
Mr.Dhanasekar's Story

Mr. Dhanasekar a 38 year old man from Gambarajapuram Village has been an outpatient at CMC's Mental Health Centre from the age of 10. Coming from a low socio-economic background, his mother, a homemaker took special care of him with whatever little she could afford. She received support and counselling from the public health nurses who visit them frequently.

Unfortunately, Dhanasekar lost his mother on 1st August, 2021. Following her death, he was left to fend for himself. He stopped medication and was often seen walking around, looking unkempt and shabbily dressed. His condition was deteriorating at a quickening pace. Seeing his plight, the community nurses from CMC along with a psychiatrist began to take special care of him and slowly brought him back and set him back to his routine medication.

GREEN INITIATIVES

CMC VELLORE, RANIPET CAMPUS

- 40 to 50% of water demand sourced through recycled water
- 2 Units of 450 KLD STP plants installed
- Effluent waste to be treated in the 2 large rain water harvesting tanks with 2 lakh litre capacity to store the water
- 2 Megawatt solar panels installed 30% of demand sourced through internal solar panels
- Ranipet campus is committed to develop 15% (approx. 12 acres) of the total land area as greenbelt area by planting plants and shrubs.
- Committed to achieve "Zero Liquid Discharge" where all the water utilised is recycled and reused and no liquid effluent is discharged into open land surface/waterbody
- Completely eliminates the environmental pollution associated with water treatment





29-year-old Lokesh (name changed) is a pharmacist working in Chittoor. A month after he was married, he met with an accident. He not only injured his leg but developed severe deep vein thrombosis. A few days after he was discharged from the local hospital, he had pain in his chest and found it hard to breathe.

Lokesh was rushed to CMC Vellore and admitted in critical care immediately. While in the ICU he developed other complications, which meant longer stay in the ICU. Lokesh was worried, "How was I going to pay my medical bills. I barely have enough to support my wife and family." The doctors in the Pulmonary Department helped him by subsidising his bills. This was made possible by friends like you who give so we can bridge the gap for those who cannot afford treatment. It is for the many people like Lokesh that CMC Vellore aims to give the best care at the most effective cost. CMC provided free and subsidised treatment to the tune of Rupees 262.39 Crores.
