Dr. David Chase Retires



Dr. David Chase began his journey at CMC in 1982 for his undergraduate studies and completed his MD in 1994 followed by a DM in Cardiology in 1998. He dedicated himself to serving semi-urban patients at various mission hospitals such as Sankeshwar Mission Hospital, Baptist Christian Hospital Nellore, and Narsapur Christian Hospital as a non-interventional cardiologist for 8 years. His valuable experience continued to be fine-tuned as he transitioned to a corporate setting where he worked for 2 years as a Cardiology Consultant. After completing his medical training, he pursued further specialisation in Cardiac Electrophysiology through two fellowships at Flinders Medical Centre in Adelaide and the Monash Medical Centre in Melbourne from 2006 to 2008.

During this time, he gained comprehensive experience in basic and advanced cardiac pacing and electrophysiology, including training in state-of-the-art cardiac implantable electronic device implantation, cardiac arrhythmia, syncope evaluation, and management. His training also included exposure to the latest developments in cardiac electrophysiology through conferences, international cardiac society meetings, and workshops. He learnt the use of cryo-ablation for ablation procedures, such as the Arctic Front Cryo-balloon ablation for Atrial Fibrillation, which was only being practised by a few practitioners in Australia at that time. Additionally, he had the rare opportunity to observe device explantations by the only authorized world expert at that time.

After his stint in Australia, he joined his alma mater as the first trained Cardiac Electrophysiologist in CMC in 2009. He helped set up the Cardiac Electrophysiology(EP)Unit which today is the best-staffed EP Unit in the country. He was always interested in teaching and took a keen interest in teaching Cardiac technicians, nurses, undergraduates and DM trainees. He was a gentle teacher who focused on getting his students to understand the concepts without belittling them.

Dr. Chase was a champion for poor patients, always ensuring quality healthcare for the underprivileged. He maintained high ethical standards when interacting with the industry, advocating for those in need. He readily recognized deserving patients and went the extra mile to make them comfortable. He firmly trusted in his Maker and always gave glory to Him.

Dr. Chase met his life partner Dr. Suchita Chase, Head of General Surgery Unit 1V during his under graduation. They have 3 children Mr. Samuel Ebenezer Chase, working as a Software Engineer at ValueLabs in Pune, Mr. Emmanuel Jayasurya Chase, working at HDFC Bank as an Associate Director in the Wealth Management Division in Bangalore and Ms. Hazel Jerusha Chase, working as a Social Media Coordinator in the Office of Communications, Directorate. They have twin granddaughters who have brightened their lives. Dr. Chase treated his patients with compassion and prayer thereby being a true follower of the CMC motto 'not to be ministered unto but to minister."

State Level Workshop on 'Care of Older Adults with Critical Illness A Patient-Centred Approach'



The Departments of Medical Nursing & Geriatrics along with CNE & Research, College of Nursing organised a state-level workshop on; *Care of Older Adults with Critical Illness-A Patient-centred Approach*, on September 20th, 2024. The workshop started with an inaugural programme in the IQAC lecture hall, College of Nursing. A total of 61 delegates from within and outside the institution participated in the workshop.

Faculty from the Departments of Geriatric Medicine; Geriatric Nursing- College of Nursing, CMC Vellore; School of Nursing, Scudder Memorial Hospital, and Meenakshi College of Nursing, Chennai, facilitated the sessions. The various topics dealt with during the workshop were, rationalising drug therapy in critical illness, fever and sepsis in older adults, nursing assessment and care of older adults with critical illness, morbidity in critical illness of older adults, de-escalation and palliative care in critical illness, geriatric case discussions, discharge planning of older adult with critical illness and nurse/caregiver burnout syndrome in caring for older adults with critical illness. Skill sessions included assessment tools for delirium and fall, Critical Assessment Scales-GCS, Norton Scale & RASS, transfer exercises in critical illness -chest physiotherapy and limb exercises for older adults with critical illness. Feedback was collected, and the delegates expressed a high level of satisfaction with the workshop. The Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council awarded 7 credit points for the workshop.

Strategic Planning Meeting-Distance Education Unit



The Distance Education Unit, with an array of courses/programmes focused on primary healthcare and other need-based subjects, offered for strengthening the health system in India/developing nations, is completing its 20th Year of functioning in CMC Vellore since its inception in September 2004. Towards commemorating the 20th anniversary of the unit, a two-day; *Strategic Planning Meeting*, was organised by the unit, on the 30th September & 1st October 2024 at the Christian Medical College, Ranipet Campus, to reflect on the major strategies and plan for spearheading the unit to the next decade.

The two-day sessions of the meeting were chaired and moderated by, Dr. Varghese Philip, who is currently the Strategic Development Manager at the Mission Aviation Fellowship International (MAF); he has vast experience in Missions, one of them being setting up the Asha Kiran Hospital, Lamtaput, Odisha. The first day of the programme opened with devotion about the Trinity of God, as to how they inter-tune to function in a relationality; in Greek-Perichoresis). The staff of the unit were given this model to replicate, for dependence on God and the interaction with fellow workers, drawing wisdom from the Trinity's interdependency.

This session was followed by a session on finding the motivation for our work based on 4 dimensions: Purpose, Values, Goals and Strength. Each dimension was then discussed by representative sub-teams of the unit, to come out with thoughts on the topics. Towards this, a questionnaire was given as an exercise, for identifying the 4 dimensions of each staff by introspection on themselves and through peers and supervisors' opinions on them. Then, the Strategic Planning theme of *Surfing Change* was discussed to identify the individual strategies that will help build on the 4 dimensions of staff to arrive at the Vision and Mission statements for the unit, in line with the Organizational Vision and Mission. In this context, the core competencies required for running a blended learning course were highlighted.

The second day's meeting started with meditation and the events that followed helped identify the vision and mission statements, by leading sub-team discussions on, what changes, we would like to see in the healthcare scenario of the nation/nations and how we reach there.

This led to fruitful interactions between all the team members to define both vision and mission statements: through three goals:

- a.) Health System Transformation,
- b.) Rendering Whole person Care and
- c) helping restore human values and dignity.

The second half of the day had thought-provoking discussions on identifying the vision and goal indicators of how far we could reach them in the forthcoming years. A strategy matrix was created at the end of these deliberations. The two days' events were summarised by the end of the day and presented by leaders of the unit and the meeting ended with verbal feedback from staff on the events and prayer. It was a good time of interaction and fellowship for all the department staff and at the end of this exercise, there was a collective sense of ownership of the vision, plans and future directions for the unit.
