Rotary & CMC Vellore Inaugurate 'Helping Hands' for Poor Patients

Rotary Club of Vellore Fort is partnering with CMC Vellore's Low Cost Effective Care Unit (LCECU) to improve health outcomes for people of economically disadvantaged communities of Vellore Town through project 'Helping Hands'. In partnership with Rotary Club of Niles, Chicago, the Helping Hands grant of Rupees 11 lakh will support 22 patients in need of the specialised tertiary care in the CMC Town Campus. Rotary has also gifted a portable ultrasound machine of Rupees 19 lakh which will be used for patients in the Ida Scudder ward at the Schell Campus of CMC.

Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director, CMC Vellore, along with Rtn. P. Bharanidharan, District Governor inaugurated the project on 26th January 2024. Dr. Vikram emphasised that CMC is committed to outreach and to serving poor, marginalised communities. Rtn. C.K. Satish, President of Rotary club of Vellore Fort. welcomed all the delegates and Rtn. Cyriac Lukose, President of Rotary Club of Niles, Chicago, reiterated the Rotary motto of service above self.

LCECU, a unit of CMC Vellore, runs a 48-bed facility that provides in-patient, out-patient and 24-hour emergency care for the lower socio-economic and disadvantaged communities of Vellore Town.
