolkota, she moved along with him and continued her work with the children admitted to the haematology wards there. In campus life, she judged essay competitions, directed plays and with her artistical skills was responsible for decorating the Big Bungalow for important functions. Her role in the Women's Fellowship of the Church and College area fellowship are also noteworthy. Much of her work was behind the scene as a paver of the way for it all to happen. In her own words, she enjoyed every moment of it finding fulfilment in filling whatever role she had to play. To quote Rabindranath Tagore, it would be true to say of Mrs Anu Mammen - "I slept and dreamed that life was joy, I woke and found that life was service, I served and found that service was joy".

Beyond all joy and celebration, the reunion was a day of thanksgiving.

An update on Disaster Management by the Quality Cell and Safety Cell

Safety of patients and staff ranks high on the list of goals of the institution. With a view to prepare the staff to handle the emergencies, the **Safety Cell and Quality Management Cell** along with the respective departments have developed various emergency protocols, trained the staff and conducted drills in theatre, wards, OPD services, ICUs and laboratories. Specific drills like **child abduction emergency drill in paediatric wards, radiation emergency drill evacuating brachytherapy and radio nuclide patients** were also conducted.





Mock drills for theatres are conducted once in 6 months, zone wise. During this drill, a major fire was simulated and the entire communication and evacuation process were observed by the Quality / Safety team who assess the operating team, individuals and offices for their response times and adherence to the prescribed protocols. Following the drill, all the participants gathered in the recovery area for debriefing. The suggestion and recommendation are to be noted and implemented.

Ward mock drills are conducted weekly as per the schedule which consists of one cycle covering every ward in the main campus. During the exercise, emergency evacuation protocol and the first response to fire were emphasized since it is the crucial step to confine the hazard and minimize the risk. After the briefing, the staff are asked to enact on the protocol including managing critical, semi-critical and non-critical patients. Fire scenario is initiated and the staff are asked to respond to it. The response is observed and the issues noted during the drill are discussed during debriefing. The noted issues are intimated to the concerned departments for rectification and follow up. The support from Nursing Service in conducting the drill and the response of the fire team during the drill is appreciated.

The protocol for handling ICU emergencies, mob violence management and bomb threat management has been developed through the series of meeting conducted by Quality / Safety teams along with concerned medical, nursing, fire, security and engineering teams. The Department Quality Managers have undergone the "Training the trainers programme on mob violence and bomb threat management"



The trained DQMs will in turn train the unit doctors. From mid August, the drills will commence for mob violence management. Special training on the same for security team was also conducted.



The much awaited fully functional emergency communication system which will be available, round the clock was installed connecting all the areas of the main hospital campus. This will play a major role in swiftly

Dr. Ida S. Scudder Humanitarian Oration, 2019 "Let us at least nurture kindness", Harsh Mander



eace activist and writer, Mr. Harsh Mander, who currently serves as the Director of the Centre for Equity Studies in New Delhi, delivered the 8th Ida S. Scudder Humanitarian Oration on the 9th of August, in the Scudder Auditorium at College Campus. Mr. Mander resigned from the Indian Administrative Services after the Gujarat riots to work among the homeless. Being a passionate advocate for the marginalised, he spoke on the theme of public compassion.

"The example of public compassion which both Dr. Ida Scudder and CMC Vellore provide really represent to me the core – the missing link in finding a way out of the darkness of our times," he said.

The principal challenges of our time, which he described as one of the most cruel and barbaric in human history, were inequality coupled with indifference, rising hatred, legitimised bigotry and climate change. In India, caste - the accident of our birth complicates and deepens inequality and allows us to have a high comfort level with the glaring inequalities all around us, he said.

Mr. Mander, who played an active role in the debates around the right to food that finally led to the passing of the National Food Security Act in 2013, recounted heart-wrenching stories of Dalit mothers in UP teaching their children how to sleep hungry and of others who ate undigested grain that they had collected from cattle dung.

He spoke of the rising hatred and intolerance all around us, which we hardly notice, that "manifests itself in an epidemic of lynchings." He recounted, from his personal conversations with the families of victims, the extreme torture involved in these lynchings that frequently last a few hours, and the legitimisation and valorisation of this hatred, as evinced by their video-taping and propagation on social media by the perpetrators themselves.

Even as he spoke of these disturbing events, his confidence in the solution to the darkness of our times – meeting hate with radical love and being aware of our duty towards each other - was evident. He reminded the audience that the only thing needed is

Dedication of the CCM (Cobas Connection Module)

'For His Faithfulness endures forever'. Psalm 117:2

The CCM in the Department of Clinical Biochemistry was dedicated on 30th August 2019. The programme began with a song followed by prayer by Rev. Saramma Kuruvilla, Chaplain. The welcome address and overview of the 'Evolution of Automation in Clinical Biochemistry' was given by Dr. Pamela Christudoss, Professor and Head (Ag), following which felicitations were offered by Dr. J.V. Peter, Director, Dr. Joy Mammen, Associate Medical Superintendent, Dr. Judy Ann, Vice Principal and



Dr. Shravan Subramanyam, Managing Director, Roche Diagnostics, India.

The Clinical Biochemistry laboratory has its humble beginnings in the early 60s with the good old Folin-Wu method for blood sugar and simple photometric methods for routine chemistries requiring large volume of patients' blood with few samples processed at a time which resulted in delayed test results. Thanks to the efforts of Dr. Peter Hill from UK, the continuous-flow batch analyser was introduced in 1970. Dr. Robert.H. Carman and Dr. A.S. Kanagasabapathy offered valuable support towards its successful installation. In 1975 Dr. Kanagasabapathy introduced the first in-house Radio Immuno Assay (RIA) for thyroid hormones which was the best technique employed globally at that time for hormone analysis. In 1985, Dr.R.Selvakumar introduced the **Hitachi discrete selective analyser** with a throughput of 180 test results per hour, low sample volume with selection of one or more tests from the panel. The Chemiluminescent technology for the measurement of hormones and tumor markers through discrete selective analysis was introduced in 1997 which further improved sensitivity.

Since then, the department added more advanced analysers from time to time to further enhance quality, throughput, turnaround time which in turn improves patient care. The introduction of the stand alone Cobas **Preanlaytical, Auto validation, Delta check** in 2014 has made further improvements in efficiency.

The new Cobas Connection Module (CCM) installed in this year has the ability of connecting the Preanalytical systems to Analytics through a fast transportation system guaranteeing quick release of results conceived for high throughput labs. From handling just 80 samples a day and 10 parameters in the early 1960's, over the years the department of Clinical Biochemistry has made it possible to handle over 6500 samples per day with 195 parameters and release of approximately 19000 test results per day. The programme was well attended by Heads, Professors, Faculty of the other Clinical Laboratories, Academic departments and Supporting departments.

Patient Friendly Awards 2018

he Quality Management Cell has been conducting the audit on patient satisfaction, both in the outpatient and inpatient areas from the year 2009. Field staff trained specially for this survey carry out the feedback collection on a day to day basis.

Outpatient and Inpatient feedback collection methodology:

Outpatient (OPD) Feedback:

Outpatient feedbacks are collected every day in the designated OPD's covering every area once in three months ensuring four cycles a year. Each OP feedback form has a unique ID and is collected in five languages using a five-point rating scale. Forty general patients and thirty private patients are selected from each OPD/Clinic per cycle. The respondents are selected randomly using the systematic random sampling technique. Only those patients who come for repeat consultation are included in the audit.

The questionnaire is provided in the preferred languages of the respondents. The questions include services of doctors, nurses, OPD clerks (MRO's), pharmacy, securities and laboratories. The filled up forms are then deposited in boxes specially kept in OPD for the purpose.

Inpatient (IP) Feedback:

IP feedback is collected in six languages using a ten-point rating scale. Each feedback form has a unique ID and is attached with the final bill of the patient. Respondents are requested to fill up the given form

and deposit the same in feedback box in the wards.

The feedback staff from QMC visits all the wards on a weekly basis and collects the forms. Questions on the services of doctors, nurses, pharmacy, billing, attenders and facilities are included in the questionnaire.

Different parameters are considered during analysis and importance is given for patient load. The award winners are selected based on these parameters.

The annual reports of outpatients and inpatients satisfaction are presented to the Quality Steering Committee and then circulated to wards, units and OPDs.

The NHSRC Family Medicine Curriculum Experts' Workshop, hosted by the Distance **Education Unit**

The Distance Education Unit along with the National Health System Resource Center (NHSRC) division of the National Health Mission (NHM), New Delhi and the Department of Family Medicine, CMC, jointly organized a two-day workshop on Family Medicine Curriculum review on the 3rd and 4th of September, 2019 at CMC, Vellore.

The NHSRC Family Medicine Curriculum Experts' Workshop, hosted by the Distance Education Unit **Continued from Page 2**

This workshop was aimed at bringing about a modified curriculum for family medicine in the DNB and MCI board which would include the skill sets required by family physicians working in PHCs and CHCs in India.

The workshop was initiated by Dr. Himanshu Bhushan, Head of Public Health Administration NHSRC along with other senior consultants and consultants of the NHSRC. External experts from various parts of the country, representatives from the National Health Mission, Tamil Nadu and the Assistant Programme Officer of Vellore District



were invited by the NHSRC to be part of the deliberations. Dr. Raman Kumar, President of the Association of Family Physicians of India, presented the models of curriculum and guidelines of family medicine programmes for USA, Australia and Canada. A team of family physicians from Distance Education and Family Medicine Departments had reviewed the present Family Medicine Curriculum and gave recommendations for the skills to be designed in a Life-Cycle model rather than a specialty-based model. A specialist team from CMC and the mission hospital network comprising of Dr. Sowmya Sathyendra, Dr. Paul M.J., Dr. Vinod Shah, Dr. Sujatha Charles, Dr. Sneha Titus, Dr. Anjali Abraham, Dr. Mary John, Dr. Anika Amritanand, Dr. Padma Paul, Dr. Eunice Selvaraj, Dr. Kenny David, Dr. Vijay Kumar Manda, Dr. Johann Ebenezer, Dr. Adeline Sitther, Dr. Susanne Pulimood, Dr. Jayalakshmi, Dr. Bimal Charles and Dr. Latha Paul gave valuable suggestions to strengthen the existing curriculum.

Dr. Rebekah Zechariah, Acting Head of the Distance Education Unit, welcomed the delegates and the Principal Dr. Anna Pulimood delivered the inaugural address followed by devotion by Dr. Praveen Alexander. Dr. Jachin Velavan from Distance Education Unit, summarized the premise of this curriculum review and the Life-span model was showcased by Dr. Sahaya Anbarasi and Dr. Mokshaa Mohan. Dr. Sunil Abraham, Professor and Head, Department of Family Medicine, summarized the MD family medicine training in CMC. Inputs into the vital area of evaluation methods in the family medicine curriculum was given by Dr. Venkatesan, Department of Family Medicine and Dr. Beulah Joseph from Distance Education Unit. Family medicine specialists from the CMC mission hospital network, Dr. Immanuel Rajamani from Oddanchatram, Dr. Isac David and Dr. Vijila Isac from Van Allen Hospital in Kodiakanal added valuable perspectives to the discussions. Dr. Alka Ganesh gave important insights into the Operational Guidelines for family medicine training, while Dr. Rajan Srinivasan and Dr. Summa Nidhi from Distance Education Unit presented the required skills needed by PHC/CHC doctors in the present IPHS and compiled the student feedback respectively.

The two-day deliberations culminated in the compilation of a comprehensive list of skills required for family physicians to be posted in PHCs and CHCs with an emphasis on attitude/ethical values and teamwork along with other valuable suggestions for strengthening the curriculum. This draft curriculum submitted to the NHSRC will be used for advocacy for policy making by the Ministry in framing guidelines for family medicine training in India.

Proficiency Testing Programme

The Third National Proficiency Testing Providers / Reference Material Producers (PTP/RMP) conclave organized by National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) was held on 30th to 31st August 2019 at ITC, Kakatiya, Hyderabad. On the first day, GMP manufacturing and regulatory aspects in cell and gene therapy were also discussed. There were presentations on advances in the CRISPR/Cas9 based genome editing as well. The key note address of the symposium was delivered by Professor David Gottlieb from Westmead Hospital, University of



Sydney, Australia. He discussed the development immune cell therapy in the world and delivered the keynote address titled 'Evolution of T-cell Therapy for Infections' in the context of hematopoietic stemcell transplantation.

The second day of the symposium had various discussions on gene therapy in haemophilia and muscular dystrophy including gene editing approaches towards developing a treatment of beta-hemoglobinopathies. There was also a session on cell therapy in ocular disorders. The symposium was much appreciated by all participants as a unique event in the country. CSCR plans to hold this meeting on an annual basis to help promote this area of research in India through cross-discipline dialogue and collaborations on a diverse range of inter-connected issues relevant to the field.

5th Basic Course in Molecular Diagnostics-Workshop in Haematology



The Department of Haematology and the Department of Pathology jointly conducted the "5th Basic Course in Molecular Diagnostics", a 12-day complete hands-on training workshop, between 19th to 31st August 2019. Molecular diagnostics have become an essential part of lab investigations required in providing optimal care and has become an important tool for the health care provider in making the right treatment decisions. However, considering the dearth of trained personnel in

this area, the course focused on training twelve participants from various states in the country along with 2 participants from the institution in basic molecular techniques (DNA / RNA extraction, PCR, electrophoresis) that progressed to include more advanced methods (real time PCR, sequencing, MLPA, digital droplet PCR and NGS) in the second week. Application of these techniques in the diagnosis of inherited and acquired hematological diseases and solid tumors was emphasized. This training is designed to aid the participants in establishing and performing similar assays in their respective centers. This course also included lectures by internal and external resource persons and also included a lecture on "Advances in NGS-based Diagnostics" by Dr. Vamshi Mohan Veeramachaneni, Chief Scientific Officer, Strand Life Sciences, Bangalore on the penultimate day.

In 2011, Dr. Paul Ravindran was responsible for starting the three-year Master's Programme (M.Sc.) in Medical Physics in affiliation with the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University. In the same year, he also established a laboratory exclusively for students of Medical Physics equiped to perform basic science experiments, such as determination of half value layer, attenuation coefficient and gamma spectrum of radio isotopes. He also developed an imaging lab, with a bench top x-ray Cone Beam CT for imaging experiments and small computer lab for technical computing under a grant from the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. The other lab he developed was for Gel dosimetry with facility for preparing FX and LCV gel and Optical cone beam CT for reading the radiation dose embedded in the Gel matrix.

Apart from being an inspiration within the department, he has been in various administrative positions in the institution. From 2008 to 2010, he was a member of the administrative committee and from 2010 to 2014 he headed the Department of Medical Records and was the Vice Principal (AHS) during the same time. From 2017, he has been serving as the Associate General Superintendent. Outside the institution, he is the Convener and Secretary of the Medical Radiation Technology Training Committee of the Christian Medical Association of India from 2005. He was also a member of the board and the executive committee of SIHR & TC, Hospital Karigiri. He has also held various honorary positions, such as, the Chief Examiner of College of Medical Physics of India, Member of Editorial Board , Journal of Medical Physics, member of project review committee in TDDP. He has tremendous experience in academic, clinical and research activities and has been involved in numerous projects as the principal investigator. Dr. Paul is well known for his expertise in teaching. He has been a mentor for many in their academic and personal lives. His wife, Dr. Vinitha Ravindran is the Professor & Head of Continuing Nursing Education and their daughter, Ms. Sharon Paul is a Psychologist working for an NGO at Bangalore.

CMC organised an exhibition and awareness walk to reiterate the increasing rate of accidents causing death and disability on World Trauma Day on 17th October, 2019. 300 young people walked from Vellore Fort to CMC Hospital to spread awareness about the rapidly growing problem of trauma and in particular Road Traffic Accidents (RTA). The walk was flagged off by the Superintendent of Police, Shri. Pravesh Kumar, IPS. "Initiatives like this are much needed," he said, "to raise awareness and bring down the number of accidents. Safety is not the responsibility of just one department, everyone must play their part." Members of CMC's Accident and Emergency Team (both staff and students) led the walk, followed by students from Auxilium College and CMC.

They shouted slogans and held placards and banners to spread the message of Road Safety. "Last year over 7,600 Trauma Patients were admitted in our Emergency Unit," said Dr. Sukria Nayak, Professor of Surgery at CMC. "Of these, nearly 5,000 were victims of road traffic accidents. A majority were motorbike injuries. A simple act like wearing a helmet can reduce the risks of head injury by 70%."

CMC organised an exhibition with stalls on first aid and how to help an accident victim, post-trauma rehabilitation and the new advanced Trauma Care Centre coming up at CMC Kannigapuram Campus. The motorbike simulator and games sponsored by Chola





MS Risk Services exposed the dangers of unsafe driving. If everyone follows highway rules and treats other road users with respect, the number of accidents will come down immediately. CMC's Blood Bank Donor Bus was parked near the exhibition and 13 voluntary donors gave blood to save the lives of trauma victims. CMC is building a dedicated Trauma Care Centre in their new campus at Kannigapuram on the busy National Highway between Chennai and Bengaluru. This will offer multi-disciplinary care under one roof with expert specialist doctors and highly skilled support teams.

• **Dr. Geoffrey Louis Allen** (MBBS batch of 1947) on 14th October, 2019. Dr. Geoffrey Louis Allen was born in Peshawar (then British India) in 1927 and attended La Martiniere College, Lucknow, and Christian Medical College Vellore, where he was one of the first ten men in a previously exclusively women's college.

After graduation and training in cardio-thoracic surgery, he was appointed a consultant in the College Hospital unit, where the first open heart operation in India was performed. In 1960, he moved to England for family reasons, and from 1960 - 1962 was Senior Registrar, Cardio-Thoracic Unit, Royal Infirmary, Sheffield.

In 1963-1964, he was Senior Registrar, Cardio-Thoracic Unit, Harefield Hospital, UK working with prestigious surgeon Thomas Holmes Sellors. In 1964, he was appointed Cardio-Thoracic and Vascular Surgeon, Green Lane Hospital, gaining valuable experience with Brian Barratt-Boyes.

In March 1967, he started at Waikato Hospital, New Zealand doing all the major closed cardiac, thoracic and vascular surgery together with some early paediatric surgery, and establishment of vascular access for the renal service. Dr. Geoff Allen was appointed the first Thoracic and Vascular surgeon at Waikato Hospital, New Zealand in 1967.

Important New Zealand "firsts" include mediastinoscopy, insertion of a epicardial leads for a demand pacemaker, radial arterio-venous access for haemodialysis, and participation in reimplantation of a hand. After retirement in 1996, Dr. Geoffrey Allen continued, among other interests, to play golf twice weekly.

He was married to Mrs. Shirley Mae Connors, a competent surgical ward Charge Nurse, in 1969, and had three children, David, Janet, and Christopher. Mrs. Shirley died in 2016.

50 years of Occupational Therapy Education in CMC Vellore

Occupational Therapy is a patient-centred health profession that promotes health and well-being through various occupations. 'Occupation' is not synonymous with work, but is any productive, meaningful task that is part of any role in a person's life. 27th October is celebrated as "World Occupational Therapy day" and this year marks the 50th year of OT education in CMC.

Evolution of Occupational Therapy

- 1962: Occupational Therapy began in the Department of PMR, with Ms.Manuel as the first therapist and expansion of the services to Mental Health, Community Medicine, Schieffelin Institute of Health-Research Departments and to the Leprosy Centre at Karigiri by Ms. Monica Hopkins' tireless service.
- 1969: 24th September, 1969, under the leadership of Ms. Jean Bald, a 3 year Diploma in OT training programme was started with three students.
- 1982: Commencement of the Bachelor's programme
- 1997: Recognition of the current 4 and a half year programme by the Dr. MGR Medical University

Holistic Care: From A - Z

Occupational Therapy (OT) Services and Education in CMC – A Walk through

Therapist **A** is helping an aged gentleman with a unilateral above knee amputation, walk down the ramp at the entrance of the OT main section. They are practicing how to get in and out of an auto, so that he can travel to work independently. The hall inside the OT section is divided into functional areas. On the right in the Paediatric therapy area, while therapist **B** helps a child to sit up by herself, therapist **C** is helping a boy hold his pencil using a special aid. Therapist **D** is assessing an infant with feeding difficulties for hypersensitivity and suck-swallow-breathe coordination.

In the adult area, Therapist \mathbf{E} assesses the home environment of a woman with muscular dystrophy, so that she can pursue her passion of cooking for her children safely and efficiently. Therapist \mathbf{F} is using functional electrical stimulation to improve a young man's range of wrist extension, so he can drive his bike again. Young and active therapists \mathbf{G} and \mathbf{H} frequent the corridors of the hospital, going from ward

to ward to see in-patient referrals from various units. These are the visits patients look forward to the most. In the Geriatric ward, Therapist I is making a memory box for a retired police inspector who is in the early stages of dementia. In the Paediatric Orthopedics Unit, Therapist J is playing with a young boy using a weighted ball - the child does not even realize that his muscles are being strengthened.

In the Developmental Paediatrics unit, a young boy runs past Therapist **K** straight into the ball pit. He is reminded to take his shoes off which he has learned to do by himself, though he still struggles with tying the laces. Therapist **L** helps a child with academic difficulties to improve her memory, problem solving skills and handwriting. Therapist **M** teaches a mother in the Neonatal ICU how to position and handle her very premature baby. Therapist **N** uses standardised assessments to detect early signs of developmental delay. In the Paediatric Surgery department, Therapist **O** positions a child's hand in a way that contractures are prevented. In the Paediatric Rheumatology department, Therapist **P** teaches a cheerful boy how his school day can be modified, to conserve energy, minimize pain and fatigue at the end of the day. In the Oncology department, Therapist **Q** makes a time schedule for Anna who has been in hospital for the past 2 months. She looks forward to her Art class and Story time.

A group of OT students have travelled via the college bus from their clinical placements to their classes. They bubble with excitement about the patients they met that day and the things they have learned. They come from the Psychiatry department, Nambikkai Nilayam, CHAD and the Rehabilitation Institute. They describe how Therapist **R** conducted a group discussion on stress management for patients with mood disorders. Ms. Manu, recovering from depression, shared her excitement with Therapist **S** – the marigold she planted during the gardening session has finally bloomed. Student **T** is excited about having conducted the "Good morning" session for the first time, where children learn social skills such as maintaining eye contact and greeting each other.

Student U has accompanied Therapist V for a community home visit. They were able to make meaningful suggestions on home modifications and encourage Mr. Kumar, who was recently discharged from the hospital following his Traumatic brain injury. In the Rehab institute, Therapist W teaches an elderly man to transfer from his wheel chair to the toilet stool and back. Therapist X uses mirror therapy to restore movement in Mr. Naveen's left hand, which was impaired after Stroke. In the Virtual reality room, Therapist Y guides Anya's arm as she tries to hit a virtual ball holding a bat, to improve her balance and coordination. Suganya hugs Therapist Z after the Spinal Cord Injury Mela, the PMR annual follow up event. She says "When the doctor told me that I would be in a wheelchair for the rest of my life, I was shattered. But you showed me that there were so many things that I could do inspite of my disability and I can tell you wholeheartedly that I am happy."

The 50th year of Education will be celebrated through various staff and student activities including a debate, quiz and a series of competitions called OCCUFUN. A CME on "Paediatric Rehabilitation: Different Models in CMC" will be conducted on the 28th of March, 2020. The dreams and visions for the future include increasing student intake to meet increasing demands, starting a Master's programme and exploring avenues for a PhD programme. Ties with foreign universities through student and staff exchange programmes and faculty visits, are being worked on by the alumni.

Diploma in Hospital Administration (DHA)

On returning to Madras, she then did her M.D. in Medicine at the Madras Medical College, for a further three years of training (there was no MD Paediatrics at that time). She then joined the Institute of Child Health in Egmore in 1960, and worked under Dr S.T. Achar,

the Father of Indian Pediatrics. After 22 years of mentoring generations of under graduates at the Madras Medical College and postgraduates at the Institute of Child Health, she retired as Honorary Professor of Paediatrics in 1982. As an eminent leading paediatrician in Chennai, she actively espoused the cause of Christ in the community for another 20 years in private practice often taking nothing in return for her service to the poor who would often arrive at her doorstep with a sick child. Having personally experienced and thereafter practicing the ideals of her mentor and founder of CMC, Dr. Ida Scudder, she was called by her Lord and Saviour to her eternal abode on Sunday 28th of October 2019. In 2010, he was appointed Vice-Principal (HR) with the responsibility of developing HR strategies for long term employment. In 2012, he was appointed as Director for a tenure of five years which saw major decisions being initiated and implemented which will have far reaching consequences to us as a health providing community in the future. He along with his administrative team conceptualized, designed and commenced the 1500 bed hospital in Kannigapuram. The decision to extend retirement age for doctors from 60 to 65 years was taken during his tenure. The Katpadi emergency desk, Multi-level puzzle car park, Shalom citizen clinic and Enhancement of RUHSA outpatient care are his other contributions.

After his tenure as Director, he rejoined Cardiology department and was instrumental in setting up the Heart Failure Clinic and was actively involved in conceptualizing an inter-departmental team which will form the foundation for cardiac transplant services in future. Over the years, apart from his leadership skills, he has been an inspiration within the department for his expertise in teaching and in being a mentor par excellence for the faculty under him. First workshop on "Quality Control in Clinical Biochemistry"



The Department of Clinical Biochemistry conducted the first workshop on 'Quality Control in Clinical Biochemistry' on 18th and 19th October 2019. The programme began with prayer led by Rev. Pearson, Chaplain followed by the welcome address by Dr. Pamela Christudoss, Professor and Head (Ag), Coordinator of CMC-EQAS Clinical Biochemistry. The felicitations were given by the dignitaries Dr. Deepak Abraham, Associate Director (HR), Dr. Anna Pulimood, Principal and Dr. Joy Mammen, Associate Medical Superintendent. The other dignitaries present were Dr. Swaminathan and Dr. Geethanjali, former Professors of

Clinical Biochemistry, Dr. Arivazhagan, Head, Clinical Biochemistry, Adayar Cancer Research Institute and Tamil Nadu State Representative of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India, (ACBI), spoke about the forty one years of association CMC-EQAS has with the ACBI. Dr. A.S. Kanagasabapathy, former Professor and Head of Clinical Biochemistry highlighted the history of the CMC-EQAS programme and the importance of Quality control in Clinical Labs in India.

The Department of Clinical Biochemistry, under the banner of ACBI has been conducting the External Quality Assessment Scheme (EQAS) since 1978. The CMC-EQA, Clinical Biochemistry is accredited by NABL (as per ISO/IEC 17043:2010) since 2014. Lyophilized samples are prepared and sent to the participating laboratories at regular intervals in batches of 4 vials thrice a year (total of 12 samples/year) for each of the programmes: Chem-1(23parameters), Chem -2(9 parameters), Thyroid and Cortisol, Reproductive Hormones, Downs Screening, HBA1C, Urine Chemistry and Tumour markers. The participating laboratories include those from teaching and non-teaching hospitals, government and private hospital labs, private labs and diagnostic centres representing all the states of India, Nepal, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. At present, there are 8 different programs with more than 7500 laboratories participating. Apart from this, the department prepares IQC and sends these vials (approximately 16000 per month) to almost 3000 small labs in India.

The workshop focused on creating awareness among the laboratories to provide quality results and to understand the Principles and Practice of Quality control (Internal QC and EQA), trouble shooting, corrective and preventive action, statistical calculation, scoring and basic techniques in clinical Biochemistry. In keeping with this the following lectures were conducted:

- "Salient Features of Quality Assurance in Clinical Laboratories" by Dr. A.S. Kanagasabapathy
- "Various Phases of Errors in Clinical Laboratory and How to Avoid Them" and "Good Clinical Laboratory Practices" by Dr. Pamela Christudoss.

These were followed by activities involving basic statistical calculation and construction of LJ charts.

The workshop was a time of learning for all the participants and was attended by a total of 270 participants, which included MD biochemists, Ph.D'S, lab managers, senior technical staff, quality managers from various hospital labs, medical college and hospital labs and private labs from the state of Tamil Nadu. Dr. Pamela expressed her gratitude to the team from the QC section and the laboratory staff for all their efforts. The department takes this opportunity to thank the administration for their kind support through the past four decades.

From 1962 with grants from the Wellcome Trust and from PL480 funds Dr. Selwyn built up a

research team with Prof. A. N. Radhakrishnan as Biochemist and Prof. Prema Bhat, Microbiologist and Prof. V.I. Mathan, Clinician and Epidemiologist. Many graduate students obtained PhD from this group.

Dr. Selwyn was instrumental in obtaining funds from The Research Corporation in New York to build the Williams Research Building to honour the memory of Dr. Robert Ramapattinam Williams, who had the commercial patent for synthesising Vitamin B1. Dr Williams was born in India to missionary parents at Ramapattinam in Andhra Pradesh. This purpose designed building, the first of its kind for research in any Medical College in India, is a lasting tribute to Dr. Selwyn Baker. Professors B.K. Bachawat, A.N. Radhakrishnan, Prema Bhat, Sheila Pereira, Mary Dumm and V.I. Mathan working in the Building with Dr. Selwyn placed CMC Vellore on the Biomedical research map of the world. Much of the research priorities were decided over dosa and coffee at lunch in the Andal Cafe. He gave freedom for his colleagues to develop their interests and was a good Mentor.

Dr. Selwyn was an outstanding clinician and haematologist and inculcated in his students the ideal that they were totally responsible for their patients. His pioneering management of a staff spouse who developed catastrophic post-partum bleeding will long be remembered by all on the staff of CMC in 1972. Dr. Selwyn resigned in 1975 for personal reasons following the 1974 strike and joined the University of Winnipeg in Canada from where he retired to UK. Mrs. Elizabeth Baker, his wife was the first Principal of Vidyalayam and generations of children remember her with gratitude. Later he married Dr. Elisabeth Jacob of the batch of 1950.

Dr. Selwyn John Baker was an outstanding Clinical Researcher who spent 20 years at CMC Vellore and was instrumental in CMC gaining a place on the medical research map of the world. He was honoured with the FRACP for his work. He had four children. We thank God for a life well spent.

In this Christmas season, we remember the birth of the **Wonderful Counsellor – Lord Jesus Christ.** This is good news because we know that in Him there is someone who listens and understands. We have found a guide who never fails. We also have someone who brings true meaning in our lives. Whether young or old, rich or poor, men or women, citizen or foreigner, we all need counsellor in our lives. We are grateful that we can go to him whenever we need a counsellor. As we rejoice in this fact, this news comes with a calling for us to be counsellors for others. Those who received counsel from this Wonderful Counsellor are endowed with the responsibility to listen and understand, to guide and to accompany others in their meaning making. Dr. Lalitha Bai was born to parents Evangeline and Devadattam Bollapalli on May 6, 1937, in Baer Hospital, Chirala. She completed her MBBS at Christian Medical College, Vellore, from 1955 to 1961, having been sponsored by the Andhra Evangelical Lutheran Church (AELC), Guntur.

Dr. Lalitha completed her bond by working in Kugler Hospital and later on completed her MD in Paediatrics in Vellore. After finishing up the MD programme at Vellore in 1970, Dr. Lalitha returned to work in Kugler's, because she was set on working for an AELC-backed institution. While working at Kugler's, Dr. Lalitha participated in wayside camps one weekend a month, going to places such as Macherla and Perecherla. She then applied to a residency programme in the US After completing residency, Dr. Lalitha and her family moved to Cleveland, where she worked in Fairview General Hospital until 1995. Since Dr. Frederick was working at Emory University in Atlanta, Dr. Lalitha moved to Atlanta in 1995 and worked at Eggleston Children's Hospital until she retired in 2005.

It was while Dr. Lalitha and Dr. Frederick were in India in 2002 to celebrate their second son's wedding reception that the elders of St. Luke's Parish located in Baer Hospital Campus in Chirala requested them to revive Baer Hospital, which had fallen into disrepair and disuse for the past 25 years. Although initially reluctant, Dr. Lalitha and Dr. Frederick moved to Chirala in 2006 to undertake work on Baer Hospital and renamed it Baer Christian Hospital. They started with an outpatient clinic, which they renovated to include an operating theatre and five beds. Gradually, they renovated the maternity ward into a 50-bed hospital. The renovation of 100 year old main hospital building was completed in February 2019 and it became 150 bedded hospital with modern operation theatre, ICU, NICU and central oxygen.

Dr. Lalitha planned and executed medical camps throughout the area and provided free medicines to all the patients who came to see them. These camps are being held at 11 nearby villages every month and partial support for these camps are being provided by Chirala Medical & Educational Trust INC a 501C non-profit organization in Atlanta, GA and Capstone Ministries in Knoxville, TN. Every quarter mega camps are conducted for 4 days at 4 different villages with the help of Dr. Helen Hemalatha Simon of Cephas Foundation and Operation Blessing India.

Dr. Lalitha was dedicated to providing quality medical care to people who could not afford it, ably supported by her husband Dr. Frederick in that endeavour. She was on call 24/7 and treated patients with Dengue, Chikungunya, typhoid and other viral fevers at minimum charges to patients but with 100% success. Dr. Lalitha and Dr. Frederick had involved the Chikkala family in the entire endeavour, creating the Chirala Medical and Educational Trust through Oak Road Lutheran Church in Lilburn, GA. Dr. Jerry Rausch, her dentist in Atlanta and member of Oak Road Lutheran Church, conducts free annual dental camps at Baer Christian Hospital for ten days, sometimes twice a year. Physicians and dentists of Capstone Ministries also helped Dr. Lalitha in conducting free medical and Dental camps in and around Chirala. Dr. Mangaraju and Dr. Tulasi Vanapali, family friends of Dr. Lalitha from Atlanta, conduct free medical camps in Baer Christian Hospital campus every year for 2 to 4 days. Dr. Mangaraju, a bone specialist gives injections to the knee joints of needed patients free of cost. Dr. Lalitha wanted to start a Nursing College in Baer Christian Hospital campus. We wish and pray that her wish would be fulfilled soon by God's Grace.

Reflection on the Calendar 2020




DECEMBER 30, 2019

See, I have given you this land. Go in and take possession of the land that the Lord swore he would give to your fathers - to Abraham, Issac and Jacob – and to their descendants after them. Deuteronomy 1:8



The 'Hill Site', as it was called in the early 1900's was the land shown to Dr. Ida for her vision of the Kingdom of God.

Lush green and tucked away securely between the two hills, the College Campus is a



peaceful community of residents and students. Blanketed by a canopy of trees, the ariel view of the campus, brings about a feeling of serenity. The reflections on the January calendar will show a clear picture of this aspect. When Dr. Ida envisioned her dream of a residential campus, she approached the, then notable architect Reginald Dann and builder Bernard Rottchaefer in 1929. The proposed plans were for the administrative blocks, hostels, staff bungalow and Principal's bungalow which were completed in 1932. It is said that when Dr. Ida saw a future in the hill site she was 40 years old and she was 60 years when the campus took its shape to where it is now. When the plans were in the nascent stage, the granite for the buildings were taken from the rocky fortress surrounding it, almost symbolic of the everlasting protection we receive from the rock of ages cleft for us.

The most striking aspect and architecture of the hill site campus is the college chapel or the Weyer Hauser chapel. The chapel with its 'twin domes', placed at the green heart of the campus serves as an unfading identity. The chapel and its ethereal sunken garden with the Lily pond is a place of surreal peace and calm which often stills the unrest within us. An evening walk around the chapel road is magical. The voices of the choir practising or the evening prayers of the students, resound beautifully within its walls.



One of the highlights and uniqueness of the campus is its closeness in every aspect. The students and staff reside within the same campus. In the midst of the staff quarters, the hostels are





securely housed: the woman's hostel, men's hostel, Dorothy Joske hostel and the Fitch hostel. The foster system of the college, allows the students and staff to go beyond their roles as teacher and student. After working hours, the foster system allows the students to be a part of the families of the staff. The students have a home away from home and a family to take care of them during their long stay in the hostel.

The pre clinical classes take place in the college campus; it is a usual sight to see the students running for their classes. The Carmen block which holds the administrative offices are abuzz with activities during the working hours.

It's mind boggling to imagine that the vision of one lady has brought in a culture of its own, between the hills of Bagayam. The hill site is almost like a place of its own, quite detached from the rest of the Vellore town, safe from the power cuts and traffic, concentrating only on the future of health care. The lives of the future doctors and allied health specialists are safe and secure in the College Campus, where they spend a major part of their lives and are taught to grow up imbibing the culture and ethos of CMC.
