Dr. Vivi Miriam Srivastava Retires



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Dr. Vivi Miriam Srivastava retired from Christian Medical College Vellore as Senior Professor on the 25th of July, 2024 after decades of memorable service in the Departments of General Pathology and Cytogenetics. Dr. Vivi was born in 1959. Dr. Vivi is the third of four sisters, two of whom are alumni. Dr. Elizabeth Mathew is from the batch of 1964, and Dr. Rebecca Susan Mathew is from the batch of 1966. Dr. Vivi joined CMC Vellore as part of the MBBS batch of 1976. After passing out, she worked as a demonstrator in the departments of Clinical Pathology, Physiology, and General Pathology, and subsequently completed her MD in Pathology from the institution in 1990. After completing her post-graduation, Dr. Vivi worked in Sydney for three years and in 1993 joined as faculty in General Pathology. While in Sydney, she had worked in Cytology and consequently brought new life to CMC's cytology service by starting the practice of Diff Quik staining at the bedside to check for adequacy of cytology specimens, a procedure which brought great joy to surgeons and pathologists alike. A stickler for detail and a perfectionist, her opinion was sought by clinicians and pathologists alike when any biopsy was sent to the department. Dr. Vivi underwent training in cytogenetics through a UICC fellowship at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Institute. She supplemented this training with observerships at the Baylor College of Medicine, Brigham and Women's Hospital in the United States, and at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology. She commenced the cytogenetics service at CMC in 2001, formed a Cytogenetics unit in 2003, and subsequently, an independent department in 2019.

The establishment of the Cytogenetics Department is a testament to Dr. Vivi's resourcefulness and perseverance. She often recounts how she struggled in the early days with sparse space and equipment, and with a single technician, whom she trained herself. Recognising the need for trained personnel in this area, in 2006 she started a post-graduate diploma course for training cytogenetic technologists, the first of its kind in the country. Technologists who graduated from the programme went on to staff the growing unit. Furthermore, in 2008, Dr. Vivi started a university-recognised post-doctoral fellowship course in Cytogenetics. This is currently the only university-recognised formal training programme for cytogenetics in India. The fellows who graduated from the course comprised the first generation of formally qualified cytogeneticists who were trained within the country. The role of Dr. Vivi in fostering the development of the speciality of cytogenetics in the country cannot be overstated.

The establishment of a Cytogenetics laboratory supported the growth of many clinical specialities within the institution. The laboratory kept pace with the rapid advancements in genomics that took place in the 2000s. It soon earned recognition as a centre for training and excellence in cytogenetics. The laboratory launched an external quality assurance scheme for cytogenetic laboratories in 2011 and received National Accreditation Bureau for Laboratories (NABL) accreditation in 2016. Dr. Vivi took up the headship of the Pathology Department in 2016. During her tenure, she streamlined undergraduate education, and directed and facilitated the creation of a virtual museum of gross specimens, that was accessible to all students on the E-learning website. The winter symposium of CMC's centenary year was conducted through the combined efforts of the Departments of Pathology, Transfusion Medicine, and Cytogenetics, under her leadership. The crowning glory when she finished her headship was that she got the Pathology department NABL accredited.

Dr. Vivi became head of the Pathology Department in 2016. During her tenure, she improved undergraduate education and oversaw the creation of a virtual museum of gross specimens for students. She also led the collaborative efforts of multiple departments for the winter symposium and achieved NABL accreditation for the Pathology department. Dr. Vivi is an exemplary teacher. Ever practical, she ensured that fellowship trainees gained experience in bench work in addition to interpretative skills. This training allowed them to independently establish laboratories and train their personnel wherever they proceeded to work. Her trainees learnt not merely how to set up cultures, but how to conduct themselves with discipline, dignity, and decorum within the laboratory and outside. Dr. Vivi held an almost maternal regard for her technicians and trainees. She diligently inquired into their situations, counselled them extensively, and often went to great personal lengths to assist them in times of difficulty. While selecting or promoting trainees or employees, she valued qualities of neatness, discipline, honesty, politeness, and attention to detail above cleverness or academic credentials. Colleagues came to appreciate her unconventional wisdom that was often delivered through pithy sayings and anecdotes.

Dr. Vivi's meticulous attention to detail was an asset in research and academics. She has contributed to more than 50 scientific publications and guided several academic theses. Various committees and standard-setting bodies have benefitted from her expert insights. She contributed towards the formulation of the NABL standards for cytogenetic laboratories. She served as a member of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University board for undergraduate and postgraduate studies. She was also a member of The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University expert committee to reframe the Pathology syllabus for MBBS and MD.

Beyond her professional achievements, Dr. Vivi is a doting mother to her sons, Nikhil and Vineeth, and the lady behind Dr. Alok Srivastava's success. Her vivacious and sociable personality has won numerous friends and admirers within and outside the CMC community, and her melodious singing voice has graced many campus events. As Dr. Vivi enters a new phase in her life, the departments of General Pathology and Cytogenetics express their gratitude for her years of committed service. Her imprint will endure in these departments, the institution and community, and among her students, wherever they work. We wish her the best for the golden years ahead.

World Blood Donor Day 2024



Rallying for Increased Awareness on Voluntary Blood Donation in Vellore

A rally was organised by the Department of Medicine and Transfusion Immunohematology (TMIH) at CMC Vellore, on July 19, 2024. The rally started at Voorhees College and concluded near Anna Kalai Arangam on Anna Salai, with around 400 participants, including students from various colleges and local community members and NGOs. The rally aimed to raise awareness about the importance of voluntary blood donation and encourage more people to become regular donors. Dr. Dolly Daniel, Senior Professor and Head of TMIH, welcomed the attendees and highlighted the critical role of youth in society and the value of voluntary blood donation. The guests of honour at the inauguration included Rt. Rev. Sharma Nithyanandham, CSI Bishop in the Diocese of Vellore, Dr. Annie Kamala Florence, Principal, Voorhees College, Dr. David Mathew, Deputy Medical Superintendent, CMC, Dr. Jackwin Paul, Red Cross Coordinator, CMC and Dr. Deepak G, Assistant Professor from the Department of Transfusion Medicine at the Government Vellore Medical College Hospital.



Addressing the participants, the Bishop encouraged the youth to be mindful of societal needs and emphasised that voluntary blood donation greatly serves the community and applauded the contributions of repeat voluntary blood donors. Dr. Daniel emphasised the urgent need for blood to meet patient care demands and expressed hope that the rally would sensitise the community to the importance of regular voluntary blood donation.

The event also addressed common misconceptions about blood donation, reassuring the public that donating blood is a safe and noble act. Dr. Daniel encouraged everyone to try donating blood at least once, assuring them that the experience is rewarding and contributes significantly to saving lives. Dr.Bochu Vikas and Mr. Sam, both associated with the department, reiterated the life-saving impact of blood donations and the need to increase community awareness about the safety of blood sourced from voluntary donors. Participants like Abigail, a 1st-year BSc Nursing student, and Joel Sooraj, an MBBS student, shared their motivations for joining the rally, emphasising the influence of healthcare professionals in spreading awareness and the direct impact of blood donation on saving lives. The rally received positive feedback from the local community, with a vendor expressing support for the cause and recalling his experience as a donor. The closing ceremony, hosted by Mr. Durai Jasper, PRO, CMC Vellore honoured voluntary donors and rally participants. Mr. Thirunavukkarasu, DSP of Vellore, felicitated the gathering and expressed his gratitude for their service to the nation.

The event ended with a prayer by Rev. Joseph Devaraj, Chaplain, and refreshments were served. CMC's Voluntary Blood Donation Team organised the programme in partnership with Nalam Deepalaya Trust, Vasavi Trust, and the Darling Group. We thank the participating colleges, Friendship Trust, Sign to Shine Trust, other organisations, and the Vellore Police & Traffic Department, for their support and cooperation. A blood donation camp was organised after the rally, at which several persons donated voluntarily. In summary, the Voluntary Blood Donor Rally was a successful event that brought together various segments of society to promote voluntary blood donation, aiming to ensure a steady supply of safe blood for patients in need. The collective efforts of CMC, participating colleges, and supporting organizations played a crucial role in making the rally a meaningful and impactful initiative.





Report of CMC-IFAS Foot and Ankle Basic Course 2024

The Department of Orthopaedics Unit –I conducted the Foot and Ankle Basic Course along with the Indian Foot and Ankle Society on July 27th 2024. This programme was accredited by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and the Tamil Nadu Medical Association and conducted under the aegis of the Vellore Orthopaedic Society, Tamil Nadu Orthopaedic Association, Orthopaedic Association of the South Indian States and Indian Orthopaedic Association. It was attended by 174 members (166 in person and 8 online viewers comprising mission hospitals). The inauguration was by Dr. Vernon Lee and Dr. Vinoo Mathew Cherian (Past Heads of Unit-1 and the Department of Orthopaedics) in the presence of Dr. Rajesh Simon (Immediate past president IFAS), Dr. Inderjit Singh(Secretary, IFAS), Dr. Deen Muhammed Ismail (President of Tamil Nadu Orthopaedic Association), Dr. Dharmarajan (TNOA North Zone EC Member), Dr. Mohan Gandhi (Head of Orthopaedics, Govt Medical College, Vellore) Dr. Manivanan (President, Vellore Orthopaedic Society), Dr. Deepak Selvaraj (Associate Director, CMC), Dr. Thilak Jepagnanam (HOD, Dept of Orthopaedics), Dr. Asha Solomon (Professor, CMC Nursing College).The forenoon session was the Continued Medical Education programme.


Cardiac Advanced Resuscitation Training

• **Dr. Robert (Bob) H. Carman (1931 – 2024)** CMC Vellore's former Head of Clinical Pathology and Associate Director, on Saturday, the 10th August, 2024.

Dr. Carman, who was an outstanding physician and exemplary administrator, became part of the CMC family as a teenager, when his parents, Dr. John Carman, surgeon and former Director, and Mrs. Naomi Carman joined the institution in 1945.

Dr. Carman wished to pursue a career in surgery like his father, but finally chose Clinical Pathology because he had a coagulation problem that meant he could not stand for long periods of time. Having made his choice, he put all his efforts into becoming the best clinical pathologist he could be. After completing his American Board in Pathology and Clinical Pathology, he joined the department of Clinical Pathology in 1964. In the department, he set high standards and was largely responsible for its development (specifically for the development of special tests in coagulation and hemolytic anaemia in the present form) and for the growth of CMC's Blood Bank. His text book on Clinical Pathology was well-used and regularly updated and is one of the most highly referenced handbooks for lab technicians in the region.

He is also remembered especially for his contribution to the Laboratory Technician Training programme which he ran for many years under the auspices of the CMAI. This took him all over the country to many mission hospitals and other small hospitals.

He was a much respected and loved colleague whose sage advice was greatly sought after and appreciated. He nurtured the staff of the department and the Blood Bank, leaving behind him many competent people who could take over when he moved into administration.

Exemplary administrator

From 1974, Dr. Carman was actively involved in the administration of the institution, first as Council Secretary from April to December 1975, then as Deputy Director from 1976 to 1981, and finally as Associate Director (Medical), a position he took up in 1981 and held till his retirement in December 1991.

His kindness and courtesy in dealing with all staff, awareness of justice for all, and interest and concern for individuals have been the hallmarks of his service in the administration. He also provided a sympathetic ear to many a distressed youngster, patiently responding to their questions and concerns about life and work in CMC.

His commitment to the accuracy of statements led him to spending hours in drawing up letters and documents. His insight, knowledge, and memory of mission background and work was a great asset. He strengthened the overseas volunteers programme as well as steered the institution through various crises. His efforts in raising funds for various projects from donor agencies overseas is remembered with gratitude.

Brilliant teacher, caring mentor

He was a brilliant teacher and could keep his students enthralled, even during the post-lunch sessions. Both he and his wife Lucille (Lu) kept open house and were deeply involved in student activities. They were the foster parents for many medical students, past and present, who looked to them for inspiration and guidance.

Active involvement in community life

Dr. & Mrs. Carman enriched the life of the campus in various ways, and especially with their involvement in the college and hospital choirs. Dr. Carman was a faithful and wonderful conductor of the choir, initially at the hospital and then in the college, despite the significant time and logistical effort it would have taken to do this, Sunday after Sunday. He also led the choir in special performances like the musicals of John Michael Talbot - The Lord's Supper and Light Eternal, apart from the traditional Easter and Christmas special choirs. He brought a sense of joy and worship to singing and taught his students to see the music as an offering to god; that the choir was leading a worship service and not putting on a performance with focus merely on technical perfection.

A true Christian

His faith was not showy but deep. He was a lay reader at St. John's and a leader in the church. He practised his faith every day and was an outstanding Christian of exceptional character and gifts. His self-discipline, commitment, sacrificial life, unlimited patience and singleness of purpose made him a great asset to the administration as well as a source of wisdom and comfort to innumerable members of the CMC family. It was said that he was like the cement that kept the bricks together in a wall or the glue that helped the community stick together.

Doting husband and father

He was a committed husband to his extremely supportive wife, Lucille, a qualified librarian who was actively involved in the community life at College Campus, in Church and in the Chaplaincy Department. She also helped in starting the Archives of the institution, specially the photography section. The Carmans had four children, Chuck, Jim, Betsy, and Paul.

Post-retirement

After his retirement, as a Council member, he represented the Board for International Ministries of the American Baptist Churches from June 1993 to January 1994 and the Vellore CMC Foundation, Inc. (erstwhile: Vellore C.M.C. Board Inc., N.Y.) from June 1994 to June 1997.

At the time of his passing on, I thank God for his life of service.

On behalf of the CMC family, I record my deepest gratitude to Dr. Robert H Carman, former Associate Director and former Head of Pathology and Clinical Pathology, sponsored by the Board of International Ministries of the American Baptist Churches USA, for the extraordinary services - both in the professional and personal spheres - he has rendered to our institution over a lifetime in the healing ministry of Christ.
