Workshop on Constructing Multiple Choice Questions

The multiple-choice question (MCQ) is the most common type of written test item used in the undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate health professional education. Because a large number of MCQs can be developed for a given content area, MCQs can be used to assess a broad range of knowledge in a short period of time. Though there are some draw backs in the use of MCQs, appropriately constructed MCQs result in objective testing that can measure knowledge, comprehension, application, and analysis. Apart from being widely used in class tests and board exams, MCQs are integral part of many entrance examinations. Flawed MCQs interfere with accurate and meaningful interpretation of test scores and negatively affect the test takers pass rates. Therefore to develop reliable and valid tests, items constructed must be free of flaws.

Knowledge and skill in construction of MCQs are very much essential for nursing faculty who are involved in constructing MCQs and conducting examinations. To enhance their potential, the Department of CNE & Research has taken effort to organize a one day workshop on construction of quality MCQs.

- Recognize the importance of Multiple Choice Questions as an objective method of evaluation
- Explain the purposes of testing and principles of test construction
- Describe the concept of Multiple Choice Questions with emphasis on the types, parts, strengths and limitations
- Identify common errors when writing multiple choice items
- Develop skill in construction of quality MCQs, applying the principles / guidelines
- Explore on the validity and reliability of test items
- Appreciate the value of item analysis
