**Dr. Vrisha Madhuri** entered the portals of CMC for her MBBS course in 1975. She was one among 6 in her family with 4 sisters and 2 brothers and came to Vellore from Delhi. She joined the Orthopaedic department as a Non-PG registrar and went on to do her MS in Orthopaedics which she completed in 1986. She was among the 1<sup>st</sup> woman candidates to pursue her career in Orthopaedics in CMC and the country at large. She joined the Department of Orthopaedics Unit-II as a lecturer in 1986 after completing her MS Orthopaedic course.

For her higher education she went to Liverpool, UK and completed her M.Ch between 1991- 1994. During this period, she held training posts in South Tyneside District Hospital- St. Helen's, Whiston Hospital, Middlesborough and Shotleybridge Hospital and completed her M.Ch (Orth) from Liverpool, U.K. in 1994.

She joined back in 1995 and went on to become one of the 1<sup>st</sup> woman professors of Orthopaedics in 1997. She was interested in Paediatric Orthopaedics after her training stint in the UK from 2004 onwards and was fully devoted to doing children's orthopaedics. She went on to hold many national and international workshops/conferences in paediatric orthopaedics

- the 1<sup>st</sup> POSI POSNA (12<sup>th</sup> POSICON) conference was held at CMC Vellore in 2006 with several leading International faculty including Prof. Kaye E Wilkins (USA), Dr. Sanjeev Sabharwal (USA), Dr. Elhanan Bar-on (Israel), Dr. Noam Bor (Israel) and Dr. Unni Narayanan (Canada).

On 14<sup>th</sup> August 2007, the Paediatric Orthopaedic unit was formed under her leadership as a separate unit under Orthopaedics. The 1<sup>st</sup> International AO Paediatric course was held in 2009 at CMC, Vellore and included faculty such as Teddy Slongo from Switzerland. Paediatric Orthopaedics was a major component and featured prominently during the TNOACON 2012 state-level conference held in CMC, Vellore under the chairmanship of Dr. Ravi Korula.

She was instrumental in starting the Post-doctoral fellowship in Paediatric Orthopaedics which was of 2 years duration and got affiliation with the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in 2009. The Paediatric Orthopaedic International fellowship (1-year duration) programme was also started in 2016 and trainees from Afghanistan, Africa and other under-developed countries were the beneficiaries of this fellowship.

Her interest in basic research developed and she received her first external grant from DBT for, “Treatment of large segmental bone defects with custom made triphasic hydroxyapatite scaffolds loaded with mesenchymal stem cells in children” in 2009.

The large animal facility housed in the Bagayam Campus owes a debt of gratitude to Dr. Vrisha for initiating large animal experiments at the Centre for Stem Cell Research, Bagayam. Other projects included autologous chondrocyte transplantation and bone scaffold with mesenchymal stem cells along with collaboration with DBT, Govt. of India.

She was appointed as an Adjunct Scientist in CSCR in 2015. During this time, she also went on to do research in Musculoskeletal Stem cells in tissue regeneration. She went on to hold the position of Secretary of the Paediatric Orthopaedic Society of India (POSI) and later became the President of POSI between 2014 to 2017.

She held the “Ida Scudder Chair for Clinical Research” from 2020 onwards.

She also guided PhD candidates in CSCR for their work involving chondrocyte culture and treatment of large segmental bone defects with custom-made triphasic hydroxyapatite scaffolds loaded with mesenchymal stem cells in children.

She procured an external Indo-Swedish (DBT +VINNOVA) grant for transplantation of fetal liver mesenchymal stem cells in patients with severe Osteogenesis imperfecta in 2016 and went on to complete this transplantation along with Dr. Cecilia Gotherstrom from Karolinska Institute, Sweden in August 2020.

She was instrumental in forming the Fibrousdysplasia Ossificans Progressive (FOP) society - a disabling condition where muscle, tendon and ligaments get converted into the bone and has the largest series in the world with patients of FOP. She was also the Director of the Global Initiative for Children's Surgery in collaboration with the Royal College of Surgeons, United Kingdom between 2018 and 2024 which aims to train paediatric surgeons, paediatric anaesthetists and paediatric nurses for district hospitals in South India.

She also has more than 100 publications to her credit and has authored several chapters in textbooks. She also has delivered many Orations including the Mercer Rang Oration, John S Carman Oration, and the POSI Oration in 2023 at Bhubaneshwar. She also has several patents to her credit including a sphincter force sensor, a stimulation device and brace assembly for clubfoot.

She is married to Dr. Noel Walter who also belongs to the undergraduate batch of 1975 and retired from CMC Vellore as Professor of Forensic Medicine in 2018. They are blessed with a son Mr. Ajith, an Environmental Engineer who is married to Ms. Priyanka.

As she embarks on a well-deserved retirement, we extend our deepest gratitude for her dedication and years of service of more than 40 years. Her impact on the institution, community and the country at large is immeasurable, and we join the CMC family in expressing our profound gratitude.

## 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Geriatric CME

The 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Geriatric CME, jointly organised by the Departments of Geriatrics and Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, was held on 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2024. The theme for the CME was, “Management of Diabetes Mellitus in the Older Adult – An Allied Health Perspective”. This CME was accredited by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and awarded 10 CME credit points and was attended by seventy participants from different parts of the country.

Rev. Mani Bhushan Das, Department of Chaplaincy, started the CME with a word of prayer followed by a prayer song by the students of Physiotherapy. Dr. Gopinath KG, Professor and Head of Geriatrics welcomed the gathering and introduced the theme of the CME, followed by a Chief Guest address by Dr. Anand Zachariah, Professor of the Department of Medicine, CMC Vellore. Dr. Henry Prakash, Prof. & Head of PMR Unit-II and Mr. Andrew Babu, Prof. & Head of Physiotherapy, felicitated the gathering and encouraged the participants to have an enjoyable learning experience. Ms. Divya Evangeline V, Tutor PT, delivered the vote of thanks.

A pre-test was conducted by Mr. Samuel, PT, followed by a series of talks by the Geriatric rehabilitation team. The talks included, “Overview of Diabetes Mellitus in Older Adults” by Dr. K.G. Gopinath, “Complications in Diabetes Mellitus” by Dr. V Surekha, senior Professor in Geriatrics, “Exercise Prescription in Older Adults” by Ms. Merlyn Tilak, Assoc. Professor in Physiotherapy, “PA shoulder and Physiotherapy management” by Ms. Divya Evangeline V, “Overcoming stress and Handling Impairments” by Mr. Earnest Rajapandian, Tutor OT, “Prosthetics and Orthotics in Diabetic Foot” by Mr. Arul Thomas, Tutor P&O, and “Signs and symptoms and Management of Hypoglycaemia” by Ms. Teresa Gnanakumari, Nurse educator in Geriatrics.

The afternoon sessions were more interactive, combined with practical demonstrations which included “Foot Sensory Evaluation and Orthotic Management for Foot Ulcers” by Mr Arul Thomas, “Insulin Delivery, Glucometer, and Insulin Storage” by Ms. Teresa Gnanakumari, “Physical Activity and Exercises” by Mr. Earnest Philemon Dass, Physiotherapist, and “Diabetes Diet: Creating a Healthy Diet Plan” by Ms. Manimegalai B, Senior Lecturer, Dietetics.

The CME ended with post-test and valedictory by Ms. Merlyn Tilak. The CME was very informative and beneficial for the participants.



## State Level Workshop on 'Care of Wounds: Unwrapping Evidences'

The Departments of Surgical Nursing and CNE & Research, College of Nursing conducted a state-level workshop on 'Care of Wounds: Unwrapping Evidence' on 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2024. The workshop commenced with a word of prayer. A total of 44 delegates from 3 different states attended the workshop. The objectives of the workshop for nurses were to elaborate on the essence of wound management and to provide updates on recent trends in wound care to enhance their knowledge and skills in caring for various types of wounds.

The sessions were covered by the faculty from the Departments of Surgical Nursing, College of Nursing, CMC Vellore and faculty from Apollo Hospitals, Chennai.

The topics covered were:

- physiology of wound healing and factors,
- types of wounds,
- wound assessment,
- recent trends in wound care.

The Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council awarded 8 credit points for the workshop.



## CME on Rational Use of Antibiotics

The Departments of Infectious Diseases and Continuing Medical Education conducted a CME on Rational Use of Antibiotics on 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2024.

Dr. Selwin Selva Kumar introduced the speakers and moderated the CME. Dr. Prasanna Kumar spoke on the principles and core elements of antibiotic stewardship, and Dr. Anupa Thampy stressed the need for a syndromic approach to antibiotic use. Dr. Balaji V. emphasised the role of antibiogram in selecting empirical antibiotics. At the same time, Dr. Kamini Walia, Senior Scientist, Division of Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases, ICMR, provided a brief presentation on the macro-level challenges encountered in implementing national, regional, and facility-wide antibiotic stewardship programmes.

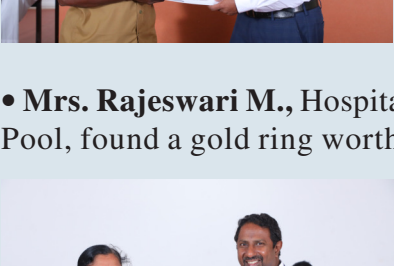

## Obituaries

• **Dr. Ravi Kumar Baer Philip** (MBBS batch of 1970), passed away on 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2024. Dr. Ravi Kumar Baer Philip, was born on 22nd September 1953 as the eldest son of Dr. Baer David Livingston and Mrs. Danamma Garu. He did his schooling in Tadepalligudem and PUC at AC College, Guntur. He was admitted to the MBBS batch of CMC Vellore in 1970. During his undergraduate studies he was a good student and participated enthusiastically in the activities of the college and hostel. After his undergraduate studies, he worked in the hospitals of the Leprosy mission in Parvathipuram and Salur. He qualified DTM&H from Liverpool, and then underwent the MD Community Medicine course in CMC during the years 1987 to 1990. During that time, initially he lived in Vellore town with his family, and later, during the final year, moved into the CHAD Hospital campus. He was strong academically, but kept a low profile compared to his batchmates of the MD course. Dr. Ravi Kumar was simple and unassuming, yet always approachable and helpful. His children Kiran and Chinnu were a familiar sight on the campus. Despite facing several problems, including his son Chinnu's impending cardiac surgery, Dr. Ravi Kumar was always calm and balanced. He was assessed the best student in his MD batch, and the examiners were impressed by the depth of his knowledge of the subject. As a result, he was offered a faculty position in CMC. He declined this offer as he wanted to return to his work with the Leprosy Mission.



Dr. B.P. Ravi Kumar will be remembered in The Leprosy Mission as a clinician and a teacher and a sincere Christian, who provided leadership in many areas of the Mission's work. He embodied and practiced all the values of his alma mater (CMC). In his role as a teacher, he taught clinical leprosy, the immunology of leprosy and also, the epidemiology of leprosy.

He could easily switch perspective from patient to community to the individual patient and further to microscopic concepts and back again at will. His concepts were clear and he could communicate them to any kind of audience.

He was an able administrator, working as the Medical Superintendent of The Leprosy Mission Hospital in Parvathipuram and then Philadelphia Leprosy Hospital in Salur and still later Richardson Leprosy Hospital in Miraj. He served as the ILEP Co-ordinator for Chattisgarh State under the National Leprosy Eradication Programme and also served a term as Deputy Director (Medical) of the Leprosy Mission Trust India.

As a conscientious clinician, Dr. Ravi Kumar always made it a point to see his patients daily, both in the out-patient clinic and in the wards, despite all his administrative responsibilities.

He constantly honed his clinical skills by reading regularly, treating patients with compassion and teaching the younger medical officers and other staff. He was an international consultant for the World Health Organisation, and worked as a teacher for the leprosy division of Nagaland in India and as a trainer in Uzbekistan.

After a lifetime of service to persons with Leprosy, he left TLMTI in 2008 to join Mamata Medical College in Khammam, Andhra Pradesh (now Telangana State) as a Professor of Social & Preventive Medicine and rose to become head of the department there. He was very passionate about teaching and earned much respect from his colleagues and love from the students for his knowledge and his humble and friendly nature. His work was recognised and he was the recipient of several national awards.

He was a Bible scholar, ecumenical in his outlook and he undertook several courses in theology and was ordained in 2001. As a person of faith he lost no opportunity in teaching from the Bible and conducting worship sessions frequently for the staff and for the local community and the churches which he served.

After retirement he moved to Chirala to stay with his younger son and succumbed to cancer on the 14<sup>th</sup> of January 2024. He is survived by his wife Mrs. Ratna Kumari, M.Sc, Nursing College Principal, and two sons Dr. B.J.L Kiran Kumar, Professor of Cardiology in CMC Ludhiana and Mr. B.J.L Arun Kumar a Physiotherapy teacher.
