The 8th Short Course for Nurses was successfully conducted from 30th October to 4th November 2023 by the Office of the Nursing Superintendent and the Hospital Infection Prevention Control Committee. The course aimed to enhance nursing skills and was conducted professionally, covering interactive sessions and practical exercises.

The course aimed to enhance healthcare professionals' knowledge and skills in Infection Prevention and Control. It included lectures, practical sessions, group discussions, skill demonstrations, and lab visits, all led by experienced medical and nursing faculty. thirty nine delegates from 20 hospitals across Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Pondicherry attended.

The inaugural ceremony commenced with a prayer led by the Chaplain, Ms. Saramma Kuruvilla. Ms. Alice Sony, Nursing Superintendent, and Dr. Yacob Myla, Deputy Medical Superintendent, extended their felicitations. The sessions covered infection prevention and control, including surveillance, audits, accreditation, and quality. Participants were encouraged to form infection control committees and were taken on visits to different facilities including wards, CSSD, laundry, waste disposal site, OR and ICU. They learned about methods for environmental surveillance and detecting antibiotic resistance in the microbiology laboratory. Overall, participants expressed confidence in maintaining IPC standards in their respective hospitals.

The educational programme culminated on the 4th of November, 2023 with a valedictory ceremony. Ms. Alice Sony, the Nursing Superintendent, and Dr. Abi Manesh, Deputy Medical Superintendent (Ag), offered their felicitations and congratulations to the participants for completing the course. They also presented the certificates to the participants. Mrs Sophia Vijayananthan, the Additional Joint Secretary HICC, delivered a report on the short course and a vote of thanks. Rev. Samson Varghese, the Chaplain, concluded the ceremony with a closing prayer.


Book Release

• **Dr. Easterine Mills-Clarke** (nee Mills), (MBBS batch of 1970) passed away on 31st October, 2023. Dr. Easterine was born in Sri Lanka on the 17th of April 1949, to Rev. Jeyam Mills and Mrs. Lily Nagamani Mills, a teacher. She has an older sister and three younger brothers.



Dr. Easterine joined CMC in 1970. As though to counterbalance the personal loss and the unfolding horrors of the civil conflict in her motherland, she threw herself into life in CMC with her innate verve and enthusiasm. She was happy-go-lucky, flamboyantly friendly to one and all, forever with a broad grin on her face, a characteristic laugh and boisterous to the point of being called tomboyish. She was the Lady Class Representative in her first year, an early sign of her easy-going, getting-along-with-everybody nature. She was a basketball player, loved all sports, and, as the self-appointed cheerleader, travelled with the various College teams for their away matches.

She had strong faith and was a faithful member of the Student Christian Movement. An accomplished pianist, endowed with a strong alto voice, she was a regular member of the college choir and, often, a substitute organist. With her innate creativity and sense of fun, she was very much the life and soul of any party and much sought after when planning exam wishes or badges for sports day. In spite of all her immersion in these extra-curricular activities, she was a serious student, completing the MBBS course on schedule.

Returning to Sri Lanka in the midst of much turmoil and finding herself unable to practise medicine there, she moved to London. Sadly, insurmountable difficulties with medical registration and practice in the U.K. constrained her to move into other areas of work. Despite many disappointments, she continued to live with her usual verve and graciousness, availing of nonmedical options enthusiastically and to the best of her ability.

Her home in London was a stopping place for anyone who was visiting. She was a much loved 'aunty' for the children of alumni or family and friends from Sri Lanka who visited or came to study. Her generosity and kindness were boundless. There was a special place in her heart for strays and waifs, often extending help beyond the call of duty. She was a faithful member of her local church congregation, organist, bible study leader and parish council member.

Her marriage to speedway driver Tony Clarke brought a stability to her life and she took great care of him during his terminal illness. After his death, she moved from London to Anglesey in Wales, where the air quality was much better for her failing lungs. In the new setting, she continued to live with zest, making new friends. They, in turn, were a big support as her progressive illness made her increasingly dependent. Coming to terms with her decline, she planned and travelled overseas to visit friends and join in family occasions, doing all the things she felt were important to do. Dr. Easterine's love for sports and games never left her. She kept detailed Excel sheets for World Cup Football, Cricket, and Tennis at Wimbledon, predicting the likely outcomes. She was working with these even during her final hospital admission.

The UK Alumni Association and the Friends of Vellore were a big part of her life. She served as Treasurer of both and Secretary of the Alumni Association, organising and maintaining contact with alumni, especially welcoming younger and newer members who were coming to the UK for study or work. Many alumni would remember her enthusiasm and hard work to organise the Golden Jubilee of the Association in the UK in 2022; this despite being on oxygen support for unrelenting chronic lung disease superimposed on congenital hypertrophic cardiomyopathy which finally carried her away.

Obituries

Dr. Easterine was a person who drove through life with zest, just like she drove her much-loved car. She never grumbled at 'the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune' but lived with exemplary courage, determination, generosity, and good humour. She will be greatly missed by many, many people.
