

Why is it that the songwriter extends to us this instruction? Perhaps Isaac Watts, who wrote those words, acknowledges that the world's reception of Jesus' birth was not without challenges. Inauguration of renovated CMC Outreach Clinic, Red Cross Building



The renovated CMC Outreach Clinic was dedicated to serving the residents of Vellore Town on December 9th, 2024, by Dr B. Baranidharan, MBBS, DPH, MPH, MBS; District Health Officer of Vellore. The programme began with a prayer led by Rev. Joseph Selvaraj, Chaplain. Dr. Vikram Mathews, Director addressed the gathering and emphasised the importance of outreach clinics in providing continuous and preventive care to patients with chronic diseases. Dr. Rajesh I., Medical Superintendent shared insights on the importance of reaching out to the poor and needy residents of the town with high quality, timely services at affordable cost. The chief guest Dr. Baranidharan appreciated the work done by CMC, particularly the maternal and childcare services. They stressed on the importance and the need for a strong partnership between CMC and the government health systems in Vellore. Dr. S. Venkatesan, Head of Family Medicine spoke about Dr. Sarojini Pancharathinam, the first family physician in the country, who started the family medicine movement from the Red Cross clinic. He expressed gratitude to the administration for providing the infrastructure required for upgrading the outreach clinic needed to enhance patient care. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Henry Prakash, Assoc. Medical Superintendent expressing his gratitude to our Hon'ble Tmt. V.R. Subbulaxmi, I.A.S, collector, Vellore District, who had kindly granted us all the permissions to carry out the upgrades. He also extended his gratitude to the International Committee of the Red Cross and requested their continued support in this endeavour.



9th Medicine Annual Conference

The Department of Medicine organised the 9th Medicine Annual Conference (CMCMAC) between the 20th and 22nd November 2024 at Jacob Chandy Hall and CK Job Hall, Paul Brand building.

Three pre-conference workshops were conducted on 9th November 2024:

- Point of care Ultrasound in collaboration with the Department of Critical Care
- Data analysis using SPSS software in collaboration with the Department of Biostatistics
- Literature search and reference management in collaboration with the Department of Library Sciences and Clinical Epidemiology Unit

About 30 participants attended each of the three workshops. All the workshops were capped with a limited number of participants to provide individual hands-on experience to all attendees. The 3-day conference was on the theme aimed at providing recent updates in the field of Medicine and its Sub-specialties. The inauguration was held on 20th November. The opening prayer was led by Chaplain Jim. Dr. Samuel George Hansdak, Professor and Head of the Department of Medicine and the Organising Chairman delivered the welcome address followed by a message by Dr. Anila Chacko, Academic officer and Dr. Sowmya Sathyendra, Associate Director (HR).

The topics covered were:

- Updates in cardiology, pulmonology, endocrinology, nephrology, rheumatology, infectious diseases, critical care, gastroenterology, hepatology, geriatrics, neurology, haematology, oncology, toxicology, lifestyle medicine and obstetric medicine
- Structural competency
- Updates in Medical Education and implementation science to highlight the importance of clinical acumen, medical education and research
- Critical appraisal of various study designs was covered with various examples in the relevant specialities during the conference, insisting on the need to practice evidence-based healthcare. The faculty consisted of in-house faculty, alumni and eminent faculty from institutions of national and international repute

Quizzes using the 'Kahoot!'was organised for the participants with the promise of winning exciting prizes followed by 'bedside clinics' moderated by senior faculty of the department who also judged the e-posters presented by the postgraduate students. Following this, an entertainment segment was organised with dance, music and food. The conference concluded with the 13th Benjamin Pulimood Oration followed by the vote of thanks on 22nd November, 2024.

The conference was conducted in a hybrid mode permitting virtual participation.

A total of 250 participants attended the conference, and the feedback received was overwhelmingly positive. A state-level workshop on *Cardio-Metabolic Disorders (CMDs): Let's Stop the Rise* was organised by the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus on December 13, 2024. The inaugural session commenced with a prayer song by the tutors following which Rev. Ajay, Chaplain led the devotion. The Chief Guest Mrs. Jasmin Anand, Former Professor & Head of Medical-Surgical Nursing delivered her Keynote address on the challenges of the rising cases of CMDs and provided tips on prevention and control. Dr. Reginald Alex, Deputy Medical Superintendent, of Chittoor Campus and Mrs. Alice Sony, Nursing Superintendent offered their felicitations. Mrs. Grace Angeline, Organising Secretary provided the overview of the workshop followed by vote of thanks by Dr. Pastin Pushparani P.

The scientific session of the workshop commenced with a pre-test. The first session of the workshop was an overview of cardio-metabolic disorders by Dr. Felix Jeba Singh, Professor of Endocrinology Department. - The impact of CMD on individuals/communities by Dr. Dorolthy Lall, Professor, Chittoor Campus.

Skill stations were organised to provide hands-on experience in the following:

- Assessment of CMD
- Planning a diet for a healthy lifestyle and
- Exercise and physical activity to prevent and reduce obesity.

The workshop was attended by 30 delegates from three districts, Chittoor, Tirupathi and Madanapalle. The participants gave positive feedback about their learning experiences during the workshop.





Two-day workshop Organised by Family Medicine



The Tamil Nadu chapter of the Academy of Family Physicians of India (AFPI) and the Department of Family Medicine organised a two-day workshop for exam-going postgraduates in Family Medicine on 6th and 7th December 2024 with a focus on clinical presentations, questions on clinical reasoning, management and viva discussion. The workshop was held at the low-cost Effective Care Unit (LCECU) and conducted by faculty from the LCECU on the following subjects:

- Case presentations in adult medicine, paediatrics & obstetrics
- Viva in internal medicine, paediatrics and community medicine
- Objective structured clinical examination (OSCE)
- Radiology
- ECG sessions
- Virtual ward rounds

About 28 postgraduates from all over India attended the workshop and two faculty from TN AFPI joined the discussions. The participants highly appreciated the interactive discussions.

28th Annual Conference of the Nurse Researchers' Society for Innovations (NRSI) hosted by College of Nursing, CMC Vellore

The College of Nursing, CMC Vellore hosted the 28th Annual conference for NRSI, which was held on the 28th & 29th November 2024, at the Scudder Auditorium, Bagayam. A total of 444 national and international delegates participated in the conference. The conference titled *Transforming Health Care: Expanding the Research Horizon in Nursing* aimed to display cutting-edge research & innovative methodologies in nursing research and highlight successful interventions and evidence-based strategies. Five plenary sessions spanning over two days with a total of 20 oral presentations and 28 poster presentations presented by the delegates. There were 5 international and 45 national speakers from all across the country. Two pre-conference hands-on workshops on topics of *Research Ethics and Data & Reference Management* were organised on November 27, 2024.

The conference commenced with devotion by Rev. Joseph Devraj, Senior Chaplain, followed by an inaugural address by Dr. Ardith Z Dorenbos, Professor, College of Nursing, University of Illinois, Chicago, who highlighted the importance of Nursing Research. The keynote address on the topic Discourse to Discovery was delivered by Dr. Jacob John, Professor Emeritus and Former head of the Indian Council for Medical Research (ICMR) Centre for Advanced Research in Virology & former Head of Virology, CMC Vellore. After the keynote address, he released the Conference Souvenir.

Dr. Vinitha Ravindran, Dean of the College of Nursing, welcomed the attendees. Dr. Solomon Satishkumar, Principal of CMC Vellore, and Mrs. Alice Sony, Nursing Superintendent, honoured the gathering with their presence. The conference concluded with Dr. Sheela Durai, Professor and Organising Secretary, presenting the conference report. Dr. Manoranjitham S., Professor and Organising Chairperson wrapped up the event with a vote of thanks.



The conference concluded with a call to action for nurse researchers and participants were encouraged to share their evidence-based findings, learn from one another, and develop collaborative projects aimed at pushing the boundaries of innovation. Additionally, emphasis was placed on the importance of working across different healthcare disciplines to improve patient care. A key outcome of the conference was the creation of the Research Collegium, an online resource for nursing scholars seeking research information.

Bone and Soft Tissue Oncopathology Conference

The Department of General Pathology conducted the Bone and Soft Tissue Oncopathology Conference, on 6th and 7th December, preceded by a pre-conference workshop on 5th December with participation of over 65. The workshop highlighted the importance of an integrated approach to diagnosis of bone and soft tissue tumours, beginning from basics of radiology, gross appearance and histopathology to utility of molecular tests. The conference took place in Scudder auditorium in Bagayam and attracted an audience of 200 delegates who also presented 63 posters and 12 oral papers. World renowned international faculty including Dr. Meera Hameed, Chief of Surgical Pathology, MSKCC, New York, Dr. Rita Alaggio, the lead WHO paediatric pathologist, Italy and Dr. Judith Thangaiah from Mayo Clinic, Rochester, gave us insightful and cutting edge talks on both common and enigmatic entities in Bone and Soft tissue Oncopathology. Dr. Jason Hornick, the world lead on soft tissue tumours joined us virtually from Boston, USA and Dr. Fiona Maclean joined us virtually from Sydney, Australia, bringing much clarity to difficult topics in soft tissue tumours. Eminent national faculty including Dr. Bharat Rekhi from TMH, Mumbai, Dr. Nirmala Jambhekar, retired from TMH Mumbai and Dr. Jayasree Kattoor from RCC, Trivandrum elaborated on existing and emerging entities with excellent examples. A spectacular and interactive slide seminar of interesting cases was conducted by the international and national faculty with glass slides. Several interesting and difficult cases were also presented by our faculty. A multidisciplinary panel discussed challenging cases from our archives in an open forum, with panelists from Orthopaedics, Radiology, Radiotherapy, Surgery and Medical Oncology. The academic feast, which ended with a potpourri of interesting cases by invited faculty, was very well received and appreciated by delegates from all over the country.

It occurs predominantly as Type 1 diabetes mellitus, but research across the world and homegrown exploration and research in Vellore has shown that there are other Important causes which include primary pancreatic disorders, low birth weight, genetic disorders of insulin production and resistance and malnutrition which may be antenatal and compounded by postnatal factors. The dawn of January 2025 will witness an epochal conclave that involves the footfall of close to 30 international experts from across the globe encompassing 5 continents and 15 countries, and 70 national experts, covering the length and breath of diabetes from a pragmatic, clinical, academic and research-oriented perspective ranging from field to bench to bedside. Forays into the nutritional aspects as an etiological factor involved in the evolution of diabetes, particularly the great paradox of undernutrition as a causative factor will be discussed.
