State Level Workshop on 'Nursing Management of Dermatological Disorders'

The Departments of Medical-Surgical Nursing Specialty III and CNE & Research, College of Nursing organised a state-level workshop on 'Nursing Management of Dermatological Disorders' on 8th December, 2023. The workshop commenced with a prayer, and a total of thirty-seven delegates from both within and outside the institution were in attendance. The primary objectives of the workshop were to enhance the awareness of nurses regarding dermatological disorders, provide evidence-based nursing care, motivate them to reduce



complications and improve their knowledge and skills in-home care and rehabilitation for patients with such disorders.

The sessions were covered by the faculty from the Departments of Dermatology, Dermatology Nursing College of Nursing, and College of Nursing, SMH, Ranipet. The topics covered were an overview of hand hygiene & universal precautions, dermatological emergencies, wound assessment & dressing, recognition and syndromic management of sexually transmitted infections, nursing care of patients with various dermatological disorders and psychological issues in dermatological disorders. There was also an interesting group discussion on case scenarios and hands-on sessions on medicated bath and topical application, wet wrap, skin allergen test, phototherapy and meeting nutritional needs. The Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council awarded 7 credit points for the workshop.

Symposium organised by Department of Biochemistry

The Department of Biochemistry hosted a scientific symposium titled, 'Iron Homeostasis in Women and the Perinatal Period: from Epidemiology to Molecular Mechanisms and Clinical Trials' on 23rd and 24th November 2023. The meeting brought together eminent experts from all over the world to highlight the most recent insights in this niche area. The speakers included Alexander Drakesmith (University of Oxford, UK), Amanda Wendt (Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact, Germany), Anura Kurpad (St. John's Medical College, Bengaluru, India), Clive Petry (University of Cambridge, UK), Elizabeta Nemeth (University of California, Los Angeles [UCLA], USA), Janine Felix (Erasmus MC, The Netherlands), Martina Muckenthaler (Heidelberg University Hospital, Germany), Max Gassmann (University of Zürich, Switzerland), Michael Zimmermann (ETH, Zurich, Switzerland and University of Oxford, UK), Molly Jacob (Christian Medical College, Vellore, India), Samira Lakhan-Littleton (University of Oxford, UK) and Sant-Rayn Pasricha (The Walter and Eliza Hall Institute [WEHI] of Medical Research, Melbourne, Australia).

The symposium was held in a hybrid mode, with talks covering various areas of public health importance. They included an overview of the physiology and regulation of iron homeostasis in the body, iron kinetics in the body, and links between iron status and immunity, with a special focus on pregnancy and the perinatal period. They covered epidemiological aspects of the effects of iron exposure on the fetus, maternal determinants of iron endowment in the fetus and outcomes of pregnancy, and issues related to iron supplementation in pregnancy. The talks were targeted to an audience of researchers, clinicians, academics and trainees in medicine and biomedical sciences, with special interests in iron homeostasis in women and the peripartum period. The symposium was awarded credit points in its category by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai, India.

The event also included poster presentations; the prize winners are listed below:

1st **prize** - **Mr. Jannik Langbein**, visiting research scholar from the University of Heidelberg in the Department of Biochemistry

2nd prize - Ms. Ranita De, Ph.D trainee, Department of Hematology

3rd prize - Dr. Padmanaban V, Associate Professor, Department of Biochemistry

This symposium was one of several academic activities on a collaborative research grant from the Deutscher Academischer Austauschdienst (DAAD) (German Academic Exchange Service), awarded jointly (from 2019 to 2023) to Prof. Molly Jacob, Department of Biochemistry, CMC Vellore, India and Prof. Martina Muckenthaler, Heidelberg University Hospital, Germany. The grant supported research work in the Indian and German teams, and also enabled the exchange of trainees between the 2 institutions, resulting in fruitful collaborations and robust research links.



Wheelchair Basketball Training Programme

The Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation's (PMR) Prosthetic and Orthotic Services (P&O), with the support of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), collaborated with the Wheelchair Basketball Federation of India (WBFI) to conduct a wheelchair basketball training programme on 12th December 2023, in honour of the "International Day of Persons with Disabilities." The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) has been in collaboration with Prosthetic and Orthotic Services of PMR for over 27 years.

The primary aim of this programme was to propagate disability sports and promote the inclusion of persons with disabilities through sports. The programme saw the participation of nine professionals from Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Prosthetics and orthotics, and fifteen wheelchair users (10 Men and 5 Women), who had received treatment in a Rehabilitation Institute. Mr. Louis George Meprath and Mr. Thayumana Subramaniam experienced coaches from the women's and men's teams; Indian Wheelchair basketball, Wheelchair Basketball Federation of India (WBFI) were present at the event. The training sessions took place in two sessions. The first session was for rehab professionals, focusing on the players' classification system basics, ergonomic principles, game violations, and foul plays. The second session was for wheelchair users, focusing on sports wheelchair propelling techniques, passing techniques, and game-planning techniques. The event ended with a friendly game on the College Campus wheelchair basketball court.

World Diabetes Day Events

In commemoration of World Diabetes Day 2023, the Department of Endocrinology, Diabetes & Metabolism organised an exhibition and poster competition titled 'Stroke and Diabetes' on 28th November 2023 at the CMC Hospital Campus on the theme, 'Access to Diabetes Care'.

The Departments of Cardiology, Ophthalmology, Nephrology, Physiotherapy, Prosthetics & Orthotics, Dietetics and Community Health Nursing, along with the Department of Endocrinology, Diabetes & Metabolism put up stalls which disseminated awareness about diabetes, its complications and the scope for its prevention. Screening for diabetes was performed for 225 patients followed by foot and eye examinations. The patients also enjoyed a



puppet show and games which served to reinforce the message. A lucky draw was conducted for all registered patients and the six winners were given glucometers.

The exhibition began with a word of prayer by Rev. Rev. Samson Varghese. Dr. Rajesh, Medical Superintendent, CMC Vellore was the Chief Guest for the day. He spoke about the importance of exercise, lifestyle modification and importance of strictly following the physician's medication.

Posters were judged by Dr. Saumya Susan, Assistant Professor from PMR, Mr. Pierre Edwin, Tutor Gr-I, from Physiotherapy and Mrs. Rebecca Sumathi Bhai from Nursing.

CME on the Foot in Diabetes organised by the Department of Endocrinology, Diabetes & Metabolism

The Department of Endocrinology, Diabetes & Metabolism hosted a CME on 'The Foot in Diabetes', at Wheeler Hall, CMC Town Campus, on 12th December 2023. Dr. Jachin Velavan, Associate Director, Missions, CMC Vellore was the Chief Guest; she graced the webinar through zoom. The proceedings began with a word of prayer from Chaplain Saramma, followed by the welcome address, delivered by Dr. Nihal Thomas, Senior Professor, Department of Endocrinology.

Dr. Zulfigarali G. Abbas, President, of D-Foot International, the apex body for insight on the diabetic foot, was the keynote speaker on the occasion, presenting a comprehensive lecture that served to accentuate "Insights into the guidelines for infection and the diabetic foot". Dr. Prabhu Premkumar, Professor, Department of Vascular Surgery, spoke about the early diagnosis of peripheral arterial disease in diabetic foot infections. He discussed the deadly triad of neuropathy, trauma and vascular disease and the effect of their interplay on the foot in diabetes, and highlighted the principle of 'doing as much as required and as little as possible' when it comes to surgical management of vascular disease in diabetes. Dr. Emmanuel Lazarus, Associate Professor, General Surgery, Unit-I, presented an overview on "Lower limb Necrotising Fasciitis" addressing the various aspects of this tricky condition, subtle in onset, that progresses rapidly and results in high mortality. Dr. Emmanuel illustrated the importance of early intervention and approaching each case with a high index of suspicion. Dr. Felix Jebasingh, Professor, Department of Endocrinology, began his talk on "The primary prevention of foot ulcers: it's not that straightforward", by emphasising that pain is a gift; a protective sensation that is lost to diabetes. Dr. Felix discussed the set of conditions affecting the skin, bone and nails that need to be identified and meticulously managed to arrest progression to ulcer formation and ultimately amputation if left unchecked. The session ended with a presentation by Mrs. Bharathi, Charge nurse & Diabetes Educator, Department of Endocrinology, on the "Secondary prevention of ulcers: it's what you wear". Using visual aids, Mrs. Bharathi demonstrated the principles and practices that govern offloading of the diabetic foot, to improve the patient outcome.

A panel of specialists presided over the CME event, supplementing the lectures with their expert commentary: the chairpersons included Dr. Cecil Thankachan Thomas, Deputy Director (Promotion & Publicity) and Acting Head, Surgery Unit-I, Dr. Shashank Lamba, Professor and Head, Plastic Surgery Unit-I and Dr. Bobeena Rachel Chandy, Professor of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation.

15th International Short Course in Clinical Tropical Medicine

The Department of Infectious Diseases in collaboration with the Departments of Wellcome Microbiology and Clinical Microbiology and Clinical Virology hosted the 15th International Short Course in Clinical Tropical Medicine from 20th November -2nd December 2023 at IDTRC. Twenty-five students (including 8 Indians and 17 International) attended the two-week long course which offered lectures, clinical bedside session and laboratory practicals in bacteriology, virology, parasitology and mycology.

Expertise was offered by international faculty from the McGill University Canada, Haukeland University, Albert Einstein College of Medicine New York, University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Sri Lanka and NIMHANS Bangalore.

Faculty of CMC Vellore from the departments of Wellcome Microbiology. Clinical Microbiology, Virology, Child Health III, Neurology, Medicine, Dermatology, SLRTC Karigiri, CHAD and Infectious Diseases contributed actively to the learning process. This course was started in 2007 and has received tremendous appreciation from the participants and so far, 125 Indians and 235 International students have been trained in the different aspects of Tropical Medicine. The feedback has been extremely positive and we hope to continue this programme in the following years with active participation from the CMC faculty.

Obituaries

• **Dr. Bonam Wesley** (MBBS batch of 1972), passed away on 17th December, 2023. Dr Bonam Wesley was born on 10th October 1951. His earlier education was in the mission schools. Dr. Wesley excelled both in academics and sports. He was awarded "The President Scout Certificate" by former president of India, Dr. S Radhakrishnan in 1964. He graduated (B.Sc in Zoology) before he joined MBBS in Christian Medical College, Vellore in 1972.



After medical graduation, Dr. Wesley joined Mary Lott Lyles (MLL) Hospital, Madanapalle in 1981. There he worked with Dr. Vander Arde who trained him as a surgeon. He then took over as the Medical Superintendent of CSI Campbell Hospital, Jammalamadugu at a very difficult time. Depending on God, he worked hard despite the difficulties he faced and placed the institution on a firm footing. In 1990, he took over as Director of Arogyavaram Medical Centre (AMC), Arogyavaram, which initially was a sanatorium for patients with tuberculosis.

Dr. Wesley was a multifaceted Surgeon adept at General Surgery, Obstetric and Gynaecological surgery and ENT. He also took care of patients with medical problems. He was kind and compassionate to his patients.

In all the three mission hospitals, he strove to increase the range of services provided and to improve the quality of care. He led by example. He was doing on call duties throughout his service. He would take on difficult obstetric cases referred to mission hospital and manage them efficiently. He was the quintessential, mission hospital doctor able to manage most cases that presented to him, through the training he received from his Alma Mater and later the surgical training he received at MLL Hospital.

At a time when polio residual paralysis cases were plenty, Dr Wesley in collaboration with the Orthopaedic Department of CMC, Vellore held polio camps. Through these camps many patients underwent reconstructive surgery and were fitted with calipers to make them ambulant. His organizational skills in conducting these camps from advertisement to postoperative care were exceptional.

During his tenure at Arogyavaram Medical Centre he worked tirelessly for the cause of tuberculosis. While the main hospital functioned as a secondary and tertiary care for management of tuberculosis, he strengthened the DOTS program for tuberculosis in the field. He initiated a number of new strategies and innovative approaches for control of tuberculosis in the communities around. He placed AMC back on the map of India as a center of excellence for care of tuberculosis. He provided leadership in this regard influencing policy both at the state and national level. He received many awards within and outside the country for his and AMC's work in tuberculosis.

At AMC, he initiated in collaboration with NACO, SAMARTH project (Strengthen the Ability to Manage and Respond effectively to HIV/AIDS) which is a training program for Doctors, Nurses & Pastors in HIV/AIDS. This programme takes care of a desperate need for help of HIV/AIDS patients in Chittoor District and surrounding backward areas. AMC also runs an Ophthalmology outreach programme and home for polio affected children and school for deaf mute children. The rehabilitation center employs patients, in farming, carpentry, tailoring and handloom weaving.

He was an active member of Christian Medical Association of India (CMAI) serving as Chair-person of its Doctors' Association and on various committees strengthening the work of the organization.

At AMC he added 'College of Nursing' while continuing to run the Diploma in Nursing program. This has helped in care of patients and also contributed to the trained pool of nursing professionals in the country.

He established a Molecular Biology Laboratory (BSL -2) which does research in molecular aspects of tuberculosis both hospital based and community based. The laboratory works in collaboration with Cornell University, USA. The laboratory has already published many papers in peer reviewed journals.

During his student days, Dr Wesley represented CMC, Vellore and Vellore Division in hockey, playing as a goal keeper. He won many tournaments with the College team. He is a good chess player.

- Certificate for Meritorious Service' in 2008 awarded by his Alma Mater for those working in the mission field.
- Awarded with The Certificate of Medical Excellence in Rural India, by Association of College of Chest Physicians, by former President Zail Singh in the year 1992.
- Paul Harris Fellow in the year 1996 by Rotary International.
- Award with "Prominent Non Profit Professional Executive in India" by the Global Network, Singapore in the year 2000.
- Awarded with "Rajiv Gandhi Excellency Award" in the field of Medical Sciences in the year 2001.

Mrs. Sheila Wesley, his dear wife is the Principal of Nursing College in AMC. His children - Vincent works as a hospital Administrator, Richard is a Medical doctor and Christina, heads the Molecular Biology Laboratory.

Dr. Wesley was a devout, committed Christian who had completely surrendered to the will of God, serving Him throughout his life. He was a simple, unassuming, humble kind, compassionate person, who had a powerful influence and impact on bringing up three mission hospitals, who was a blessing to many patients and who to his Master is a "Well done thou good and faithful servant".
