On the 20th of November, the College got together to celebrate the Graduation Day of Medical Broad Specialty and Master's postgraduates, as well as those who had successfully completed their Ph.Ds in 2023. The Chief Guest for the ceremony was the chairman of the Post Graduate Medical Education Board of the National Medical Commission, Dr. Vijay Oza. Also gracing the occasion as a special invitee was Dr. K. Senthil, Professor of Medicine at the Madurai Medical College and part time member of the PGMEB, NMC, New Delhi.

The ceremony began with the usual pomp and splendour of a procession of the traditional jasmine chain carried by the final year medical students and led by the student president Mr. Rishi John Mathew, and followed by the graduating batch and the faculty. The auditorium was packed with well-wishers and the ceremony was live streamed on the internet for viewing by friends and family near and far.

The Auditorium resounded with cheers for the silver and blue as the gathering sang the College song. Songs and prayers of invocation, blessings and best wishes for the postgraduates, charges and solemn pledges all came together to make the events special for the attendees.

In his address, Dr. Vijay Oza congratulated the postgraduates on their achievements and reminded them to remember the sacrifices made by their parents and families for them to reach this stage. He also reminded them of their responsibility to be torch bearers of CMC Vellore in the medical community. He cautioned them against greed and unnecessary intervention in the medical profession. 12th Professor Benjamin M. Pulimood Oration

The Departments of Infectious Diseases and Internal Medicine organised the “12th Professor Benjamin M. Pulimood” Oration on 1st December, 2023. Professor Benjamin M Pulimood provided a dedicated service to the institution for 37 years and became one of the first faculty to have completed a lifetime of service in the Department of Medicine. He is remembered by the Department of Medicine as a wonderful teacher and clinician and his patients as a compassionate physician.



The welcome address was given by Dr. Samuel Hansdak followed by Dr. Anand Zachariah who shared snippets of the life of Dr. Benjamin M Pulimood and the history of BMP oration. Felicitations were offered by the Principal and other senior professors.

Professor Neelika Malavige, Head of Dengue Global Program and Scientific Affairs (India), Drugs for Neglected Diseases initiative (DNDi), University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Sri Lanka delivered the oration “Recent advances in Dengue pathogenesis and treatment”.

Prof. Malavige is a well-recognised leader in the field of dengue. She is the Head at the Department of Immunology and Molecular Medicine, where her research focus on dengue was to find out the therapeutic targets, notably mediators of vascular leak, the role of antibodies in disease pathogenesis, and correlates of protection in dengue.

A plaque and citation were presented to Prof. Neelika Malavige for her pioneering contribution epitomising bench to bedside management of Dengue.



9th International Colorectal Symposium (ICRS 2023)

The 9th International Colorectal Symposium (ICRS 2023) was conducted by the Department of Surgery Unit-II (Colorectal Surgery) from 16th to 18th November, 2023 at the Sheraton Grand Hotel, Mahabalipuram. This year's theme was 'Colorectal Cancer: A Road Ahead'.

The conference featured 15 eminent international faculty from the United Kingdom, Australia, the United States of America, Brazil, and Sri Lanka. This conference was attended by 47 national faculty and 130 delegates from various prestigious medical institutions across India.



9th International Colorectal Symposium (ICRS 2023)

This conference comprised comprehensive scientific talks and discussions on early rectal cancer, advanced rectal cancer, colon cancer, peritoneal malignancy, recognition and salvage of intraoperative misadventures, and anastomotic health. There were live multidisciplinary tumour board discussions highlighting the nuances of managing colorectal cancer. Conference delegates participated in the decision-making at MDTs through live polls.



The conference also featured multiple interactive workshops. A Pelvic and Perineal anatomy workshop was conducted with the Department of Anatomy. A one-day Surgical Research Workshop was also conducted in conjunction with the NIHR Global Surgery South India Sub-Hub located at CMC Vellore. The conference also featured two workshops for radiologists: The rectal cancer MRI workshop led by Dr. Gina Brown from the UK and the FOXTROT colon cancer Radiology workshop led by Dr. Damian Tolan from the UK.

The two radiologists workshops were conducted using cloud-based pacs and anonymized full radiology colorectal cases on work stations. A half-day workshop on achieving mastery in surgical practice was conducted by eminent international faculty. Furthermore, a one-day State-level workshop on “Paradigm shift in Colorectal Nursing: The Leading Edge” was conducted by the Department of Surgical Nursing and CNE & Research, College of Nursing. The conference featured a special online address by Prof. Bill Heald, renowned for introducing total mesorectal excision in rectal cancer. He spoke on “Rectal cancer treatment in 2024”. Dr. Paul Barach gave the second keynote address on ‘Surgical Safety and Safe Systems’. Two patients who had battled and survived colorectal cancer shared their treatment experiences at Christian Medical College, Vellore, which provided insight into the patient's perspective of colorectal cancer treatment.

More than 40 delegates from various health institutions across India presented their research on Colorectal Cancer through Video and Poster presentations. Prize winners were felicitated with cash prizes and certificates. The symposium provided an invaluable opportunity to exchange knowledge and expertise in colorectal cancer, and the enthusiastic participation and appreciation from faculty and delegates underscored the event's success.



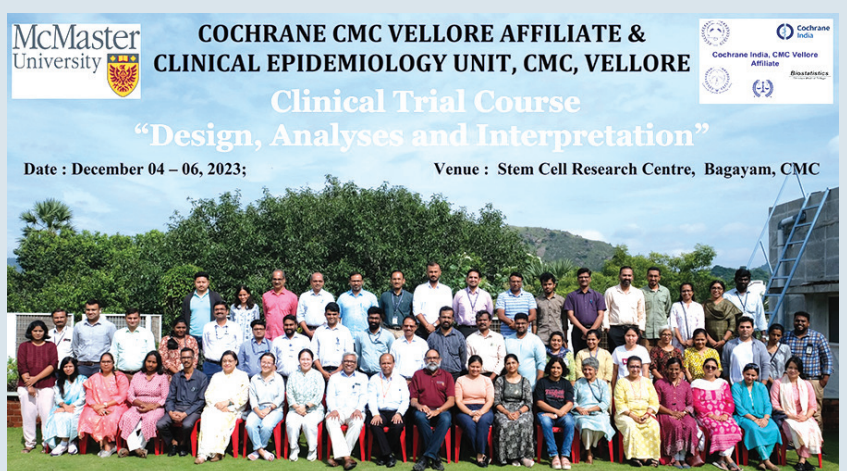
Medical Records Celebrates 153rd Birthday of Dr. Ida Scudder

Clinical Trials Workshop organised by Cochrane India CMC Vellore Affiliate

Cochrane India CMC Vellore affiliate in collaboration with McMaster University organised a 3-day Clinical trials workshop on “Design, analysis and interpretation” between 4th and 6th December, 2023 at Stem cell research centre auditorium, Rehab campus, Bagayam. The workshop began with an inauguration ceremony. Dr.Thambu David, Professor & Head of Medicine Unit-II, Director, Cochrane India CMC Vellore affiliate and the course co-ordinator delivered the welcome address. Chaplain, Ms. Saramma Kuruvilla inaugurated the workshop with a word of prayer. Dr. Vinod Thomas Abraham, Vice-principal (UG) delivered the chief guest’s address. Dr.L.Jeyaseelan, Professor of Biostatistics, Mohammad Bin Rashid University, Dubai, Adjunct Professor, Clinical Epidemiology Unit and Former Head, Department of Biostatistics, CMC, Vellore introduced the extramural faculties Dr. Shrikant Bangdiwala, Director and Professor of Biostatistics, Population Health Research Institute, McMaster University, Canada and Dr.Mahesh Iyer, Clinical Trial expert. Dr.Shrikant delivered an introductory talk on “Why do an RCT?”. The participants were from all over the country and had a diverse background including clinicians, statisticians, allied health and complimentary medicine practitioners. The faculty consisted of Dr.Shrikant Bangdiwala, Dr. L. Jeyaseelan, Dr. Mahesh Iyer and Dr.Thambu David. The topics covered were formulation of research questions and study designs, different phases of clinical trials, parallel, cross over, factorial, adaptive and to stage study designs, superiority and non-inferiority hypotheses, cluster randomisation, permuted block and optimised randomisation, sample size calculation, analysis of primary and secondary outcomes, stochastic curtailment, conditional power, early stopping of clinical trials, intention to treat and per protocol analysis. The workshop consisted of lectures and group activity. The workshop as well received by the participants.



American Heart Association - Advanced Cardiac Life Support (AHA ACLS) Provider level course

The AHA- ACLS provider level course was held on the 28th and 29th of November, 2023. This course is designed for healthcare providers (doctors, nurses, paramedics) who initiate advanced life care in acutely ill adults, beyond basic life support, through the stabilization or transport phases of adult emergency. This well Advanced Cardiac Life Support Course is accredited by the American Heart Association and is valid internationally. The number of participants is strictly restricted to 24 as per AHA guidelines. The ACLS faculty are Dr. Ekta Rai, Dr. Atul More, Dr. Sandeep, Dr Jonathan J and Dr. Divya. Twenty-four delegates had actively participated in this ACLS course.

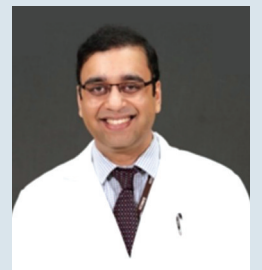

• **Dr. Sibhi Ganapathy** (MBBS batch of 1999) passed away on 24th November, 2023. Dr. Sibhi Ganapathy, a renowned neurosurgeon from Bengaluru (India) was a CMC MBBS alumni belonging to the batch of 1999. His untimely and unfortunate demise on 24th November, 2023 is a big blow to the CMC and neurosurgery family.



He was born on 9th June 1981 in Mumbai, Maharashtra and went on to complete his schooling at Modern High School in Dubai. During his sophomore days as a medical student at CMC, Dr. Sibhi was known as a multifaceted person with several talents. He was a brilliant Classical Hindustani musician and vocalist with a deep-rooted interest in singing myriad ragas, learning different styles of music, and witnessing concerts of legendary singers hailing from different gharanas. His beautiful voice resonated with the melodies of love, life and compassion. His Hindustani classical music performance at the music competition was a much-awaited event. His team won the best eastern classical music prize for his class three years in a row.

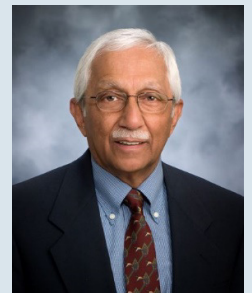
Dr. Sibhi was also a constant presence in all College Day and Easter Day plays. He was a brilliant actor, and his stand-out performances in plays, namely 'The Fiddler on the Roof' and 'My Fair Lady' are remembered even now by contemporaries. He was an excellent mimic, a fantastic emcee for any occasion, the life of any party, and a walking Encyclopaedia on World wars and the Indo-Pakistan wars. As a student, he was known for his love for airports, and he loved designing new futuristic ones. Despite his busy schedule managing numerous inter-batch and inter-house cultural activities, he always kept his academics from slipping and was always willing to help his classmates. His friends and batchmates remember him as a bright, charismatic, and loving individual who was always cheerful, helpful, full of life and a dependable friend.

After MBBS, Dr. Sibhi completed his MS in General Surgery from JSS Medical College, Mysore. Subsequently, he completed his MCh in Neurosurgery from KMC Manipal and earned his DNB in Neurosurgery in 2016. He then worked as a faculty member at St. John's Medical College, Bengaluru (India), where he taught and inspired many to delve into the field of neurosurgery.

The family reminisces about Dr. Sibhi as a gem and a remarkable individual whose life was a beacon of hope and brilliance to many and as a man of profound kindness and joy. He is remembered as a person who carried an infectious smile and exuded a great sense of humour that brightened the lives of everyone around him. Dr. Sibhi is survived by his wife, Dr. Divya, an Economist, and his Parents.

• **Dr. Sushil S. Lacy** (MBBS batch of 1954) passed away on 6th December, 2023. Dr. Sushil S. Lacy was born on 23rd August 1936, in Patna, India to Nora P. and Roger C. Lacy. After graduating from Christian Medical College in Vellore, he completed his General Surgery Residency in King George's Medical College in Lucknow, India. He went on to Duke University Medical Center in Durham, North Carolina in 1963 to do a Fellowship in Vascular Surgery. He then did his Urology Residency training at Baptist Hospital, Wake Forest University in Winston Salem, North Carolina. In 2012, he received the most outstanding achievement award as a graduate of the Urology programme.



Dr. Sushil married Ms. Jane Ellen Gose on August 5, 1967, at Highland Presbyterian Church in Winston Salem, North Carolina. They spent their first several years of marriage in North Carolina prior to moving to Nebraska.

In 1970, he joined the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) in Omaha and helped start the first Urology Residency training program in the state. He became a tenured Professor and was Senior Consultant in Surgery (Urology) at UNMC at the time of his retirement in 2014. He joined Urology, PC in Lincoln in 1980 and continued to be on the clinical faculty at UNMC. He was well known and admired for his teaching skills by medical students, nurses, and residents. He was a passionate advocate for his patients and was grateful for the appreciation and love he received, especially from parents of children he operated upon. He was highly respected by his medical colleagues as a surgeon.

He was actively involved at the State and National level with organized medicine. Dr. Lacy held the office of President of the Nebraska Urological Association and President of the South Central Section of the American Urological Association (AUA). He also served on the American Association of Clinical Urologist's (AACU) Board of Directors and was a Past President and Historian of this organization. He was elected President of the American Urological Association in 2011 and served on several committees over the years. He was Mentor to the AUA Leadership Classes and was extremely proud of the achievements of his mentees. In 2019, he was awarded the AUA Presidential Citation for exemplary service to the AUA, mentorship of young urologists and tireless care of urologic patients.

He was a member of the downtown Polemic Club, Country Club of Lincoln, and Westminster Presbyterian Church. Community service included volunteering at People's Health Clinic and the Board of Directors of the Lincoln Community Foundation. Dr. Sushil was an avid traveler and photographer. Starting at an early age, he went to all the continents except Antarctica and Oceania several times. Jane accompanied him on most of his trips. The photographs when reviewed on the desktop always made memories come ALIVE!

In his autobiography, "My Personal Odyssey: A Destiny Crafted in Heaven", he says all his achievements were because of God's blessings.

Dr. Sushil is survived by his wife of 56 years, Ms. Jane Gose Lacy; his children Rani Robinett of Kansas City, Missouri, Suzy (Bryant) Gourdie of Barrington, Illinois; and grandchildren Quinn Gourdie, Clare Gourdie, and Remi Robinett. He is also survived by his sister, Priti S.
