CMC Vellore to Set Up a New Medical College at Chittoor

Azim Premji Foundation to support CMC Vellore with Rs 500 crore grant



October 9, 2024, Bangalore: Christian Medical College Vellore unveiled plans to set up a new medical college and a teaching hospital on its Chittoor campus and announced a partnership agreement with Azim Premji Foundation to offer value-based healthcare and medical education, primarily for the disadvantaged.

As part of the agreement, the Foundation will extend a Rs 500 crore grant to CMC Vellore to set up the medical college and upgrade the existing 120-bed hospital into a teaching hospital with 422 beds. The grant will also enable CMC Vellore, a pioneer in medical education, to extend the distinctive elements of their MBBS education and focus on the discipline of Primary-cum-Secondary Health Care (PSHC) to address the widening disparities in the Indian healthcare sector.

Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director of CMC Vellore, said, "Our dream is that the new medical college and teaching hospital at our Chittoor Campus will offer a replicable model of relevant medical education, healthcare delivery, research, and outreach, sensitive to the financial, societal and resource constraints of our nation. We are immensely grateful to the Azim Premji Foundation for partnering with us on this journey as CMC Vellore steps into her 125th anniversary in 2025."

Anurag Behar, Chief Executive Officer, Azim Premji Foundation, said, "CMC Vellore is an exemplary institution – the highest quality education and healthcare with deep social commitment. This has made them one of the true beacons for Indian healthcare. We are privileged to support them as they establish their second medical college."

Dr. Solomon Sathishkumar, Principal of CMC Vellore, said, "Education at the Chittoor Campus began with allied health science courses and a College of Nursing five years ago. We hope that the new Medical College will evolve into a national resource for the advancement of the discipline of Primary-cum-Secondary Health Care, with a mandate to train general physicians who can function in any eventual role, but with preferential emphasis to quality primary and secondary care."

The agreement builds on the close association between the two organisations that began in 2020 when the pandemic disrupted India's healthcare system.



CMC Vellore Partners with the Government of Bihar to Combat Thalassemia



Vellore, October 4, 2024: Christian Medical College (CMC) Vellore is proud to announce its collaboration with the Government of Bihar to provide life-changing treatment to children afflicted with Thalassemia. This ground-breaking initiative was made possible through the Mukhyamantri Bal Thalassemia Yojana, a pioneering programme under the leadership of the Honorable Chief Minister of Bihar, Shri Nitish Kumar and championed by the Honorable Health Minister of Bihar, Shri Mangal Pandey.

After conducting multiple camps, Christian Medical College Vellore, in partnership with the Bihar Government, will provide free hematopoietic stem cell transplants to eligible children suffering from Thalassemia under the Mukhyamantri Bal Thalassemia Yojana. This initiative is a significant outcome of the camps, where children were identified and selected for treatment, spearheaded by Shri N.K. Gupta, State program officer, Blood Cell, Bihar. Together, CMC Vellore and the Bihar Government are taking a significant stride towards creating a healthier, more compassionate society. With the signing of the MoU, 3 Crores was allotted for the project ensuring that 15 lakhs will be granted per patient.

Immediately after the signing, 13 identified children were brought to CMC Vellore for stem cell transplantation, accompanied by Health Minister Mangal Pandy, Dr. N K Gupta and the Haematology camp team.

Camps organised by Haematology:

The Department of Haematology conducted Stem Cell transplantation camps for children under 12; affected by Thalassemia. The event was organised by Dr. Aby Abraham, Professor and Head, Department of Haematology and Dr. Ann Miriam, Mission Network along with Dr. NK Gupta, State Program Officer, Blood Cell AHSB, Mr. Pratyay Amrit, Additional Chief Secretary, Health Department and Mr. Suharsh Bhagat, ED SHSB. The initial planning and organising took place on March 5th, 2024 after which multiple camps were held in various places.

The organising team was led by Mrs. Gomathi Joseph-Senior Social worker along with Mrs. Mahalakshmi-HLA co-ordinator; Mrs. Arifa- Clinical assistant and Mr. Dinesh-Office facilitator. During the event, Mrs. Gomathi discussed the services and facilities available for pre-and post-transplant care, as well as additional support offered in terms of accommodation and meals. The camp had good informative talks by Dr. Sushil Selvarajan on the following topics:

- What is thalassemia?
- Types of thalassemia,
- Regular monthly transfusion of packed red cells
- Chelation therapy
- Stem cell transplantation

The camps were conducted in the following places

August 1st-At Patna (224 swabs were collected from 92 families, which included parents and siblings.)

October 2nd-At Purnia (58 affected children in Purniaresulting in 121 swabs which included parents and siblings)

October 3rd-At Patna (39 affected children in Patnaresulting in 82 swabs which included parents and siblings)

Dengue Awareness Programme



Dengue fever is a viral infection transmitted by Aedes mosquitoes, with significant public health implications. The first recorded case in India was in 1956 in Vellore, Tamil Nadu. Several ecological and human-made factors contribute to the rise in dengue cases, particularly during and after the monsoon season. Since there is no specific treatment for dengue, symptoms are managed, making prevention crucial. To enhance awareness of dengue prevention, the Infection Control Committee, under the auspices of the Medical Superintendent's Office and in collaboration with the Environmental Engineering Department, organised an awareness programme from October 1st to October 4th , 2024, at CMC Vellore Ranipet campus. The programme aimed to educate healthcare workers, visitors, and the local community about Dengue preventive measures.



The inaugural event on October 1st featured a worship song by the infection control nurses, followed by a prayer led by Chaplain Rev. Romit Borogoan. Mrs. Santhi Gladston, Deputy Nursing Superintendent, delivered a warm welcome address. Dr. Reuben Thomas Kurien, Deputy Medical Superintendent, shared his experiences and emphasised that severe dengue cases are challenging to manage. He stressed the importance of community awareness to prevent Dengue. Mrs. Santhi Gladston highlighted that it's vital to recognise the importance of preventing dengue infection in our community by eliminating stagnant water, using mosquito repellents, and maintaining clean surroundings. Mr. Prabhuson Paulwin, HOU of Human Resources Management, stated that by working together and raising awareness, we can protect ourselves and our community. Dr. Hema Paul, Senior Infection Prevention Control Officer, presented an overview of the comprehensive dengue awareness initiative and highlighted that, over the course of the programme, information on dengue and its preventive measures was disseminated through a variety of engaging formats, including posters, handouts, educational videos, puppet shows, and interactive games. Additionally, the Environmental Engineering stall showcased the strategies for mosquito breeding control and larval elimination that have been implemented within both the hospital and residential areas, aimed at ensuring a safe environment for all. Dr. Sarah Graceia, Infection Prevention Control Officer, formally extended her gratitude by proposing the vote of thanks.

Pioneering Endoscopic Spine Surgery: A Novel Approach to Lumbar Disc Prolapse

The Department of Neurological Sciences (Neurosurgery III) has conducted the first endoscopic spine surgery at our hospital on 17th September 2024 for the treatment of a patient with a lumbar disc prolapse. Minimally invasive spine surgery has been a significant advancement in the field of spinal care, offering patients reduced tissue trauma, shorter hospital stays, and faster recovery. The continued evolution of spinal surgery has led to the development of innovative techniques, such as biportal endoscopic spine surgery. The successful implementation of this minimally invasive biportal endoscopic spine surgery at the hospital is a testament to the ongoing innovations in the field of spinal care. It is the result of a long-standing and collaborative effort by the Department of Neurological Sciences to develop smart technologies, refine surgical techniques, and enhance the training of specialised spine surgeons.

International Snakebite Awareness Day 2024

The CMC Poison Control Centre observed the 7th International Snakebite Awareness Day on September 19, 2024. The day marked the culmination of year-long activities that were organised to increase awareness about snakebite prevention and appropriate first-aid amongst communities in and around Vellore. Over the past year, through visits to villages, schools and colleges 3967 people were trained in snakebite prevention and first aid and the numbers have reached close to 30,000. The Annual Snakebite Survivors' Meet was held as a virtual session, for patients who had been admitted to CMC with snakebite over the past year. The meet is a forum for participants to share their personal experiences of dealing with the consequences of a snakebite with others who may have been similarly affected. It also provides an opportunity to reinforce snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid and more importantly empower snakebite victims to be peer educators in their own communities.



A poster competition for school and college students and medical professions was organised on the topic; *Do it right in snakebite*. In the category for school students, the first prize was awarded to S. Ashwanth, the second prize to S. Prithish, and the third prize to G. Yaksha Reddy. In the college student category, the first prize was awarded to Ms. Vishali S and in the Medical professional category to N. Mubarak Ali.

"STING – 2024", the postgraduate quiz on toxinology and snakebite mitigation was conducted to sensitise medical postgraduates to the field of toxinology. Fifteen teams from various medical colleges participated. The chief guest was Dr. S.R. Ganesh, a herpetologist and Director of Research at the Kalinga Foundation, Agumbe. The first prize was awarded to Dr. Aruneeshwar and Dr.Vinayak, Tirunelveli Medical College, the second prize to Dr. Ajeeth Kumar M. and Dr. Sittheshwaren M., Govt. Chengalpattu Medical College and the third prize to Dr. Namrata Mathew and Dr. John Roy Palathinkal, CMC Vellore. The International Snakebite Awareness Day was commemorated with a programme which was graced by Dr. K.P.P. Abhilash, Deputy Medical Superintendent; Dr. Vinitha Ravindran, Dean, College of Nursing; Mrs. Anne Jarone, Associate Nursing Superintendent; Dr. Samuel George Hansdak, Head, Department of Medicine and Ms. Saramma Kuruvilla, Chaplain. The guests addressed the gathering, highlighting the problem of snakebite envenoming and the need to increase community awareness about prevention and first aid.



A series of stalls were organised to educate the public on snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid. Hands-on demonstration of limb immobilisation, interactive games, a puppet show and the screening of videos in the regional languages were the methods used to create awareness. It is hoped that these activities would play a role in creating awareness about snakes and snakebite prevention and appropriate first aid among the public and the medical community and be a step towards mitigating snakebite-related deaths and disability in the country.
