Dr. Mary Verghese, a trailblazer in the field of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation in India established the Rehabilitation institute in Bagayam, Vellore and Dr. Suranjan Bhattacharji played a pivotal role in initiating the Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) Mela in 1994 and the Brain injury Mela in 2004.

This year the PMR team organised the 21st Brain injury Mela on the 10th of February and the 31st SCI Mela from February 16st to 18th. There were 75 persons with Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) and 240 persons with SCI who underwent comprehensive assessment by the medical team with appropriate investigations such as blood tests, ultrasound, cystoscopy, and CMGs. The Psychiatry Unit-III team assessed and planned interventions for the neuro-behavioural sequelae following brain injury. There were vibrant peer interactions and professional guidance from the physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, psychologist and social workers as they shared their challenges and success with mutual snippets of advises and encouragement from their journey. Additionally, there were provisions for the maintenance of their mobility aids and orthosis through the Prosthetic and Orthotic team and Worth trust organisation.

Many of the patients with SCI resided at the Mary Verghese Trust campus with their relatives and participated in art and cultural activities. On the second day of SCI Mela, formal sports competitions were organized for the SCI alumni, caregivers, staff, and students. Following this Mrs.J.Indhumathi, Head of College Maintenance, CMC, distributed the prizes and the keynote address was given by Mrs.Noeline, Regional Senior Manager for Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu. In the afternoon, Mr. Ramani, the General Manager from the District Industrial Centre in Vellore, led a session on "financial support for self-employment for persons with disabilities," underscoring the empowerment of individuals with disability. Furthermore, a wheelchair basketball match was conducted at the CMC Bagayam Campus to highlight the skills of athletes with disability. Dr. I. Rajesh, the Medical Superintendent, CMC felicitated the players and inaugurated the wheel chair basketball match with a key note address. The day concluded with a talent show by the SCI alumni.

The third day was focused on psycho-spiritual activities, peer counselling, health education, and drawing and rangoli

competitions. Dr. Solomon Sathish Kumar, Principal and Chief guest for the Valedictory function congratulated the PMR team for living out the motto of the institution to empower others through God's love and carrying each other's burden. This was followed by a grand presentation of cultural programme by the Rehab Family.

Both the Rehab Melas provided an opportunity for persons with spinal cord injury and brain injury along with their caregivers to gather, create bonds, share experiences, renew friendships receive quality medical check-ups, discuss relevant socio-economic issues, link to resources and showcase their talents.

33rd Childhood and Adolescent Diabetes Support Group Camp

The Paediatric Endocrinology division and Department of Paediatrics organized the "33rd Childhood and Adolescent Diabetes Support Group Camp" on February 3, 2024, at Sneha Deepam in Vellore. The camp aimed to empower children living with Type-1 Diabetes Mellitus (T1DM), and it was attended by 114 children along with their families. Children with T1DM are dependent on insulin for survival (minimum of four injections per day) and multiple finger pricks (3 to 7) daily to monitor blood glucose levels for optimal glycemic control.

Members of the Paediatric Endocrine team and the Dietary Department organized various workstations covering different aspects of diabetes management.

During the event, individuals who were previously diagnosed with type 1 diabetes (T1DM) and are now adults, had an interactive session with families where they shared their success stories and struggles. It was a great source of encouragement and inspiration for the families. After lunch, the Paediatric Endocrine and Child Health-1 team members used role-play to convey important messages about T1DM management at school and home, which was both entertaining and educational. Additionally, the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry team interacted with the adolescents to discuss mental health concerns. Colouring and drawing competitions were held and prizes were distributed. All the children received gifts.



The camp was supported by funds raised at the following fundraising events: "Give for Diabetes" sale at town campus on 25th November 2023 and 5K "Run for Diabetes" fun-run at Bagayam campus on 2nd December 2023. The team is grateful to all the people who contributed towards this noble cause.



She practiced the motto of her Alma Mater "Not to be ministered unto but to minister" to her best, both in the corporate and mission health fields.

She had such a passion for mission work that, CSI, Karimnagar Diocese requested her to represent them as a member of CMC, Vellore Council. She loved to come for the Council meetings and felt proud of her College. She would interact especially with those working in the Mission hospitals, discussing the nuances of running these institutions ending with her encouragement to all.

She was the life of her batch re-unions with a lively and loving spirit. She carefully planned reunion entertainments months in advance and she was the leader of batch shows on stage. She was one of the few who made it a point to always bring along mementoes for all her batchmates. She brought everyone together in the batch groups with her affection, care and concern, which was touching.

Her indomitable spirit and positive attitude were seen at their best in how she faced the last three and half years fighting a health problem. Despite her difficulties during this period, her spirit could never be quenched even as she fought bravely. She even did 'Wordle' on the class group at 1.00 am on 4th February just at the commence of a massive stroke from which she never recovered, notably the first word she guessed was "ADIEU" which her daughter helped her to type out. We realised only later that this was her most glorious and honorable way of saying goodbye to her beloved CMC wordle mates and loved ones.

Dr. Rita was a person of deep faith in God, which she believed must be practiced in works. This she amply demonstrated during her life to patients, classmates, colleagues, friends and everyone she came across.

She has a loving family – fully devoted husband, Mr. Aufry John Joseph and her daughters, Ms. Philomeena Daphne Joseph, (Translational Medicine Geneticist and Scientist) and Dr. Christina Marie Joseph (CMC MBBS batch of 2007, MS Orthopaedics 2018). She doted on her family. She was proud of her daughter's achievements. She received overflowing love and care from her family and had all three of them around her and by her side till her last breath.

Dr. Rita left us grieving, but she left us a legacy of love, faith, commitment, courage and perseverance even to the end. She is now safe in the arms of Jesus. Safe on His gentle breast. May her soul rest in peace.
